LIST II: CLASS OF 2020

There were 39 students on List II on 5/28/2020 (655 students in the class). Of those 39, all have graduated.

LIST III: CLASS OF 2020

There were 3 students on List III on 5/28/2020 (655 students in the class). Of those 3, 2 have yet to graduate.

TRANSITION: CLASS OF 2020

There were 10 students entering into transition programs on 5/28/2021 (655 students in the class). Of those 10, 10 have yet to graduate.

LIST II: CLASS OF 2019

There were 39 students on List II on 6/4/2019 (687 students in the class). Of those 39, 2 have yet to graduate.

LIST III: CLASS OF 2019

There were 3 students on List III on 6/4/2019 (687 students in the class). Of those 3, all have graduated.

TRANSITION: CLASS OF 2019

There were 9 students entering into transition programs on 6/4/2019 (687 students in the class). Of those 9, 9 have yet to graduate.
