Work Session

A. Literacy Update

Debi Fragomeni introduced the district's "literacy leaders" which includes Wendy Beitel, Danielle Smith, Mary Webster, Lynn Newmyer, Lisa Hall and Karen Gelardi.

Wendy Beitel presented the district's literacy beliefs which include:

- Literacy is an inalienable right for all people in a democratic society.
- Literacy is a community initiative.
- Continuous, high-quality professional learning is vital for all staff within a world-class literacy system.
- Early literacy intervention is an economic, social and moral imperative.
- Choice in a variety of rich, authentic texts promotes student engagement.
- Teachers change their teaching to match how students learn.
- Positive relationships are the foundation of a learning community.
- Reading and writing inspire joy.

Additionally, Wendy shared diagnostic results of a fall and winter comparison, performance and growth by grade, typical growth by placement and performance and growth by school. All of our schools are above average in terms of growth.

Danielle Smith presented the components of the Rochester Community Schools literacy plan that include:

- Align core literacy curriculum and professional development
- Increase literacy expertise and expand research-based interventions
- Establish a sustainable district coaching model
- Grow district literacy leadership

Danielle also gave an overview of the implementation for Units of Study.

Mary Webster shared information on the Teachers College of Reading and Writing Project Labsites and the importance of collaboration.

Lynn Newmyer presented the district's Reading Recovery program and explained the early literacy collaborative component associated with this program. Rochester Community Schools established a Reading Recovery site in the 2018-2019 school year and we will be fully implemented in the 2020-2021 school year. Ideally, Reading Recovery is a 20 week or less program.

Lisa Hall spoke about the 3rd Annual Literacy Summit that will be held on May 21, 2019, as well as the Home Grown Reading Institute that will be held from August 19-22, 2019.

Karen Gelardi reviewed the district's next steps that include: phonics institute for literacy coaches (in May); professional learning opportunities (using grant dollars); Summer Academy (held at Brooklands and Long Meadow, for students ending grades 2-4) will cover literacy, math and STEAM; EL Summer Program; eight staff members will be trained in Reading Recovery in 2019-2020; and a multi-year professional learning plan.

The literacy team addressed the Board to answer their questions.
