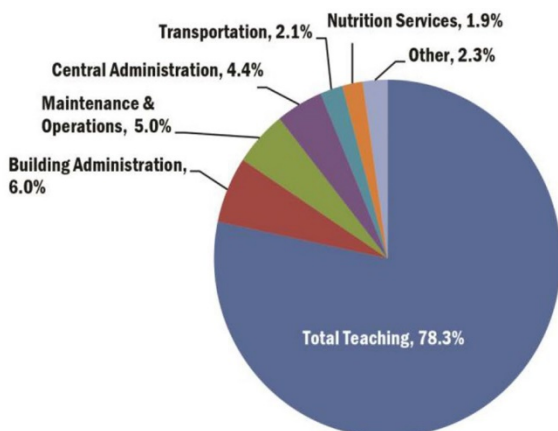

School Description

The International Community School (ICS) is a Choice public 6 – 12 school originating out of community action where parents and educators came together in 1997 to create and support a small, academically rigorous secondary education program, focusing on international/global awareness. The total number of students is capped at 440 annually. The Middle and High school are linked in a seamless unique curriculum known as “The Block”. Block courses are required for each year and include Humanities, International Studies and Art. Other required courses are Spanish (at least 4 years), Science and Math.

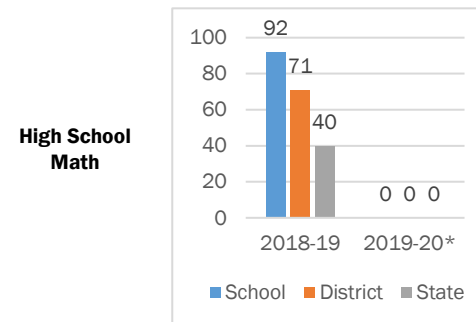
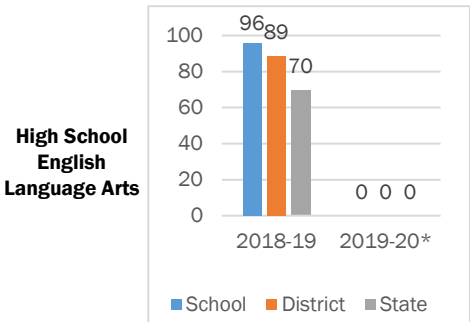
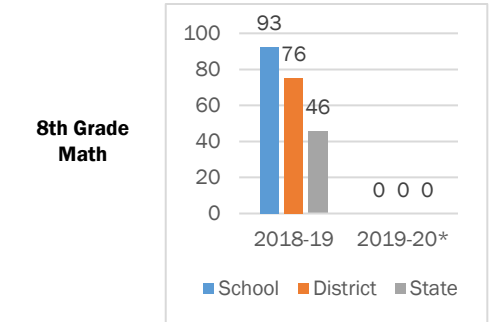
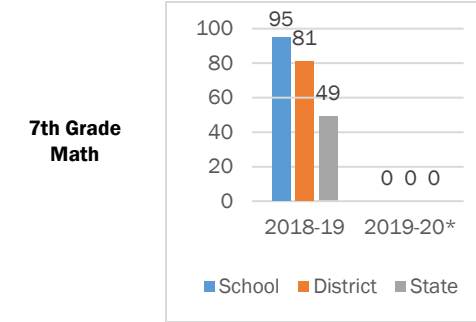
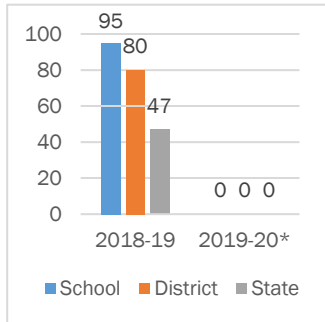
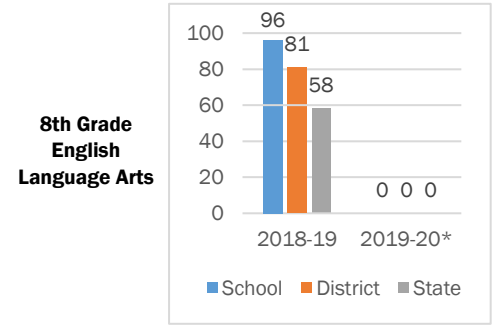
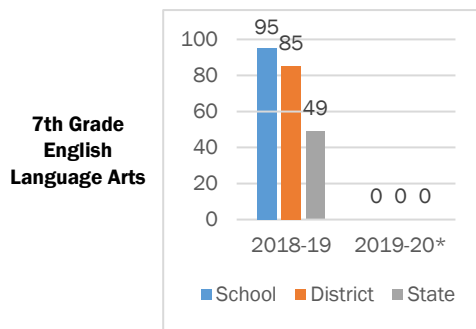
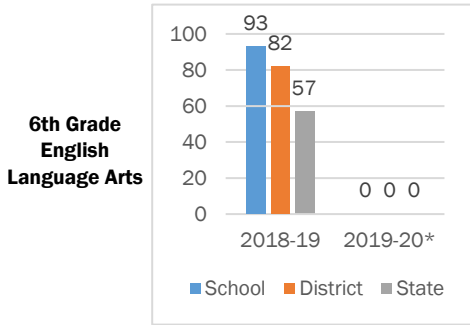


2019 20 School Goals

- Grades 6-8 English Language Arts (ELA): Increase the percentage of Special Education students meeting or exceeding standard to 86%.
- Grades 6-8 Math: Increase the number of Special Education students meeting or exceeding standard from 92.1% to 100%.
- Grade 8 science: Increase the percentage of students meeting or exceeding standard on the WCAS from 90% to 100%.
- Achievement gap: Our goal is to increase the number of historically under-represented, low income, and ELL students, to more closely match the district.
- On-track credits: Decrease the number of credit deficient students from seven to zero.
- College & Career Readiness: 100% of students will be complete grade level requirements by June 2019.
- School Effectiveness: Our goal is to work on the question “who are we” – “what makes us unique”.
- Attendance: Decrease the number of chronically absent high school students from 16 to 10.
- Discipline: We will form a Threat Assessment Team.

Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA)+



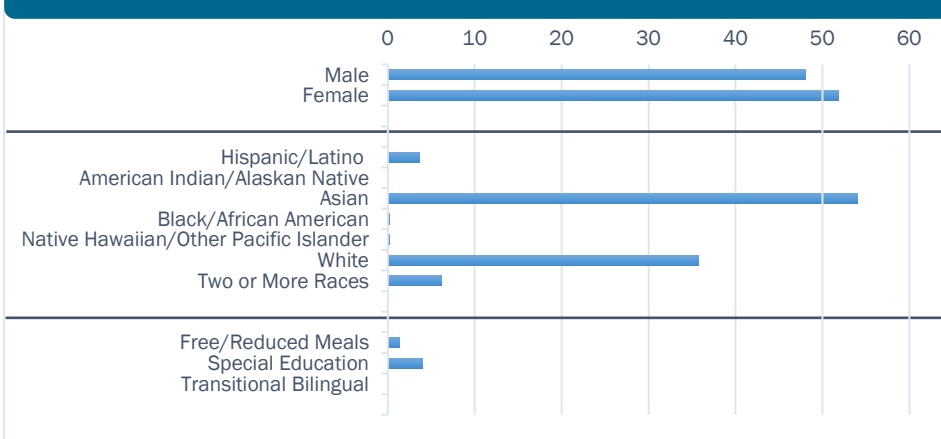

*Scores are suppressed when groups are so small that the information could potentially be used to identify or derive information about individual students. Many 11th grade students refused to take the test: they may have already met graduation requirements through passing the old state tests in 10th grade.

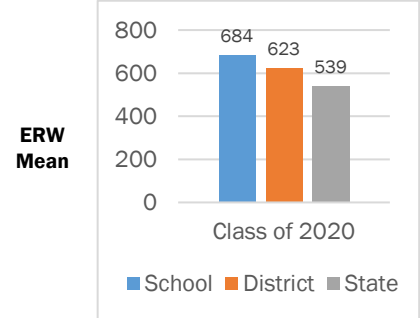
Building Condition Assessment: Good

The Building Condition Assessment represents an overall permanent building condition assessment. It is conducted by a third party in accordance with the state's Asset Preservation Program.

**The Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and the American College Test (ACT) are required by many colleges and universities for admission. Students elect to take these tests. A new SAT was given starting in January 2016. The Reading and Writing sections have been consolidated and now make up "Evidence-Based Reading and Writing" (ERW). As a result, the previous year's data is no longer comparable.

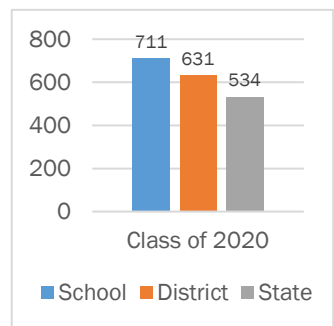

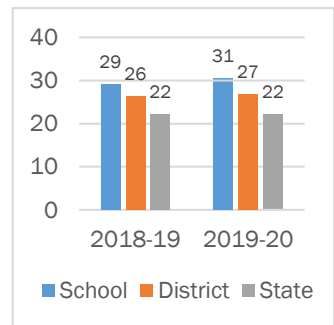


ERW Mean
