OWNERSHIP:

A hallmark of the Upper School experience is a four-year study in **self-exploration**, which includes several assessments to understand learning styles, decision-making preferences, individual strengths, personalities, and career aptitudes. Students graduate with a deep knowledge of who they are as people, can comfortably communicate with others, and own their personal actions.

SCHOLARSHIP:

Cannon's educational philosophy of **adaptive expertise** fosters habits of autonomy, creativity, curiosity, risk-taking, metacognition, and reflection. Our students learn to take risks and decide for themselves how they will meet challenges in academic and daily life.

Cannon students' sense of commitment and personal responsibility have resulted in deep **community engagement**. Although service is not a graduation requirement, our students collectively complete almost 10,000 service hours each year through school-wide projects and individual efforts.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

GPA: Our Advanced Topics (AT) and Advanced Placement (AP) courses are weighted with a 1.0 quality point. Honors and Honors Accelerated courses are not weighted. The cumulative weighted and unweighted GPAs for each student are calculated using final grades from courses taken at Cannon School.

CALENDAR: Cannon School operates on a trimester system. Trimesters end in November, February, and May. *Grade reports for Trimester 1 are automatically sent for all seniors; grade reports for Trimester 2 are sent upon request.*

COURSE LOAD: Students carry an academic load of six courses unless extenuating circumstances dictate otherwise. Currently, all classes are taught as full-year courses.

RANK AND REPORTING POLICY: Cannon School does not rank students. The College Counseling office reports out-of-school suspensions and expulsions through time of graduation to any colleges and universities that request this information.



STATEMENT OF GRADING AND INSTRUCTION

2020-2021

Cannon School started the 2020-2021 academic year in a hybrid model with students learning remotely and in-person on alternate weeks (by last name). Instruction was delivered both synchronously and asynchronously, and we adopted a long-block schedule (three 90-min classes per day) to reduce overall screen time.

While we are proud to have been able to keep our students' mental health at the forefront of decisions made last year, we want to acknowledge the difficult learning environments faced by all students during the pandemic: various technical challenges and limitations, reduced extra-curricular opportunities, sudden changes in family economic and health circumstances, limited social interaction, and understandable anxiety about how all of this would impact their future college processes.

Expected 2021-2022

For the coming academic year, we expect a return to oncampus learning. We are retaining a modified version of the schedule we used during COVID: four 70-min classes per day with time for our robust advisory program, office hours with faculty, and student support services. We will retain letter grades and will automatically send grade reports for all seniors in November at the conclusion of Trimester 1.

*Given the high number of institutions offering test optional admission review this year, we support our students' right to choose whether they will submit scores with their applications. Therefore, test scores for the Class of 2022 are not reported.

SIGNATURE LEARNING EXPERIENCES

Student-driven choice and inquiry define Cannon's signature learning experiences. Students collaborate with one another and their teachers to define a research topic, problem or project. While signature learning experiences unfold differently depending on the course, they all culminate with students publicly demonstrating competencies in their respective fields. Selected examples include:

Portfolio Defense: In Advanced Topics: American Language and Literature, students design and present digital portfolios featuring multiple drafts of projects written throughout the junior year.

Symposium: In Advanced Topics: US History, students choose, trace and develop an original argument about an historical topic, which they defend in the spring of junior year.

BIOREX: With these **Bio**logical **Research Experience** projects, juniors develop a scientific hypothesis, test it, analyze results with statistical methods and present their findings to a committee of faculty, science professionals, and local business leaders.

Independent Study: Seniors who wish to pursue a topic in greater depth can petition to work alongside a faculty member, develop course content and assessment rubrics, and produce an end-of-year artifact that represents and explains their coursework.

Senior Capstones: These service projects allow seniors to immerse themselves in a philanthropic cause for which they are passionate. Culminating presentations to faculty, staff, and peers allow time for reflection and questions.
