

**What is the Miree Center?**

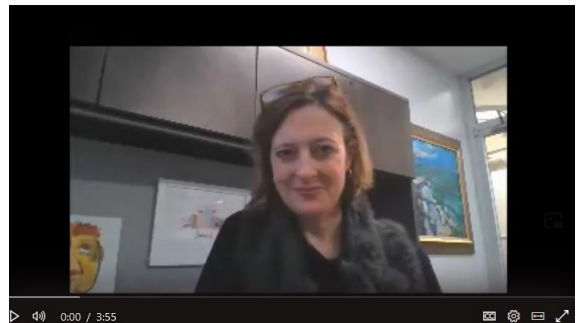

**LEADERSHIP PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS**



- Willingness to design, execute, assess and redesign a project.
- Monthly meetings
- Approximately 30 minute to 1 hour a week of planning or project management
- 20 hours of community service each year (summer and project work counts)
- 3 cultural events/year
- A project defense at the end of junior year

**SERVICE CORPS**

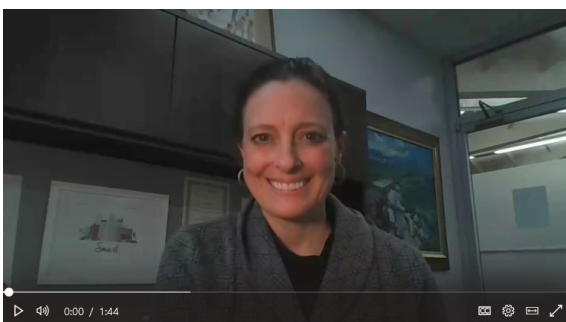


- Hub for all community service

Requirements for Heritage Panel:

- Two days of diversity and communication training
- Participate in panels, approximately one per month
- Faculty moderators are always present during panel discussions

**MIREE STUDENT ADVISORY BOARD**



- Oversees programming for the four Miree Pillar Programs
- Meets weekly to assess program needs, progress, and alignment with core values and culture
- Hosts speakers, workshops, and retreats
- Recognizes “everyday” leadership within the school community
