



## **BRING CHRIST TO ALL and ALL TO CHRIST**

### Explanation of addition to Mission Statement

The Joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. With these words Pope Francis invites people to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by this joy (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 1).

Bring Christ to All. Coming together with a mission that was simple yet filled with meaning was our primary goal as we at Blessed Trinity renewed our commitment to the continued efforts of evangelization. We are happy that we have been able to make it a part of our identity.

The pandemic has posed many challenges in the lives of all individuals and families and in the life of the Church. Guided by the Holy Spirit, Blessed Trinity was able to bring Christ to people who needed Him in times of confinement, loneliness, and uncertainty. We are thankful to God for using all of us as instruments to fulfill our mission.

Bring Christ to All and All to Christ. When one reads the gospels there are many people, who wanted to encounter Jesus: the leper who approached him asking to be cleansed (Mt 8:1-4); the two blind men who followed him crying out "Son of David have pity on us" (Mt 9:25); Zacchaeus who climbed a tree to see Jesus pass by (Luke 19:1-9); the Syrophenician woman who begged Jesus to drive the demon out of her daughter (Mk 7:26), among many others who came to Jesus. They all had one thing in common; somebody brought the Good News of Jesus Christ to them, so in turn they desired to meet him in person.

It's been more than one year since we reopened the Church after weeks of lock down, and an adaptation to a new reality in our lives and the life of the Church. We realize that we need to continue to bring Christ to all and also bring all to Christ, bring them back to the life of the parish, to the sacraments, to spiritual growth through the different ministries, to a life of prayer in community. True faith in the incarnate Son of God is inseparable from self-giving, from membership in the community, from service, from reconciliation with others (*EG*, 88).

As we continue to welcome each and every parishioner back to Blessed Trinity, it is critical that we bring them to Christ. For, "The Lord does not disappoint those who take this risk; whenever we take a step towards Jesus, we come to realize that he is already there, waiting for us with open arms" (*EG*, 3). *For those who have been here before, He is here for you. For those that are new, He is here for you. Christ is here with open arms for each of us. We want to welcome all to the home of Christ the King who loves us.*

We will begin to incorporate our new addition to our mission statement and pray it resounds with each of you as it does with us. It will be the compass that will guide us to continue bringing the hope of Jesus Christ to all and experience the Joy of the Gospel, which fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus.

The Burse Fund helps pay for the education of Miami's future priests. During a time of pandemic and uncertainty, priests ensure the fulfillment of Jesus' promise: "I will be with you always, until the end of the age" (Matt 28:20) Without priests, Catholics do not have access to the Eucharist or the sacraments.

The Archdiocese of Miami currently has 47 men studying for the priesthood. They pursue their academic studies at the college seminary of [St. John Vianney](#) in Miami and the major seminary (theologate) of [St. Vincent de Paul](#) in Boynton Beach. At St. John Vianney, they complete a bachelor's degree in philosophy or, if they already have a bachelor's degree, two years in pre-theology. At St. Vincent de Paul, seminarians pursue a Master of Divinity degree. They pause their academic studies for one year to experience life and work in a local parish.

Since the pandemic has limited attendance at Masses, the archdiocese is reminding Catholics that they can contribute online to the Burse Fund. The link for donations is [adomdevelopment.org/bursefund](http://adomdevelopment.org/bursefund).

*El Burse Fund ayuda a pagar la educación de los futuros sacerdotes de Miami. Durante un tiempo de pandemia e incertidumbre, los sacerdotes aseguran el cumplimiento de la promesa de Jesús: "Yo estaré con ustedes siempre, hasta el fin de los tiempos" (Mateo 28:20). Sin sacerdotes, los católicos no tienen acceso a la Eucaristía ni los sacramentos.*

*La Arquidiócesis de Miami tiene actualmente 47 hombres que estudian para el sacerdocio. Prosiguen sus estudios académicos en el seminario universitario de St. John Vianney en Miami y en el seminario mayor (teologado) de St. Vincent de Paul en Boynton Beach. En St. John Vianney, completan una licenciatura en filosofía o, si ya tienen una licenciatura, dos años en pre-teología. En St. Vincent de Paul, los seminaristas cursan una Maestría en Divinidad. Pausan sus estudios académicos durante un año para experimentar la vida y el trabajo en una parroquia local.*



## Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

### The Eighteenth Week in Ordinary Time

## The Transfiguration of the Lord

August 6, 2021

In Year B, the reading for the Transfiguration comes from Mark's gospel. (The Transfiguration also appears in the other two synoptic gospels, Matthew and Luke.) In Mark, Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, apart from the other apostles and disciples.

There, Jesus is transfigured (changed in form and appearance) and appears in dazzling white clothes. Elijah, the great prophet, and Moses, through whom the Israelites were given the law, appear with Jesus. A cloud appears, overshadowing them, and a voice states, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Jesus charges the three to not share with anyone what they had seen "except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead." They keep their experience to themselves, pondering what Jesus meant by rising from the dead.

How are we to understand the Transfiguration? The story of the Transfiguration is also proclaimed on the second Sunday of Lent—a key part of Jesus' journey towards the Cross. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* draws parallels between Jesus' Baptism and the Transfiguration. Jesus is baptized at the start of his public ministry. His baptism proclaims the mystery of our first regeneration—we die and rise again with Christ. The "Transfiguration 'is the sacrament of the second regeneration': our own Resurrection (St. Thomas Aquinas, STh III, 45, 4, ad 2). From now on we share in the Lord's Resurrection through the Spirit who acts in the sacraments of the Body of Christ.

The Transfiguration gives us a foretaste of Christ's glorious coming, when he 'will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body (Phil 3:21)' (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 556). During the Prayer after Communion, we pray that God might "transform us into the likeness of your [his] Son, / whose radiant splendor you willed to make manifest / in his glorious Transfiguration." The Collect, or opening prayer, tells us that the mystery of the Transfiguration "prefigures our full adoption to sonship." The Transfiguration, initially revealed to Peter, James, and John, reveals to all of us a taste of what is yet to come.

The Transfiguration is the fourth of the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary.


