Update on the 2021-22 School Year

- We are prepared to welcome back all students for in-person instruction on August 16
- Masks will be required for students and staff indoors
- The ventilation and cleaning measures from last school year will remain in place
- Distancing is no longer required in classrooms under the CDPH guidelines when masking is in place
- Changes to quarantining procedures
- Staff is currently updating our reopening safety guide for families, which will go out next week

1:1 Device Program

- 1:1 is an educational concept where every student has full time access to the same laptop/Chromebook both in the school environment and at home
- Students bring their device to class every day
- Choice of bringing personal device that meets the program criteria or checking out a Chromebook from school
- Information was sent out to all families several weeks ago with a form to fill out if a Chromebook is needed

What is Independent Study?

- Independent Study is a program in which students follow an online, self-paced curriculum from home, with students accessing teacher support synchronously once per week.
- Independent Study is **not the same** as the distance/remote learning that students experienced between March 2020 and Spring 2021.
- We will not be offering the models of distance/remote learning or hybrid learning that were provided during the past year.

State Assembly Bill 130: Independent Study

- Under AB 130 families will have:
 1. the option to choose an independent study option for their child(ren), whose health would be put at risk, as determined by the parent; and
 2. the right to request a pupil/parent/educator conference meeting prior to enrollment in the independent study program.
- On July 29, FUHSD held a webinar for families interested in this option. Enrollment information is available on our district website homepage and School Reopening webpage.

Who might choose the Independent Study program?

This option was primarily designed for students who:

- may have an elevated risk of exposure to COVID,
- are unable to take the vaccine due to a medical issue,
- are immunocompromised, or
- have immediate family members who are immunocompromised.

FUHSD Independent Study Program

Students enrolled in the FUHSD Independent Study program will:

- Have access to courses that ensure progress towards graduation;
- Not have access to the same range of courses as their current home high school offers;
- Be enrolled in an alternative program, not in their current home high school;
- Receive instruction from teachers provided by online provider Edgenuity;
- Attend a weekly synchronous check in session with a District teacher; and
- Not participate in athletics and activities.

Edgenuity

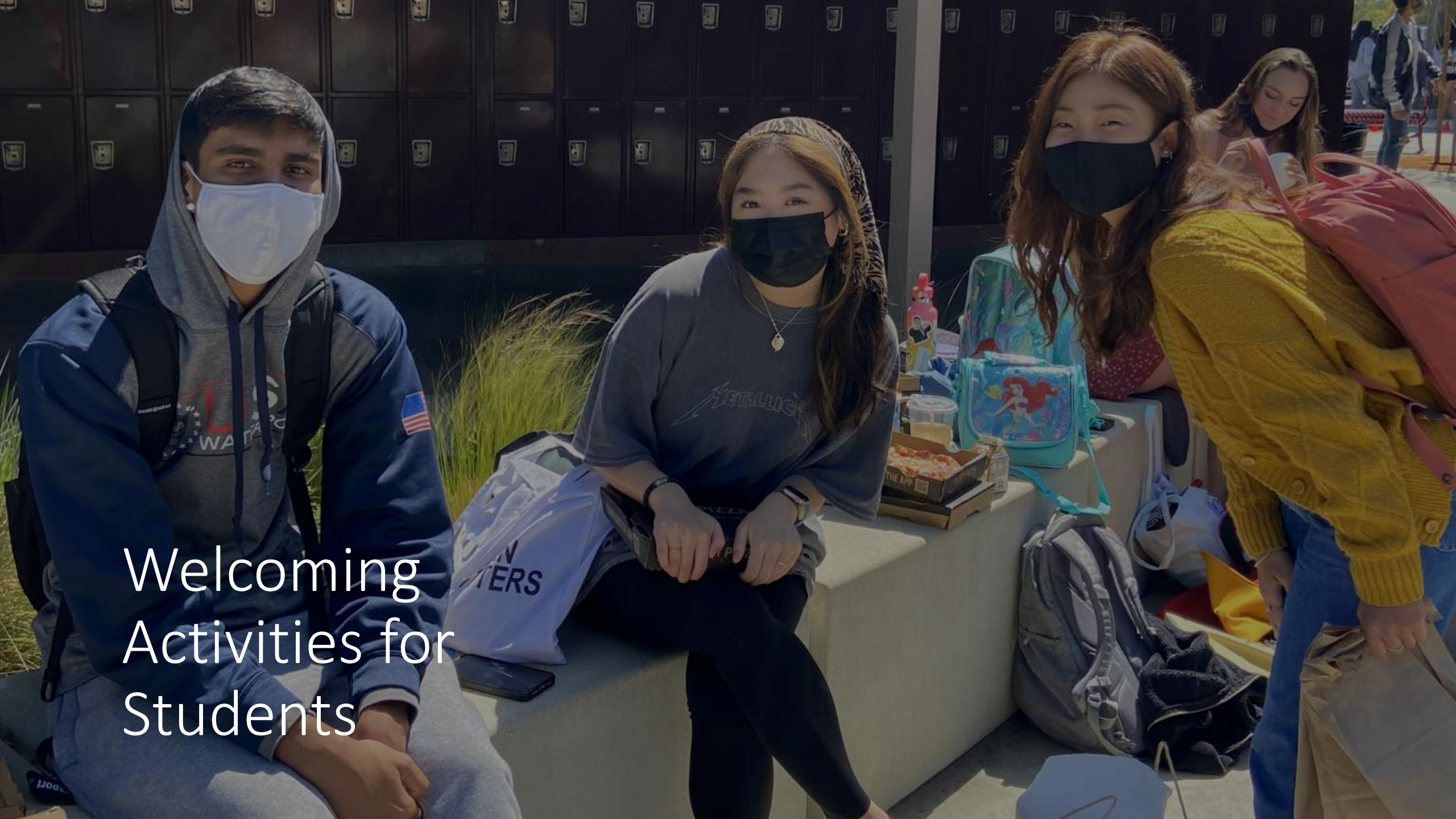
- Edgenuity is the program we have purchased to provide our Independent Study program.
- Students will review content and complete assignments at their own pace.
- Students can access support from Edgenuity teachers by appointment.
- Edgenuity does include a number of AP/Honors courses, however it does not offer the full FUHSD course catalogue.
