

The ACT WorkKeys is a system of assessments, curriculum, and job profiling that determine, build, and measure essential workplace skills that can affect job performance and increase opportunities for career changes and advancement.

Additional Requirements

- Student must identify an endorsement area prior to entering 9th grade. Endorsement requirements can only be changed with parental permission.
- For Early Release, student must have met College or Career Readiness Benchmarks (ACT sub scores of 18 in English and 22 in math OR Silver Level on ACT WorkKeys) OR student must meet ALL of the following:
 - o Have a 2.5 GPA
 - Passed or met all MAAP assessment requirements for graduation
 - On track to meet diploma requirements
 - Concurrently enrolled in Essentials for College Math or Essentials for College Literacy

Also Recommended

- For Early Graduation, a student should successfully complete an endorsement.
- A student should take a math Senior year.

Electronic Device Policy




Parking/Drop Off Procedures-

Arrival Times

 - Consequences for coming to school late can include loss of parking privileges for student drivers as well as after school detention and ISI
- Students have 6 minutes between classes
- Dismissal: 3:49pm

Secondary Live Broadcasting



New for the 2021-2022 school year! If a student is absent from class, he/she has the option of watching his/her teacher's class over livestream in order to keep up date with content covered in class. However, there are some things to consider:

- It is the **student's responsibility** to get in touch with the teacher before 8:00 AM of the day of the absence to participate into the livestream.
- The student will not be able to utilize their camera during the livestream; it is strictly a one way feed from the classroom teacher.
- Although the student is watching the livestream, the student is still counted absent and responsible for any assignments missed.

Before School Student Areas

- Students may report to the cafeteria, the media center, or the courtyard before school
- Students must have a pass in order to report to a teacher's classroom
- Some teachers may have tutoring before school (pass needed)
- Restrooms--only those in the front foyer and1st floor CTE will be open

Transition Time

- Please walk to the right
 - Just like driving...stay in the right lane
 - Keep your distance from others
- You have six minutes to transition from one class to the next. The expectation is for all students to be *in their classroom seat* ready to start class at the sound of the bell.

ID Badges

ID Badges



- ☐ What if I forget my badge?
 - Students may receive 1 temporary badge per quarter
 - If badge is lost, students may purchase a new one for \$5.
 - Consequences for not having a badge:
 - 1st--warning
 - 2nd--after school detention
 - 3rd--ISI
- Badges must be visible at all times.
 - buses
 - entering campus
 - during class
 - in halls
 - at breakfast/lunch

In the Classroom

- Consistently monitor student success in Parent Portal.
- Parents will receive login information for Schoology, our Learning Management System (LMS)
 - Parents can then see what is happening for his/her student in class (replaces Google Classroom)
- Be sure to read the syllabus provided by each of student's teachers.

Schedule Corrections

- Only if you are missing a block or are double blocked
- Missing a graduation requirement (seniors)
- Have already passed a scheduled course or do not meet the prerequisites for a scheduled class
- There are no schedule changes, only schedule corrections.
 - Virtual Academy--not all courses may be offered and may require a schedule change
- Follow your schedule and email your counselor if there is a problem

Common Mistakes Made By 9th graders

- Not monitoring grades frequently
- Not communicating with teachers
- Not taking advantage of tutoring opportunities
- Poor attendance
- Not asking for make-up work when absences are excused (remember, you have TWO days to complete make-up work for each absence)
- Waiting until the last minute to ask for help

You are NOT Alone



- If you feel yourself struggling, talk to your teachers and/or counselors. Communication is key! You have a whole team of amazing educators in your corner cheering you on!
- There are many expectations, and it will take hard work. Strive to reach <u>your</u> potential EVERY DAY!

What is the bell schedule?

The bell schedule can be found in the student handbook, but the first bell is at 8:24am (tardy @8:30) and dismissal is at 3:49pm.

What happens if I am tardy?

- Student will swipe in at the tardy station to receive a pass to class.
 - 1st tardy-warning
 - 2nd tardy-after school detention
 - 3rd tardy-ISI

What if I am absent?

- Students will have 2 days to make up missed work for an excused absence
- It is the student's responsibility to request the work.

New Student FAQs

■ When may I use the restroom?

 Students are encouraged to use the restroom before school, during lunch, and between classes to limit disruptions in the classroom.

■ What if I need to check out?

 Parents may complete the online check out form. See the student handbook for details.

■ What do I do when I arrive on campus?

- Upon arrival, students should report to the cafeteria for breakfast.
- Students may congregate in the cafeteria, media center, or courtyard.
- No one may be in the halls or classrooms without a pass.
