

Watchung Hills Regional High School Hall of Fame



Megan Kopecki
High Scoring, Highly Decorated Basketball Player
in High School and College
Class of 2007

A 2007 graduate, who won four varsity letters in basketball, Megan Kopecki was the first female basketball player at Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) to score more than 1,000 career points in her sport.

Megan was a four-year starter as a guard at WHRHS. She was selected as a McDonald's All-American Girls' Basketball Nominee, and led her Warrior teams to sectional finals and two conference championships. She was named a Skyland Conference Scholar Athlete.

Taking her basketball and academic skills to the University of Scranton, Megan was a multi-year basketball All-American for the Lady Royals. She scored 1,622 points, and was named Player of the Year three times in Scranton's Landmark Conference. She led the Lady Royals in scoring all four years.

As a sophomore, Megan led her team to the "Elite Eight" in the Women's Basketball NCAA Tournament. Scranton is a Jesuit college, and Megan was named first team on the All-Jesuit Team, and is the holder of numerous basketball records at the University of Scranton.

Megan was named to the All-Decade Team in the Landmark Conference for the years 2000-2010.

Her career mark of 1,234 points at WHRHS remained the record for most career points for a female basketball player until 2017, when it was broken by another outstanding WHRHS basketball player, junior Julia Cunningham.
