

The Challenge: Less than 50% of K-2 students in RPS are on track to read on grade level by 3rd grade. Simply put, we have a literacy crisis.

Our Charge: Make early literacy the number one priority in RPS and do whatever it takes to ensure all students are able to read by 3rd grade.

Why This Matters: Beyond the fact that reading is the foundation to learning in all subjects, research has established a correlation between not reading by 3rd grade with many challenges later in life. For example, a child not reading by 3rd grade is 1200% more likely to *not* graduate from high school by age 19.

How can RPS community partners support early literacy?

Partner Schools

Identify and support partner schools, which are long term partnerships with a specific school to support a culture of reading and coordinating efforts as identified by school leadership and families.

Student and Family Home Libraries

Support book donations to “Partner Schools” that reflect the rich diversity of our students

Host a Community Literacy Event

- Reading Block Party
- Coordinate & Promote Family Literacy Night

Literacy Mentors

Facilitate a Reading Buddies program

- Identify mentors who can share their love of reading with our students

Extended Day/After School Care

Facilitate Out-of-School Time programs/enrichment that focus on literacy or celebrate a culture of reading
