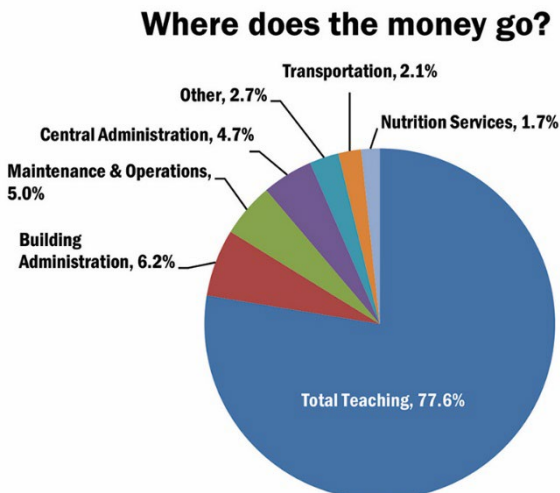
School Description

Kamiakin Middle School is a school of excellence located in Kirkland, Washington. Kamiakin serves a student body of approximately 625 students. There are many opportunities to get involved and connect with peers. Kamiakin differentiates instruction to meet the needs of all students. We closely monitor the academic progress of all students. When a student begins to struggle to meet learning objectives, we intervene immediately in a friendly, supportive, and systematic way.

Kamiakin offers an intensive academic and extra-curricular program. Language Arts and Social Studies classes are taught by the same teacher in a two-hour period, commonly called a “block class,” at all grade levels. In 6th grade, Math and Science are taught by the same teacher in a two-hour block class.

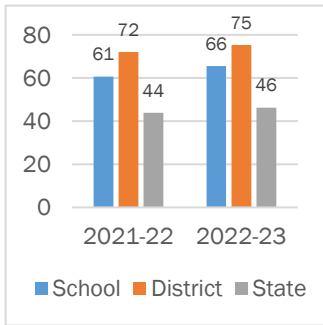
2022-23 School Goals

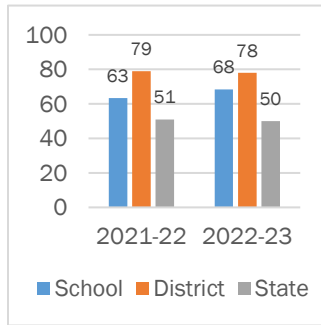

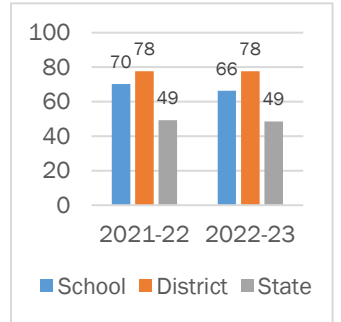
6th Grade English Language Arts



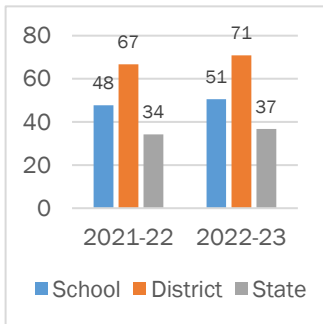
7th Grade English Language Arts



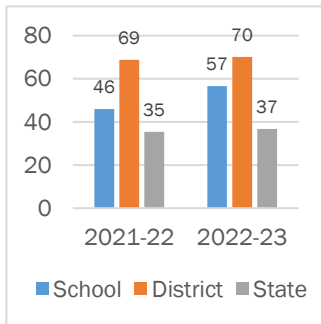
8th Grade English Language Arts



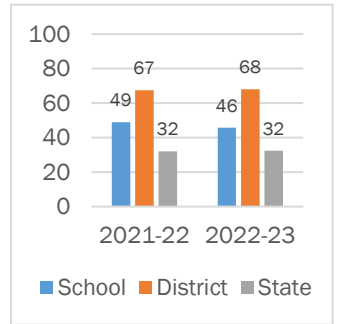
6th Grade Math



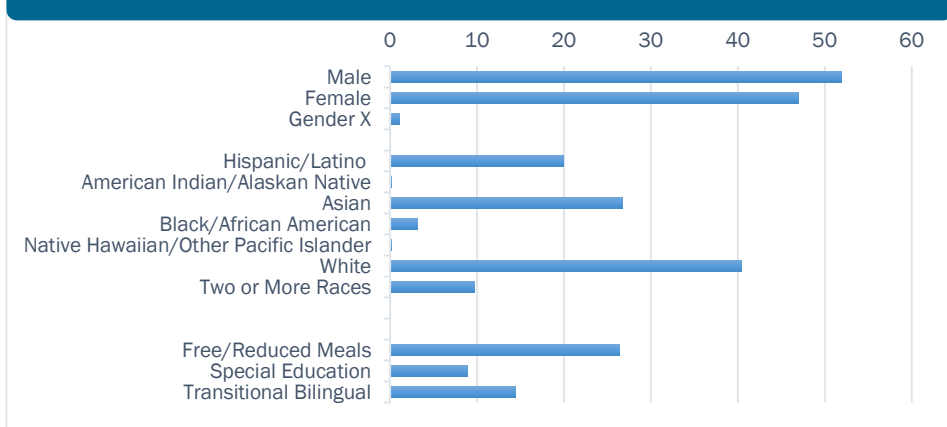
7th Grade Math
