HOUSE STAFF

Girls in St Gabriel's House are cared for by a full-time Boarding Housemistress who has overall responsibility for the House, an Assistant Housemistress, two Resident Tutors, and a Graduate Assistant.

The Resident Tutors combine House duties with teaching or another role within the School during the day.

The House Staff are also supported by several cleaning and catering assistants.

ACCOMMODATION AND FACILITIES

St. Gabriel's House has a large Common Room for both year groups, a computer room and a quiet room on the ground floor. The dining room is situated on the first floor, along with the kitchen and laundry room for the girls' use. Above are four further floors of dormitories, which are divided with partitions so each girl has her own private space or cubicle ('cubi'), with a bed, small table and wardrobe space.

There are washing and toilet facilities on each floor, as well as two duty rooms for staff who sleep on-site. Wi-Fi is available throughout the House until 22:00.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

All girls must wear School uniform during the School day. Girls may change into casual clothes when they return to the House and at weekends. The only items of jewellery which may be worn in School are: a watch, a cross and chain and one pair of plain stud earrings. All girls need smart, appropriate clothes for Mass on Sundays but may opt to wear their School uniform if they prefer.

In addition, boarders are required to have the following:

- Three sets of nightwear;
- A dressing gown or bath robe;
- One pair of slippers or flip flops;
- Two sets of bed linen (single sheet, duvet cover and pillow case);
- Two bath towels;
- A face cloth;
- A set of smart clothes suitable for Sunday Mass and more formal occasions - not denim or jeans, no tight leggings or jeggings and no short skirts - plus smart shoes with a low heel or school shoes;
- Toiletries;
- · Sanitary items;

- An airtight box for Food and Nutrition;
- Duvet and pillow;
- Coat.

LUGGAGE

As the House is spread over several floors, we recommend lightweight small or medium sized suitcases be used as luggage, as girls must carry their own belongings upstairs. However if large suitcases are necessary they can be unpacked in the Common Room and carried upstairs in smaller loads. Suitcases and storage bags are then stored in the House during term time until the end of term.

Girls may leave one suitcase and one large bag in the House during the school holidays if required.



LAUNDRY

A laundry allowance of £50 per term is included in the School fees to cover normal requirements. Laundry is collected from St Gabriel's on Tuesdays and returned on Fridays. Girls list each item that they wish to send out in their laundry book, which is placed in their bag. Laundry bags are then left at the bottom of the stairs for collection. The cost of each bag sent out is written in the girls' books so that they can keep track of how much they are spending each term to avoid exceeding their limit. If girls spend more than their £50 per term allowance, this additional cost will be added to their School bill. There are washing machines and tumble dryers for girls' use in our own laundry room and all girls will be shown how these work at the beginning of the year to enable them to do their own basic washing. Please ensure all items of clothing are clearly named with first name and surname, including home clothes. bed linen and underwear. As there is limited drying space it is ideal if all items of clothing are suitable for tumble drying.

SCHOOL SHOP

Our on-site School Shop is open Monday to Friday between 08:00-15:30. The girls can purchase a variety of stationery supplies, toiletries, sanitary items, storage boxes, bags and School uniform etc. Purchases can either be put on their School account with parents' permission or paid for with cash, debit or credit card.

STUDY

Girls study in their year groups in silence without the distraction of phones or music but may use their laptops or the St Gabriel's computers for work purposes, if required. All girls may use the quiet room or stay where they are after Study has finished if they have more work to complete. House Staff and Sixth Form Prefects supervise Study and are on hand to help when needed.

MEALTIMES

Breakfast

From Monday to Friday breakfast is served from 07:30 in the Main School Dining Room. Girls must be in full School uniform, including School shoes. Hair should be tied back if long, and must be neat and tidy. At weekends the House is more relaxed and girls may come down to breakfast in St Gabriel's in dressing gowns and slippers. On Sundays we prepare breakfast in the House which often includes bacon and eggs, pancakes, waffles, smoothies and French toast.

Tea

Tea, which is available after Period 6, is in Main School and is optional from Monday to Friday.

Supper

All boarders come to supper in Main School every day of the week.

General

We have a well-equipped spacious kitchen in St Gabriel's, which is available for the girls to make drinks at any time. Fruit is always available for girls in the kitchen. We also provide a variety of snacks they can make for themselves; cereals, bread, yogurts, juice etc and girls can have these snacks or something of their own after Study or during the weekend. For more elaborate cooking, the House has specific times over the weekend to ensure girls can be supervised while using the hob and oven, and you will often find girls cooking pancakes, pizzas, making smoothies, noodles, pasta or whatever takes their fancy. There is a fridge and small freezer for girls to use too - all items must be named and dated.



Each weekend there is a team of girls responsible for washing up and a pair of girls during the week to do a general tidy up at the end of the evening. This helps the girls to learn to be respectful of their surroundings and to take care of their belongings.

WEEKENDS AND WEEKEND LEAVE

There are plenty of things to do at the weekend at Mayfield. Girls are often involved in sports fixtures on Saturdays and these take place in the morning and afternoon. There are also riding lessons, textiles and cookery amongst other activities and workshops. Each week the Year 9 and 10 girls sign up for an activity on a Saturday afternoon and these range from trips to Eastbourne to cookie-making and launching water rockets - the options are varied! In addition to this, we run our own in-house excursions and activities. There is always a party at Christmas and an egg hunt at Easter, not to mention shopping trips, visits to the cinema, trampolining, strawberry picking and a wide range of other activities.

Year 10 girls may travel to Tunbridge Wells with a friend using the local bus service on a Saturday afternoon in the Spring and Summer terms.

All boarders must attend Mass on Sunday morning at 11:30. They are required to dress appropriately: no denim, shorts, tight clothing or short skirts are allowed (please see dress code). Of course, there is plenty of free time for weekend study as well as socialising with friends and relaxing. Girls may go home or travel to stay with friends or guardians on any weekend providing they have permission. Permission must be granted by the Housemistress by the Wednesday evening prior to the weekend they would like to go out. This includes an invitation from the family inviting them out and permission from their own parents, which should be granted via email to the Housemistress.

All weekend travel arrangements should be made through the Housemistress. If a taxi is required it must be requested by Wednesday at 17:00 at the latest, including the weekend minibus service to London which leaves at 16:45 every Friday and returns back to School on Sunday evenings at approximately 18:30–19:00 dependent on traffic.

HOUSE MEETINGS AND SHARING INFORMATION

St Gabriel's has a daily House meeting at which the Housemistress or Assistant Housemistress will deliver information and notices. Any House decisions will be discussed at this meeting when appropriate. At the end of the meetings, we have an 'Open Forum' in which girls can raise any issues. There is a House Council, which meets each term and is chaired by our Head of House and Prefects. The Council consists of representatives from each year group, has a formal agenda and is minuted. There is an 'anything goes' box by the House Office for requests that girls might not feel comfortable making in person. Reminders and messages are displayed on a whiteboard by the front door for girls to see as they leave and arrive at the House.

HOUSE RULES AND BEHAVIOUR GUIDANCE

Parents, relatives and friends are always welcome in St Gabriel's. As a matter of courtesy they should always be introduced to the member of staff on duty. Friends from other Houses and day girls are also welcome to visit. Please ask them to sign in the Visitors' Book before going upstairs. Male relatives and friends may not go upstairs.

We have a Netflix account that the girls may use during the weekend and we regularly run age appropriate movie nights for each or collective year groups. Girls are reminded not to download films of an unsuitable age certificate onto laptops as this may result in the laptop and/or other equipment being removed.

On week days, once girls leave the House for morning registration with their tutor, the House is not accessible to them until they return for supper that evening so they need to take everything they will require for the day, including PE kit, in the morning.

Girls must respect other peoples' belongings and not borrow them without permission. Each girl's cubicle is their own private space. Please respect each other's privacy and knock first before opening the curtain. Do not enter another girl's cubicle if she is not present. Girls may put pictures and posters up in cubicles but please make sure to use the noticeboards only. Please use 'Blu Tack', not drawing pins.

Candles are not allowed in your cubis.

Girls all have lockable lockers upstairs. Please ensure all belongings are put away safely and ensure keys are kept safe. The School cannot accept responsibility for items lost if not stored in a locker or handed in for safekeeping. Please make sure everything is named.

No girl is allowed out after supper without permission, except during the Summer at the discretion of the House staff.

Mobile phones and other electronic devices are collected at bedtime to ensure everyone gets a proper night's sleep. If anyone fails to hand in their phone it will be confiscated for up to one week.


REWARDS AND SANCTIONS

REWARDS

We focus on, and reward, good behaviour in St Gabriel's. House staff will recognise and report any extra effort made by any girl for the House. The Housemistress will reward this suitably with either House Stars, or recognition at House meetings or a voucher for the tuck shop! Good behaviour is also recorded along with the reward given. At the end of the year House Colours are awarded to those girls who have made significant contributions to life in St Gabriel's. Sixth Form House Prefects will also be able to award House Stars.

SANCTIONS

Sanctions are usually only given for anti-social behaviour or for rudeness towards a member of staff. Examples of anti-social behaviour include: failure to turn up for a House duty, causing a disturbance during Study, or after lights out. In general, House sanctions take the form of extra duties, or a boarding referral, and all sanctions are recorded by the Housemistress. Persistent poor behaviour will result in girls being put on a House Report and a referral to the Deputy Head. As a last resort, the Housemistress will contact parents to discuss the situation and the Headmistress will be informed.





WHOLE SCHOOL RULES AND POLICIES

HEALTH AND SAFETY

WELLBEING

The health and welfare of all the girls is the priority of all staff. If girls feel unwell or have a minor complaint, the Housemistress should be seen in the first instance (or any another member of House staff in her absence). If necessary, girls will be referred to the Health Centre.

The Health Centre is staffed by three Nurses and a timetable of who is on duty, and when, is displayed on the notice boards. The Health Centre is open Monday to Friday between the hours of 07:30 and 18:30 and there is a Nurse on call in the evenings and at weekends.

If girls are struggling emotionally they are able to talk to their Housemistress, Tutor, School Chaplain or any other member of staff they feel comfortable with. However, we also offer an in-house counselling service.

PUPILS REQUIRING MEDICAL ATTENTION/ADVICE

Girls requiring medical attention from the Health Centre during lessons, between 08:20 and 16:30 inclusive, should seek permission from the teacher. If the Health Centre deems that a girl should remain out of lessons for a period of time, they will issue permission. After 18:00 or at weekends girls must go to a member of House staff who will telephone the Nurse.

If you are taken ill during the night, please alert the member of staff on duty. Girls who bring any medicines into School from home MUST take them to the staff in the Health Centre who will log them and decide how they should be safely stored and administered.

FIRE DRILLS

Please read the notices in the House regarding fire drills. It is essential you know how to get out of the building safely, it could save lives. The fire escapes are only to be used in an emergency. In the event of a fire, it is vital that staff know who is in the House, therefore girls must use the signing in and out book accurately. There will be a number of fire drills in the House throughout the year including one when the House is asleep to ensure everyone is fully prepared in the event of a real fire.

SAFETY

For safety reasons, it is absolutely forbidden to have any flammable substances, matches, candles, incense sticks, etc in the House. All electrical items brought into the House will be PAT tested by a qualified electrician. Please be aware that some of the cheaper replacement phone and laptop chargers can be faulty and present a fire or electrocution hazard. If any charger or wire is damaged do not use it as it might be dangerous.

SMOKING/VAPING

Smoking, vaping or possession of cigarettes is forbidden. The penalty for any girl caught smoking/vaping or in possession of cigarettes or in the company of others who are smoking/ vaping is:

- A letter home to parents;
- Confiscation of any materials found;
- A £25 fine for a first offence, then £50 for a second offence;
- Gating from the village for four weeks and a period of community service.

ALCOHOL

Possession or consumption of alcohol or other illegal substance is forbidden. The penalty for infringement is:

- A letter home to parents;
- Confiscation of any alcohol found;
- Further action as appropriate taken by the Deputy Head, in line with the School's 'Rewards Sanctions and Pupil Voice Policy', in liaison with the Headmistress.

POCKET MONEY

There is a limit that the Housemistress will keep for the girls in the Boarding House. Please note that this money should be brought in cash in various denominations and preferably not just in £50 pound notes.

• Years 9 and 10 will be £200 per term.

Please note that this amount also includes any money brought into School in any other currency.

At the beginning of each term, parents may top up their daughter's pocket money but it must remain within the abovementioned sum.

We encourage the girls to open bank accounts in the United Kingdom and to have a bankcard.

There is a Post Office in Mayfield village which accepts clients from many banks including those listed below:-

- Barclays Bank;
- Bank of Scotland;
- Danske Bank;
- Handlesbanken;
- HSBC;
- · Lloyds;
- Nat West;
- TSB;
- Virgin Money.

However it may be best to check with us before opening an account so that we can confirm whether or not the Post Office accepts the bank you are thinking of using. The list is always changing so do ask us for the latest list. We would expect a UK boarder to open their account whilst at home.

If an overseas boarder arrives in the UK before School starts, please take this time to open an account in person.

If not, Boarding House staff will be able to take overseas boarders to Tunbridge Wells, where they will be able to book an appointment with a bank. However, these need to be booked in advance and will not always be available in the first few weekends.

ACCESS TO THE VILLAGE

Girls may go into the village after School on Fridays, and at weekends when not in Study or an activity. The village car parks and the recreation ground (Court Meadow) are out of bounds. Please see the map on the St Gabriel's noticeboard for out of bounds areas.

CONCERNS AND COMPLAINTS

If any girl needs help or has a problem there are a number of options open to them:

- Girls can always speak with Mrs Whitby or any other member of the House staff;
- Girls can speak with Ronan Lavery, the School Chaplain, who visits the House once a week and is also available during the School day as well;
- Girls can speak with their Form Tutor, Head of School (Mrs Stone) or another member of the teaching staff;

- They can contact the independent personal listener (details on the St Gabriel's House noticeboard);
- There is a list of independent and external help lines downstairs;
- They can use the 'anything goes' box in the House, either signed or anonymously, or email a member of staff;
- They can speak with the Health Centre staff or email them;
- They can speak with the Prefects.

The School's Complaints Procedure is available on the School website, if anyone has a complaint which the Housemistress cannot help you with.

ENGLISH SPEAKING POLICY

In St Gabriel's House, girls are expected to speak English at all times. Not only does this improve fluency, but it prevents anyone feeling excluded from conversations, increases friendships and promotes unity within the House.





FLEXI AND OCCASIONAL BOARDING

St Gabriel's House welcomes girls who wish to flexi-board one, two or three nights a week, perhaps to fit around early or late games practice, or to accommodate parents' commitments. Parents are welcome to contact the Housemistress to discuss their requirements before requesting flexiboarding in writing. Flexi-boarders should register at 18:00 in St Gabriel's on the nights they are boarding. Please complete the 'Flexi-Boarding Request Form' to request a flexi-boarding place. This is available to download from the School website.

Parents should email or telephone the Housemistress if their daughter is not staying in on a night. Once booked in, you will be charged for the number of nights you are signed up for. A term's notice is required.

Boarding is very popular so please request any change or extra nights in good time to ensure we have a bed available.

Occasional boarders are also welcome if, for example, parents are going to be away for a period of time. Please complete the 'Occasional Boarding Request Form' to request an occasional boarding place. This is also available to download from the School website.

Please telephone or email the Housemistress if any further information is required.

TRAVEL

Travel arrangements are made through the School's Travel Co-ordinator, Mrs Attoe, who you can contact directly at jattoe@ mayfieldgirls.org or via your Housemistress.

AIRPORT TRANSFERS

We are able to organise transport for boarders to and from UK airports (e.g. London Gatwick or London Heathrow). Whenever possible the transport costs are shared between those travelling. We will also provide transport to other airports, if necessary. However, please bear in mind that travelling to or from other UK airports (e.g. Luton, Stansted) may incur an expensive taxi fare. Transport charges will be included on the School bill issued at the end of each term.

Your early provision in writing of flight details/e-tickets and any other requests for transport is essential. Please note that we wish to receive flight details **four weeks** prior to your daughter's departure date.

Parents are expected to make all flight bookings to coincide with the School's academic term dates, details of which can be found on the School website www.mayfieldgirls.org. In exceptional circumstances only, requests for authorised absence should be made in advance and in writing to the relevant Head of School using the 'Request during term time absence from School Form' which can be downloaded from the School website.

LUGGAGE

Please ensure that your daughter keeps her luggage to within the airline allowance (usually 20kg for economy class). It is essential that you check this carefully with the relevant airline.

WEEKEND LONDON BUS SERVICE

Mrs Attoe arranges transport by School minibus or an escorted executive coach to and from Central London. We use coaches at the beginning and end of term. During term time, a School minibus and driver is used. Girls book places on these coaches through their Housemistress, with a deadline of three days prior to travel. Costs for the academic year 2021-22 will be £22.00 for a single journey and are charged to your account.

Please be aware that the coach cannot wait beyond the given departure time due to parking restrictions.

POSTING PARCELS AND LETTERS

The School Office will post letters for the girls. Please take your envelope with the address written clearly to the office to be franked. The cost will be added to the School bill. Girls can also go to the Post Office at the weekend or with permission from the Housemistress, to post larger items or to withdraw money.
