Spring is in the air! With the arrival of spring comes time for schools to start planning for next year, 2021-2022. Not only do we need to know how many potential kindergarteners we will have, but how many of our present K-5 students plan on returning to either our school or the high school next year as 6th graders. This information is used to determine our staffing plan and class configuration for next year. Families who complete the on-line registration process will receive a postcard in the mail in August announcing who your student's teacher will be for the upcoming 2021-22 school year. If you elect not to register your student, you will need to come into the office in August to complete the process as your child will not be assigned to a class.

March 17th, Kindergarten Registration Opens



Starting Wednesday, March 17th, you are invited to go on-line and register your student who will be 5 on or before September 1, 2020 for Kindergarten. Billies Demonstrate Billie Spirit Daily, Especially the Expectation of Being Safe

Praise and encouragement combined with effective instruction are the cornerstones of the Billie Spirit program. As a building, we have four Billie Spirit expectations:

Kind
Respectful
Responsible
Safe

Each of our students this year demonstrates these expectations every day. Our students this year have gone above and beyond demonstrating being safe.



Students arrive at school each day wearing a mask, which they are required to wear the entire day, unless eating.



Students enter the building, through a designated entry door. They immediately start walking on the socially distanced floor dots leading to their classroom.



Upon arriving at the classroom, students are greeted by their teacher, who welcomes them while marking their attendance for the day on the required contact tracing log, does a visual screening consisting of such things as shortness of breath, appearing ill, new cough, unusual behavior, unusual coloration, vomiting, etc. and asks how they are feeling. Students put their backpacks away, and sanitize or wash their hands.



Students next pick up their breakfast or lunch and go to their desk. Desks are spaced 6 feet apart and every student is assigned to their own space within the classroom. While eating the students may take off their mask. Once they have finished eating they put their mask on immediately, clean up their space and sanitize or wash their hands.



While in the classroom, students remain in their space. Teachers have designed their whole group lessons and small group instruction around the grouping of students.



All specialist such as music, Title I or special education staff upon entering the room must sign in on the contact tracing log, wash or sanitize their hands before working with students or interacting with the classroom teacher.



Students remain in the classroom until recess / p.e. / organized game time, a 15-minute break outside. Students are required to wash, or hand sanitize before leaving the room and upon returning from being outside.



At the conclusion of each session students pack up their belongings, grab a meal to take home either a breakfast or lunch, and are escorted out of the building through a designated exit door to either meet their parents in their designated pick-up location or the bus on

Katie's Lane.

Chromebook Care

With Spring Break just around the corner, don't forget to continue to maintain your Chromebook. The Chromebooks need to be restarted at least weekly, updating all of the apps (Zoom, etc.) and operating systems (Chrome OS) to the newest and best for the systems. (Just closing the lid does not accomplish this)

Step 1: Press and hold the *Power* button.

Step 2: The screen dims, and a pop-up appears. Click the *Power Off* button.

Step 3: Press your Chromebook's *Power* button to restart.

When Should I Keep My Child Home?



Student's Symptoms or Illness	Student May Return to School When*
Fever: temperature by mouth greater than 100.4 degrees	No fever for at least 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medicine.
Skin rash or open sores	Rash is gone; sores are dry or can be completely covered by a bandage; or with orders from doctor to school nurse.
New Cough illness	In general, when symptom-free for 72 hours. If pertussis (whooping cough) is diagnosed, after taking 5-day course of prescribed antibiotics, or when cleared for return by local public health authority. If COVID-19 is diagnosed, with orders from local public health authority.
Diarrhea: 3 loose or watery stools in one day OR newly not able to control bowel movements	Symptom-free for 48 hours.
Vomiting	Symptom-free for 48 hours.
Headache with stiff neck and fever; OR with recent head injury	Symptom-free or with orders from doctor to school nurse.
Jaundice: (new) yellow color in eyes or skin	After orders from doctor or local public health authority to school nurse.
Red eyes or eye discharge: yellow or brown drainage from eyes	Redness and discharge is gone OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.
