Mrs. Stephanie Kim graduated in 1994 from Carmel High School, before going on to earn a Bachelor's Degree from Vanderbilt and an MBA from the University of Texas at Austin. Her career has been centered around her work for the Telamon Corporation, where she has served in high-impact positions, most currently as Chief Administration Officer and President of Logistics. Some of her honors include being named to the Indianapolis Business Journal's "Forty Under 40" in 2010 and being featured in a Cover Story for the Indianapolis Woman Magazine. In addition to her business involvement, Stephanie is also extensively engaged with the Carmel and Indianapolis community. She has served on the boards of and volunteered for several key community organizations, including The Center for Performing Arts, United Way of Central Indiana, Newfields, and the Carmel Clay Public Library.

JEFFERY LANGSTON

A member of the Carmel Class of 1986, Mr. Langston earned a Bachelor of Science degree and an MBA from Purdue University. As the owner and operator of Indiana's award-winning Heartwood Custom Homes, Jeff gained over a decade of construction management experience before co-founding the Old Town Design Group with Justin Moffitt. He has received many statewide awards for his work. ANDY JOSEPHSON

After graduating with the CHS Class of 1993, he received a Bachelor's Degree from Stanford University and went on to graduate first in his class from the WashU Medical School. Currently, he serves at the University of California San Francisco as the Chair of the Department of Neurology and as a Distinguished Professor, for which he has received numerous teaching awards. He has done extensive research in his field which is seen as he has authored more than 150 peer-reviewed published articles along with other books, and he serves as the Editor in Chief of JAMA Neurology, the top-ranked clinical neurology journal in the United States. Dr. Josephson is seen as a pioneer in the field of treating neurological disorders as he created and launched the neurohospitalist model of care that is now used widely across the nation.

MEGAN SOULTZ

Officer Megan Soultz is a member of the CHS Class of 2006, and afterward she earned her Bachelor's in Biology from DePauw and her Master's from IUPUI. One noteworthy fact about her is that she was a first responder to the so-called "Miracle on the Hudson" incident where a powerless jetliner landed on the Hudson River. Now, as a member of the Carmel Police Department, she is a licensed EMT and carries the distinction of being the first woman on the Carmel Police Department's SWAT team. Additionally, she uses her background in biology to not only teach classes at the IU School of Medicine and for EMS programs, but she has also been a leader for Carmel's research efforts and fight against COVID-19.

ACT & SAT

The first SAT of the 2021-22 year will be August 28. The registration deadline is July 30 and the cost is \$55. Students can register at the SAT website at www.collegeboard.org.

The first ACT test of the 2021-22 year will be held on September 11. The registration deadline is August 6 and the cost is \$60 without writing and \$85 with writing. Students can register at the ACT website at www.act.org.

When registering, students will need to use the CHS High School Code Number - **150445**.

As a reminder, both the SAT and ACT registration process requires students to upload a current photo of themselves to assist with verifying identification on test day. Please make sure that the uploaded photo is an individual headshot of the student ONLY. Students who upload group photos will be denied access on the day of the test. The admission ticket is REQUIRED on test day in addition to a current government or school issued ID.

PSAT TESTING INFORMATION FOR INCOMING FRESHMEN, SOPHOMORES AND JUNIORS

The 2021 PSAT will be administered on October 26th during the morning school hours. Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors will take the PSAT. Freshmen will take the PSAT 8/9. Sophomores and juniors will take the PSAT/NMSQT. These tests are meant to prepare students for future SAT exams. The cost of both tests will be covered by the Indiana Department of Education.

CLASS OF 2022: IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship:

Each year, Carmel High School has the opportunity to nominate two seniors to be considered for the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship. The Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship is a four-year full tuition scholarship awarded to Indiana students who intend to work toward a baccalaureate degree at any accredited public or private college or university in Indiana.

Several years ago, the endowment established a much earlier deadline, requiring high schools in Hamilton County to submit their nominations by mid-August. This means that we must start the application process during the summer months in order to give interested and eligible students ample time to complete an application by the Monday, August 16th application deadline. NOTE: this application deadline falls within the first week of school for the 2021-22 academic year.

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Nominated students must:

- Be a Hamilton County Resident (only four students in Hamilton County will be chosen as recipients of this scholarship)
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Demonstrate financial need
- Plan to pursue a full-time baccalaureate course of study beginning in the fall of 2022 at a public or private college or university **in Indiana**
- Demonstrate a commitment to community volunteerism
- Demonstrate leadership and/or initiative in their school, community, and/or extracurricular activities

In order for CHS to meet the nomination deadline of August 20th, **applications must** be submitted online by 3:30 p.m. on Friday, August 14, 2020.

Students seeking to be nominated by CHS must apply online at: https://forms.gle/9pqJWwYbEqfXpoiJ7

NOTE: students must access the application using their Carmel Clay Schools Google login.

Required documents include:

- **CHS Transcript**—students can obtain a transcript by sending email to mstephan@ ccs.k12.in.us to request an electronic copy.
- Resume that includes work experience, service activities, extracurricular involvement at CHS and/or in the community, and honors/awards received
- Essay responses to the following questions:
 - #1. **Educational/Career Goals:** In 500 words or less, please describe your educational and career goals. What steps have you taken and what do you plan to do to attain these goals?
 - #2. **Significant Experience:** In 500 words or less, evaluate a significant experience, achievement, risk or ethical dilemma and its impact on you. How will this experience and skills you have developed help prepare you to graduate from college despite potential barriers?
 - #3. **Community Service:** In 500 words or less, please describe how your commitment to community service has impacted your life, and describe how you see yourself continuing to give back to your community in five years.
 - #4. **Financial Support:** In 500 words or less, please describe, from a financial standpoint, what impact this scholarship would have on your education. If applicable, be sure to note any special circumstances that affect your need for financial support in order to attend college.



 Applicants for nomination are also required to submit two letters of recommendation, and interested students are encouraged to begin contacting recommenders as soon as possible in order to secure those on time. <u>Letters of recommendation</u> <u>should be sent via email directly</u> <u>to mstephan@ccs.k12.in.us.</u>

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COUNSELING CENTER

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COLLEGE APPLICATIONS AND COUNSELING CANVAS COURSE

Seniors – You should now be familiar with the College and Career Planning program **Naviance**. A major function of this system includes the processing of your transcripts and recommendations for college applications. Counselors will be meeting with seniors in September to provide details on how to request your transcript, letters of recommendation and counselor reports for your college applications. However, you do not have to wait for these meetings to begin the work on your part of college applications. You can start applying to most colleges in mid-August.

As rising seniors prepare to complete college applications this summer and fall, be sure to check the step-by-step tutorials in the Counseling Department Canvas Course. The course provides details for how to process college application materials, including transcript

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and counselor/teacher recommendations requests. Please note that the while the Counseling Department will begin processing transcript requests for the Class of 2022 on September 1st, students can certainly complete and submit their portion of their college applications as soon as they wish. Most applications do



not open until August 1st, and the earliest deadlines typically occur in October, November, and December depending on the college. Remember that there is plenty of time and assistance available once school starts. While working to complete applications in a timely manner is important, we encourage students to take the time necessary to submit the best possible applications.

COLLEGE APPLICATION RESOURCES FOR THE CLASS OF 2022

We know that many rising CHS seniors have plans to jump into the college search and application process in order to get a head start, and we want to make sure that you have access to all of the resources you need to so do. No matter where you are in the process, be sure to take advantage of the following resources and opportunities this summer:

- Your Naviance Student account can help you explore majors and careers, search for colleges and universities that are a "fit", create a "colleges I'm applying to" list, and even build a resume for use on applications. You can access your Naviance Student account by logging into the <u>CCS Student Portal</u> and clicking on the Naviance icon.
- College Application Boot Camp Canvas Course. This resource covers everything you might want to know about the college application process, and the great thing about it is that you can use what *you* need *when* you want to use it. Whether you want tips on how to write a college essay, ideas for getting organized, or details about the financial aid process, we are certain that you will find the boot camp course helpful. Every CHS Class of 2022 student was invited to join this course in Canvas, and all you need to do to access it is accept the invitation. (Note: parents who are observers in Canvas can access the boot camp course too!)

Prior to school starting in August, seniors can sign up for one 60-minute small-group session on August 3rd (9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m.) **OR** August 4th (9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m.) from their Naviance Student account, in the *College Visits* section. Space is limited for these summer help sessions, but please know that we will continue to offer help sessions throughout the fall semester during SSRT.

COUNSELOR RECOMMENDATION FEEDBACK SURVEY

Many college applications require a school report and/or letter of recommendation from your school counselor. In order to provide the most meaningful and comprehensive feedback to colleges, we ask students to answer 11 questions that will assist us with the recommendation process.

Naviance Student will be the main tool seniors use to communicate with their counselor regarding their application materials and recommendations. Please follow the steps below to answer the questions needed for your counselor to process their part of your college applications:

- Within the About Me tab in Naviance Student, you will click on the My Surveys link
- The survey you will complete in the **Not Started** section is titled **Counselor Recommendation Feedback Class of 2022**. Click this link and answer the eleven short-answer questions.
- These questions do not have to be answered in one session. Feel free to come back and edit your responses whenever needed. You will access an already started feedback form through the **Surveys In-Progress** link.
- You will also need to complete a resume of activities using the *Resume Builder* in Naviance Student. This will help your counselor have the big picture of your most important activities and accomplishments.

We would like seniors to have them completed by **September 10, 2021**, to allow enough time for counselors to process their part of your application materials.

CHS PTO BACKPACK PROGRAM PACKS OVER 2,000 BACKPACKS

Approximately 1,600 Carmel Clay students participate in free and reduced lunch, including just over 11% of CHS students. The CHS PTO Backpack Program provides food on the weekends for Carmel students who need extra nutrition. Last school year, over 2,000 backpacks were packed by volunteers and just over \$5500 in grocery store gift cards were distributed over school breaks.

The backpack program relies entirely on donations and volunteers. You can help by volunteering to pack bags, donating food items or grocery store gift cards, giving financially, or coordinating a food drive. Money is used to purchase food items and fresh fruit each month. Food donations and gift cards can be dropped off during school hours at the Freshman Center Main Office (Door 13). 



The Athletic Department continues its partnership with GoFan https://gofan.co/app/school/IN362, a digital ticketing company, to bring an easy and convenient digital platform to your phone. Your season ticket will be available on your smart phone through the GoFan Mobile Pass instead of a separate plastic card. All athletic events will continue to operate on a cashless system at all events. Paper money will not be accepted at events or in the prepurchasing of tickets. Instead, tickets and passes may be purchased from your mobile device as your ticket into the event. Credit cards will be accepted at all venues as well instead of paper money.

The home football schedule will feature some of the best teams in the Midwest as 4 MIC games and a non-conference game highlight a terrific lineup of match-ups. On August 27th, the Hounds will host Detroit King, one of the top teams in Michigan with many highly touted Division 1 recruits. Week 3 on September 3rd will host the defending state champion Center Grove Trojans in the battle for the Copper Kettle.
