School Description

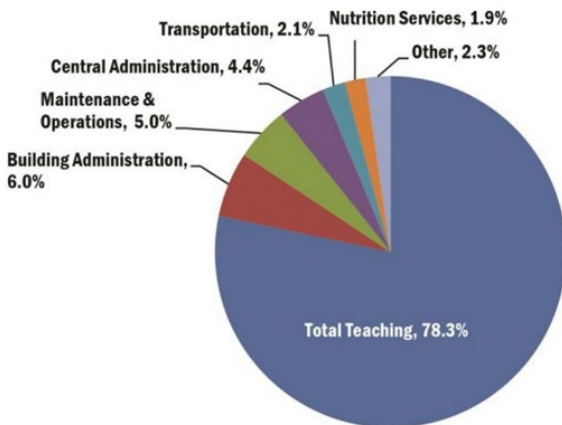
Benjamin Franklin Elementary is located in the Bridle Trail neighborhood of Kirkland and serves portions of Redmond and Kirkland. Franklin currently serves approximately 450 students from kindergarten through fifth grade. Students then move on to Rose Hill Middle School, and then on to Lake Washington High School.

Franklin continues to be a high-achieving school. The staff continues to work with families and students to ensure both academic and social success of all students. Every year, we set attainable yet challenging academic goals in all subject areas. Improvement of student learning is a continuous process. As a staff, we believe all children can be successful. Staff spent much of our Wednesday Learning Enhancement and Academic Planning (LEAP) days working on analyzing student work, making plans for improvement, reviewing best instructional practices to improve student learning, collaborating with grade level colleagues and collaborating with vertical teams.

Franklin Elementary proudly serves students of all abilities and backgrounds. In addition to a robust general education experience offered to all students, services available at our school include English Language interventions, Safety Net interventions, Resource Room interventions, highly capable enrichments and services, and a Learning Center program. Each of these systems provides students with the supports they need to successfully access the curriculum and meet their educational goals.

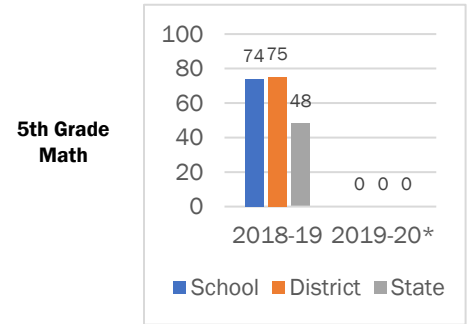
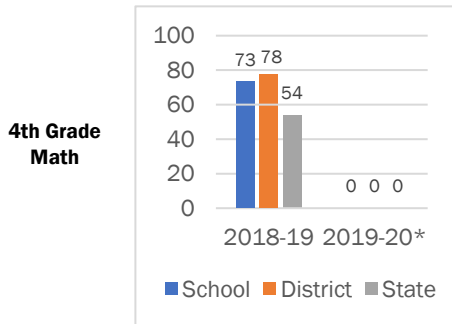
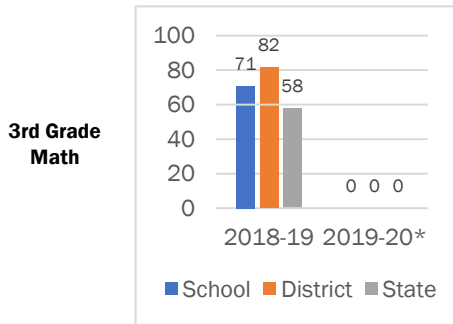
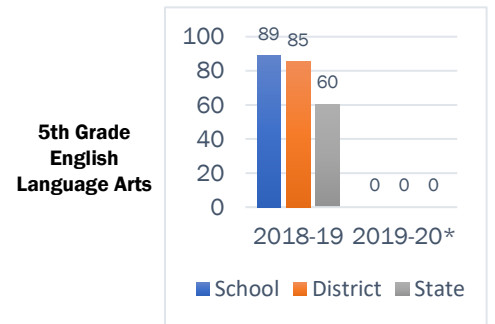
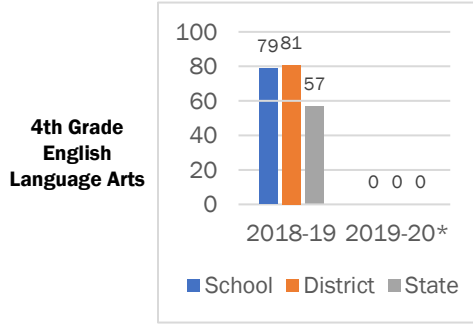
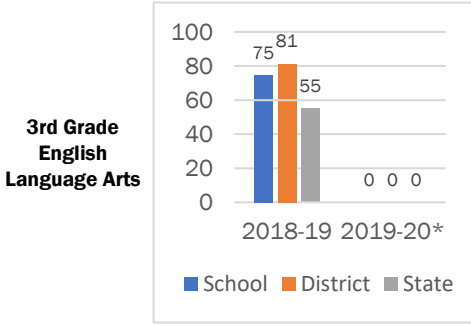
2019 20 School Goals

Through our Continuous Improvement Process, each grade-level team set specific and measurable goals in reading, writing, math and science. Staff used multiple sources of assessment to create these goals. Throughout the year, teachers worked collaboratively to achieve them.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 83.7% at benchmark on end of year DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 82.3% at benchmark on the SBA
- Grades 3-5 Math: 73% at benchmark on the SBA
- Grade 5 Science: 78% at benchmark on the MSP
- Achievement gap: 71% (15 out of 21 students) identified as below or well below benchmark in first grade on beginning of year DIBELS will be at benchmark by end of year DIBELS
- School Effectiveness: By May of 2019, staff agreement to the statement that "the school provides ample information to families about how to help students succeed in school" will be to 90% "agree mostly" and/or "agree completely".
- Attendance: Students tardy to school will decrease from 8% of students tardy over 20 days during the 2017-2018 school year to 4% of students tardy over 20 days during the 2018-2019 school year.
- Discipline: will reduce discipline referrals by 50% from the previous school year.

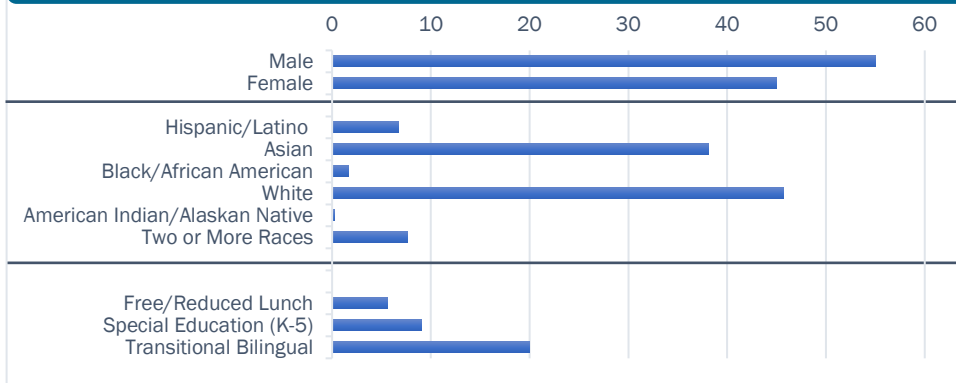
State Assessment Results
