SCHOOL OVERVIEW

Welcome to Hawthorne Elementary School!

Dear Families,

We are very pleased to welcome you and your child to the Hawthorne School community and the 2021-2022 school year. We look forward to working with you to help make your child's and family's experience in our learning community truly outstanding.

On behalf of the students and staff at Hawthorne Elementary, I invite you to partner with us in your child's education. You are your child's 1st teacher. You know your child best, your child's unique interests, learning strengths and needs, and ways we can best support your child's success in school.

Ready Set Goal conferences at the beginning of the school year with your child's classroom teacher will be an important time to share that information and your hopes for your child's progress for this school year.

Our first Parent-Teacher conference during which time teachers will share updates regarding student's progress to date in the school year is in November. Our first report card home is at the end of the 1st semester, toward the end of January 2022.

Our PTA and After School staff also host special family events throughout the school year for us to come together as a school community.

Family events are typically hosted each month and include things such as: Back to School Night, Literacy Night, Culture Night, Game Night, Science Night, Movie Night & concerts/musical performances.

We periodically have a *Morning Sing* at Hawthorne in our gymnasium just before the start of the school day on Mondays.

Our Morning Sing includes a student-lead drumming circle, singing and an affirmation. Everyone is invited and welcome to attend Hawthorne's Monday Morning Sing -- watch for notes home regarding dates of the Morning Sing and join us!

We hope you will consider becoming a member of our Hawthorne Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) and join in various PTA initiatives throughout the school year such as our monthly meetings on the 2nd Tuesdays of each month, our fundraiser events like our Hawthorne Hustle, Spring Raffle, and monthly restaurant donation nights, and for other family night events sponsored by our PTA and/or MSCR team.

Other ways to partner with us in your child's education can include reading together daily with your child or talking about books your child/children are reading in school, keeping a friendly response journal together, and talking about things your child is learning at school. Doing this will greatly encourage your child to do his/her best. Your interest, support, and close partnership with us in your child's education make a great difference.

It is our intention to provide child-centered, standards driven, personalized instruction, helping each student meet their next level of challenge in all subject areas.

Traffic safety (parking lot, pick up/drop off information)

To make the parking lots and drop-off/pick up areas safe for children, we ask that you adhere to the following rules:

- To drop off or pick up children while you stay in the car, use the circular drive on Concord Avenue; traffic must keep moving to avoid congestion; please do not drop off children in either of the parking lots
- To park your car and walk your child into school or pick up your child at the end of the day, you may park your car in the Concord or Lexington Street parking lots or on a side street near school
- When parking in the Lexington Street parking lot, do not park in the areas marked in yellow or block the entrance to this parking lot; traffic must be able to move in and out of this parking lot
- 4. Please DO NOT use the circular drive on Lexington Street to pick up your child; this area is for vans and buses ONLY

PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN HANDICAP OR BUS PARKING SPACES.

Tickets of \$150.00 or more will be issued to violators by the City of Madison Parking Enforcement. Please note any fire lanes and signs. Drivers who leave their cars parked and unattended in this space will be ticketed by the City of Madison Parking Enforcement.

Supervision of building / grounds

In order to reduce congestion in our hallways, bus lanes and designated drop-off points and to keep students safe, we have put into place the following dismissal procedures:

- If you pick up your child on the Lexington side of the building, we ask that families
 wait outside for their children at the end of the day; please meet your child at the
 gazebo on the back playground.
- If you pick up your child in the front of the school you may park your car in the
 parking lot or on the street (please don't park your car and leave it in the circle
 driveway); families can wait in the front foyer by the office for their children but
 should not go to their child's classroom.
- At 1:10 (MONDAYS) We have a "warning "bell
- At 1:15 (MONDAYS) is the dismissal bell
- At 2:42 (TUESDAY-FRIDAY) we have a "warning" bell; at this time children get their belongings from their lockers and line up inside their classrooms.
- At 2:47(TUESDAY-FRIDAY) the dismissal bell will ring; teachers walk all of their children to the Lexington Street exit; children who are picked up by their parents in the front entrance will be dropped off at this entrance as their classroom passes this entrance (students who are in classrooms on the ground level should be picked up on the Lexington Street exit).
- As children leave the building they go to their bus line, to the gazebo to meet up with families or to the basketball court area nearest the gazebo to meet up with siblings and/or friends to walk home.
- Once the teachers have walked students outdoors, additional Hawthorne staff remain at the exits to assure that all students are delivered safely.

If you have information that you need to tell your child during the school day:

- If you know you will be late picking up your child(ren);
 - you must call the office 204-2500 before the end of the school day (by 12:30 on Mondays; and 2:00 on Tuesday-Friday) to let us know.
- Most calls received during the school day will be routed to your child's teacher's voicemail – they will listen to voicemail before the end of the day

Family engagement

The Hawthorne Elementary Parent Teacher Association (PTA) provides a forum for parents and teachers to work together to improve the school community by sponsoring programs and activities that enhance learning and promote family involvement in student achievement. The PTA is a local affiliate of the National PTA and as such embraces the mission of the National PTA. The mission of the National PTA is:

- To support and speak on behalf of children and youth in our school, in the community, and before government bodies and other organizations that make decisions affecting children;
- To assist parents in developing the skills they need to raise and protect their children;
 and
- To encourage parent and public involvement in the public schools of this nation.

So how does PTA support this mission?

Hawthorne PTA sponsors a variety of programs and fundraisers throughout the school year that encourage family support for the school. PTA meetings will be held on the third Tuesday of each month. Meetings are in the Hawthorne Elementary library and begin promptly at 6:30 p.m. Childcare is provided.

Who is eligible to be a member of the Hawthorne PTA?

All family, teachers, staff, community members, and local businesses interested in supporting Hawthorne Elementary School are eligible for membership.

So why should you join PTA?

The PTA is a great way to connect with the school, network with families and teachers, and support the educational mission of the school. Please come and share your time and talents by volunteering with the PTA.

Family Room

Room 112, across from the Main Office is available for use by members of the Hawthorne Community. The room is open 7:30 am – 5:00 p.m. Please just sign in at the office first.-There are computers available for your use. They have internet access, Microsoft office and a printer. Family Room can be used for answering emails, writing letters, working on a resume, applying for jobs, finding information on community resources, and finding parenting resources. Plus there are books, magazines, puzzles, and games for learning and playing with your children.

Our Community Schools Director, Ericka Brown and our Family Liaison, Rosario Vela, both have offices in our Family Room

Washer/Dryer Room

A washer and dryer are available for families to use in the room across from the Family Room. Do a load of laundry and spend time in your child's classroom! Sign-in at the front office AND in the laundry room. You MUST stay at Hawthorne while washing clothes. Laundry detergent is provided.

School support services

A message from the Health Office: Summer vacation is over and we are beginning a new school year. We are happy to be working with your child once again!

If your child has been diagnosed with any health problem, it would be helpful if you would let us know as soon as possible. Even if it is a known problem, we would still like to hear from you regarding your child's progress over the summer and his/her present status and concerns.

We would especially like to hear from you if your child has asthma, allergies (especially food allergies), seizures, hearing or vision concerns, diabetes or other chronic illness; or if your child is taking medication for an illness or condition.

If your child should get a communicable disease (like strep, chickenpox, fifth disease) during the year, please let us know. Since head lice (pediculosis) has been common in most schools, it is a good idea for you to periodically check your child's head for lice and eggs. If your child should get head lice, please let the health office staff know.

We encourage you to encourage your family to consume 5-9 servings of fruits and vegetables daily. Please send snacks that are low in fats and sugar. Please do not send soda pop in your child's lunch or peanut containing products for classroom snacks (some children have life-threatening peanut allergies). Remember to have your child drink milk and eat dairy products for strong bones and teeth.

At Hawthorne we would like to encourage our students and staff to make decisions that promote health and fitness. One way is to limit foods that are high in sugar and fat. The Hawthorne Wellness Committee would like you to consider choosing Healthy class Celebrations. We would like to celebrate how your child is unique, there are many ways to do this besides cake!!

Suggestions include:

Food: treats of fruit or vegetables, low fat popcorn, cheese or yogurt

Activities: Dance parties, craft activities, extra recess time, bring in their favorite book to be read to the class, being first in line, lunch outside, sharing a new school supply with the class Examples:

Parenting can be a rewarding and stressful experience that involves many responsibilities, and we know and see our Hawthorne parents taking very seriously the responsibility to be involved with their child's/children's education. We look forward to working together to ensure a successful school experience for your child.

Our school has many support staff available to help coordinate the efforts of home and school to best meet the needs of your child. The following are brief descriptions of our roles, many of which overlap:

- Collaborates with families about community resources
- Coordinates Mentor Program
- Member of Hawthorne SSIT Student Support and Intervention Team
- Member of Hawthorne MTSS Multi-Tiered Systems of Support
- Provides guided mindfulness practices to promote student and staff wellness
- Teaches safety lessons in classrooms
- Provides social/emotional interventions for students

Picking up your child during the school day

When you are picking up a student for an appointment please allow enough time to follow the protocol below:

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To ensure the safety of your child, please send a note in advance to your child's teacher and the office. We require parents to come into our office and sign out the student. We will call the classroom to have the student sent down to the office to meet the parents. Please remember anyone picking up a student must be authorized and listed in Infinite Campus. Once school is in session, all non-school staff (including parents) will NOT be allowed to go to a classroom unaccompanied to pick up a child.

When you receive a call from the Health Office that your child is sick/hurt and you need to come to school to get them, please come to the office to sign out the child. The nurse will bring the student to the office.
