PETER H. REMINGTON

Class of 1930

A highly decorated Air Force veteran, Col. Remington was active in the organization of the Air National Guard. He was an Army Air Corps pilot, chief of North American Air Defense personnel, air attache at the U.S. Embassy in Norway, and base commander for NATO's Central European Headquarters in France.

GEORGE EMERSON COX, JR.

Class of 1933

A World War II naval hero, Ensign Cox rescued Gen. Douglas MacArthur from the Philippines and was honored for his bravery by the United States, France, and the Philippines. His exploits were the subject of a popular movie and book. He was noted for his community service in Watertown.

FLOYD L. BAJJALY

Class of 1946

A psychiatrist and a man of exemplary community spirit, he has devoted his professional life to expanding services for members of the community with mental illness, mental retardation and developmental disabilities, and to providing treatment for people affected with alcohol and substance abuse.

Class of 1949

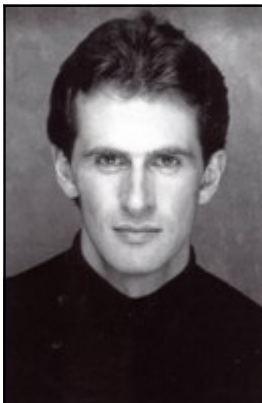


MARC D. DONOHUE
