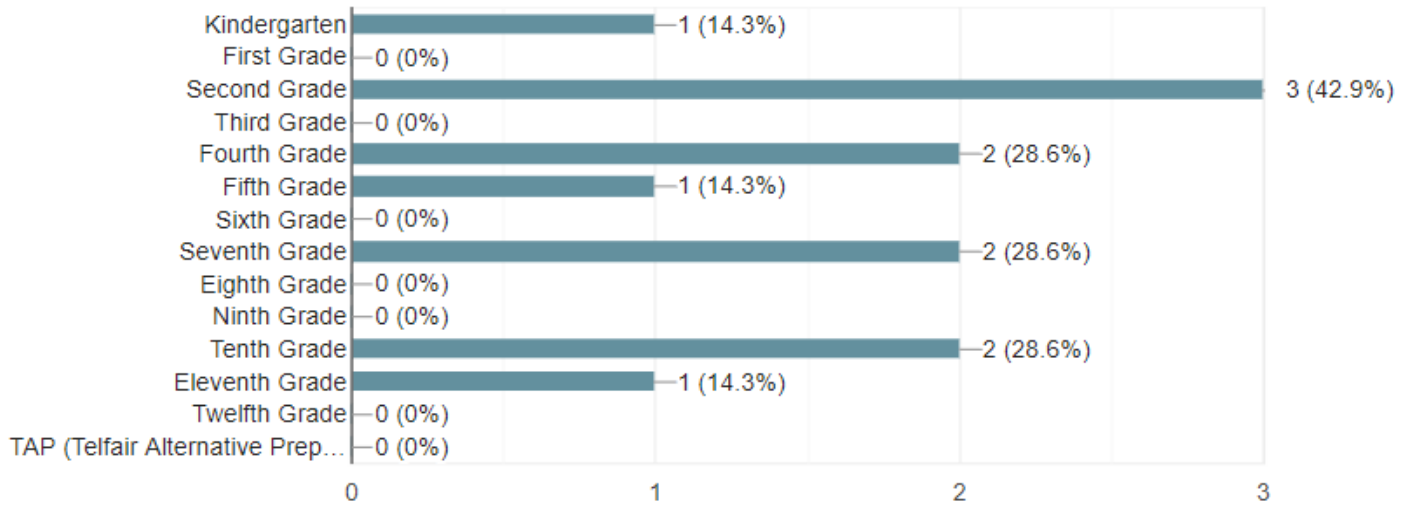


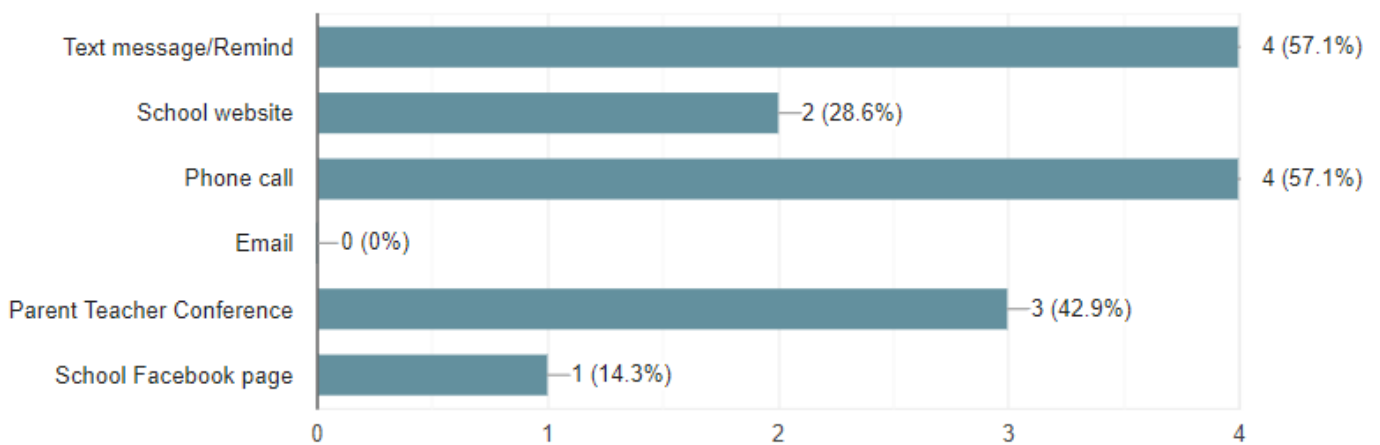

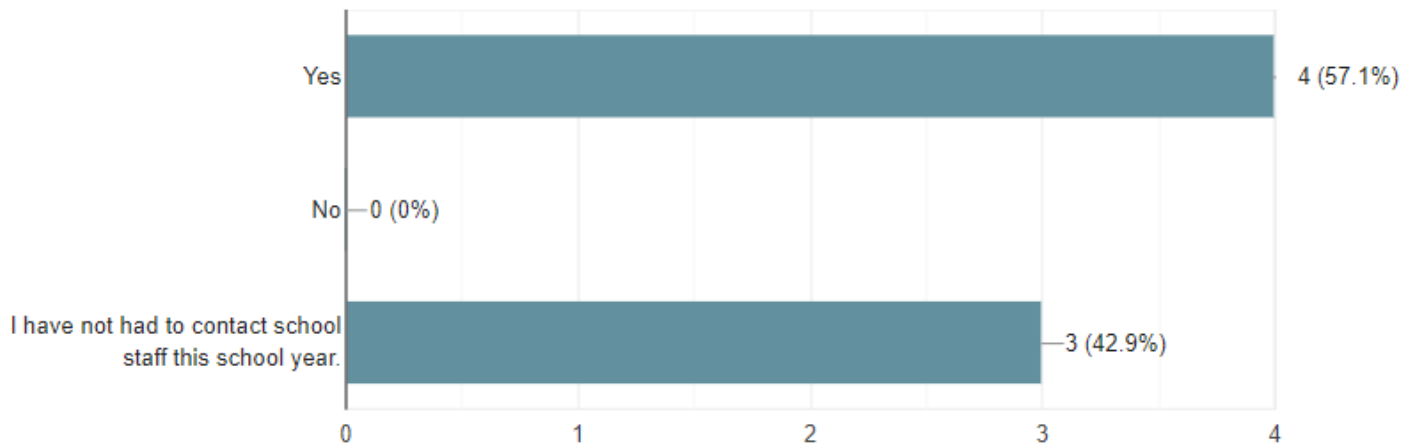
2. What types of communication do you prefer when it comes to your child's education?

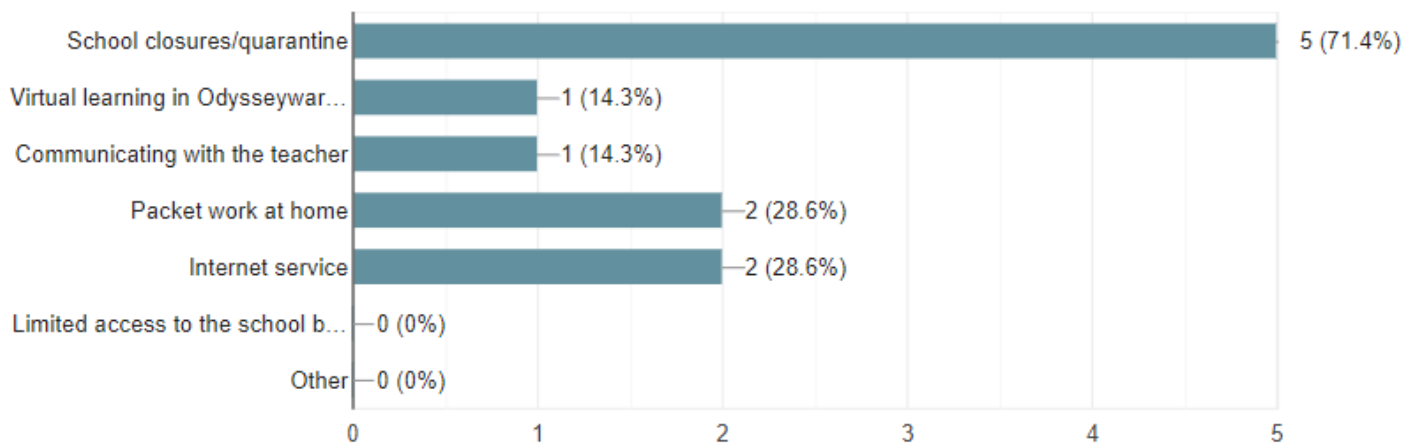

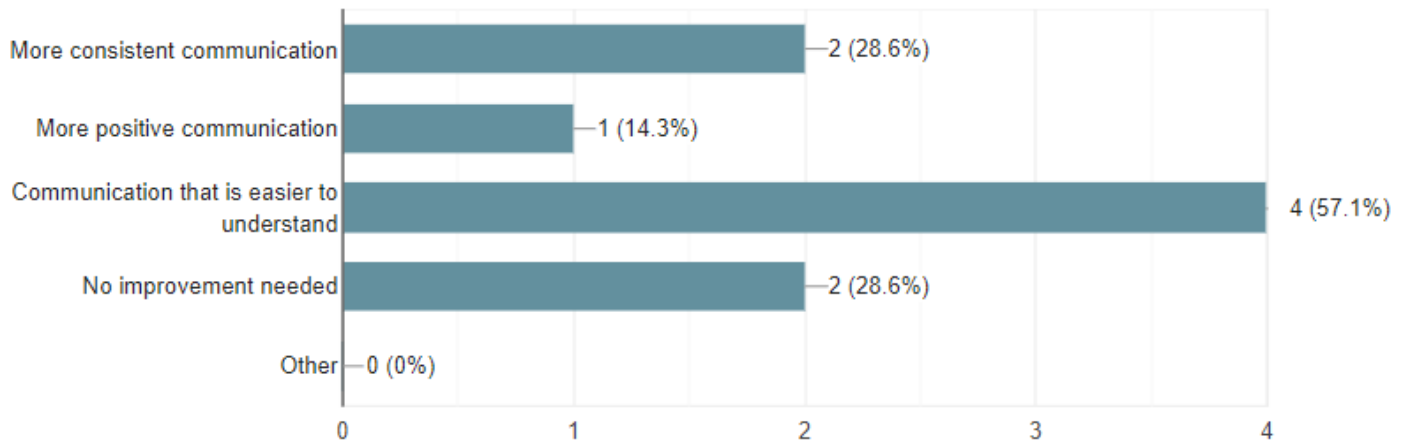

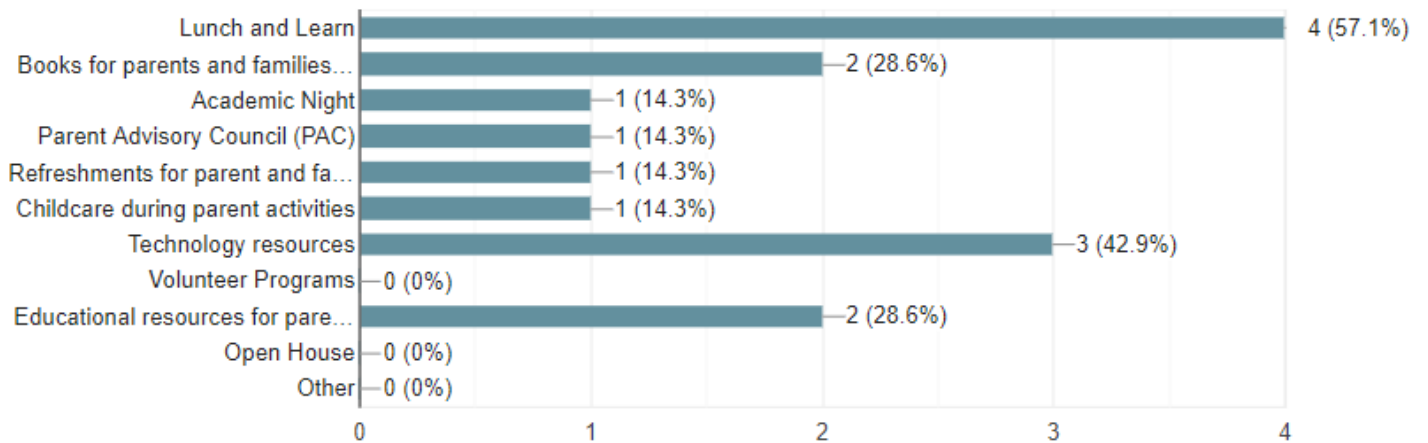

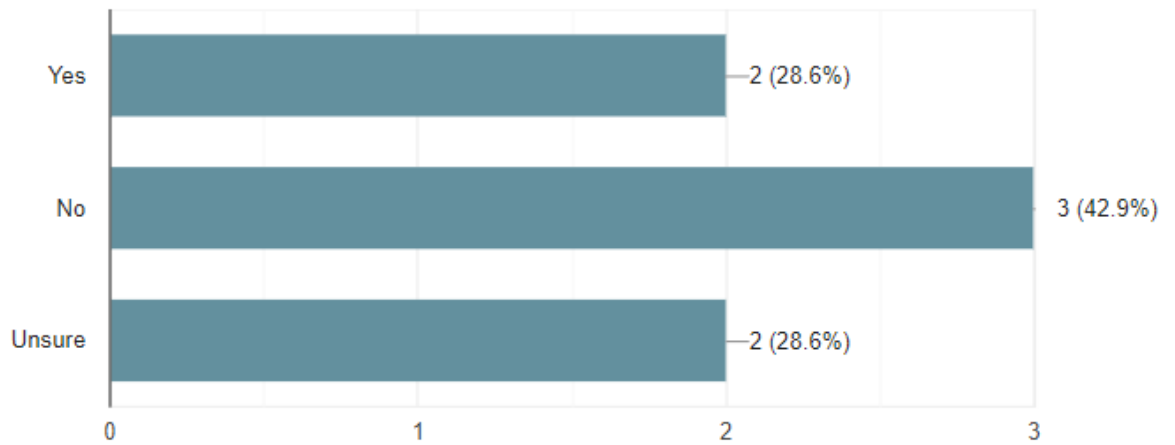

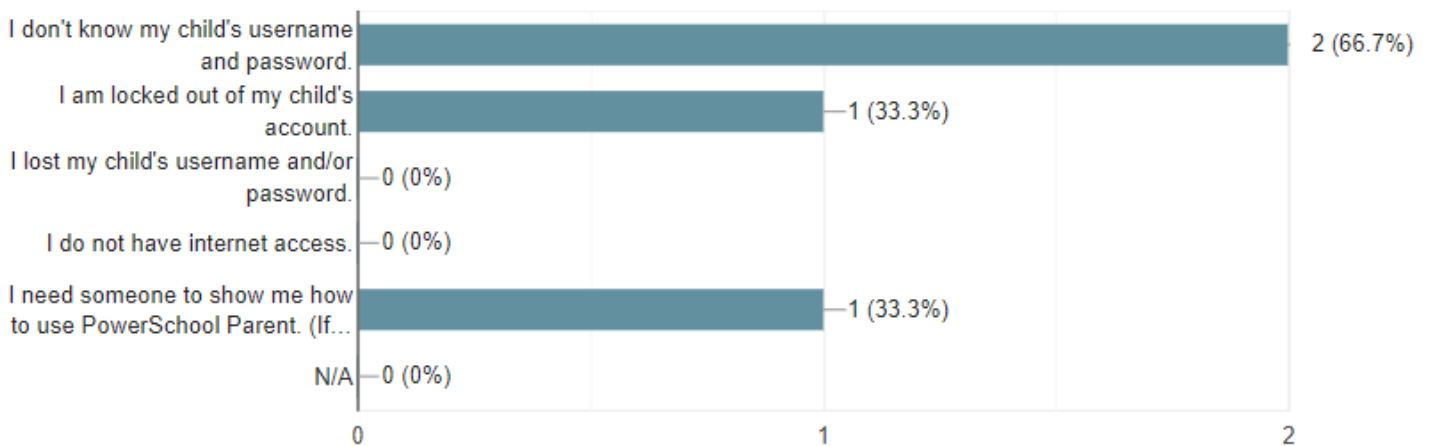

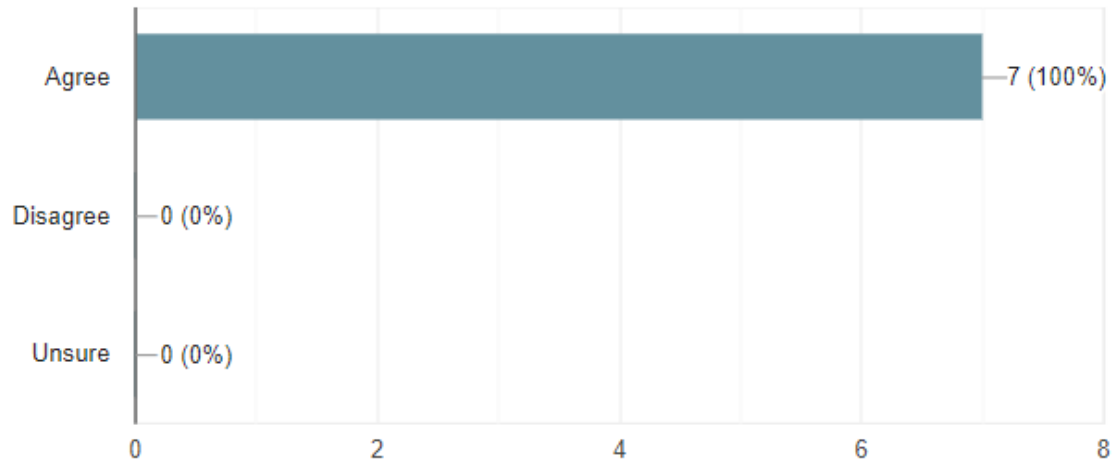
