

PMA Values For Reopening Schools Safely

These core values have guided the work PMA administration, faculty/staff, and coaches to ensure a smooth and safe 2021-22 school year for each student:

- Follow California Department of Public Health Orders
- Maintain an inclusive and caring supportive school culture
- Establish systematic protocols for health and safety
- Timely, frequent communication and transparency

Face Coverings

- PMA will <u>require the use of facial coverings</u> for all students, teachers, staff and visitors in accordance with LA County Department of Public Health guidelines currently in effect.
- Face masks or face coverings will be mandatory when on campus indoors and are strongly encouraged outdoors.
- Visual reminders regarding the proper use of face masks are posted around campus

Hand Hygiene

- Staff and students will be encouraged to properly wash hands often and use hand sanitizer.
- Every classroom and common areas (office, library, etc...) will be provided with hand sanitizer that complies with CDC and Public Health guidelines.
- Visual reminders are in place around the campus.

Covid-19 Protocols

Student Check in Procedures:

- Pre-screening questions of symptoms should be done at home before coming to campus.
 - Fever over 100.4
 - Chills, Cough, or difficulty breathing
 - Shortness of breath
 - Persistent headaches
 - Sore throat
 - Recent loss of taste or smell
 - Been exposed to someone who has tested positive for Covid-19

Covid-19 Protocols

Testing Protocols

- **Testing Tuesdays** starting on August 17th
 - Students can tests as early as 7:30am every Tuesday
- Students can opt out of testing by submitting the original vaccine card to the main office. The main office will make copies of the vaccine card and students can by the end of the day.

Attendance (Absence Procedures)

- Parents/Guardians must call the attendance office between 7:30 am and 8:30 am each day the student is absent.
- Upon returning to school after an absence, the student must bring a note from parent or a doctor's note to the Attendance office.

Attendance (Absence Note Content)

- Student's name and grade
- Date(s) of absence
- The explicit reason for absence
- The signature of the parent/guardian and the phone number(s) at which parent/guardian may be contacted during the school day.
- Upon receiving the note, the attendance office will then excuse the absence, otherwise it will remain unexcused.

Types of Absences (Excused vs. Unexcused)

Excused Absences

- Illness*
- Medical/Dental appointments*
- Funerals
- Quarantine
- Court appearances*
- Approved school activities (ie. retreats, sporting events, school sponsored field trips)

*Must provide official doctor/court documentation

Unexcused Absences

- No doctor's/court note upon return to school
- Vacation
- Outside organization sports teams

Student Checkout Process (Main Office)

Step 1 Notify Main Office

- Parent note submitted before 7:50am
 - Student released when indicated on note
- Parent phone call to main office
 - Student will be called down upon parent arrival

Step 2: Sign Out Student

- PMA will release student to Parent/Guardian or any of the 3 emergency contacts
- All parents/guardians and emergency contacts MUST provide a photo ID to check out students

 Black Pants (Slacks), White Oxford Shirt, Tie, Vest or Pullover Sweater, Black socks, Black dress shoes.



Reminders: Schedule (21-22)

Class Schedules Finalized - August 1, 2021

- Students received a notification on their College and Career Google Classroom indicating that schedules have been finalized and are available to access through Powerschool.
- Schedule changes will take place from August 2nd 13th, 2021. To request a schedule change students must complete the Schedule Change Request Form (posted on their College & Career Google Classroom)
- Approval of schedule change request is dependent upon section capacities and course availability.

Google Classroom: Guardian Summaries

As a guardian, you can get email summaries about your student's activity in Classroom. Email summaries do not include grades. For grades check Powerschool.

In email summaries, you can review:


- Missing work—Work not turned in when the summary was sent.
- Upcoming work—Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails)
 or that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails).
- Class activities—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers.

Google Classroom: Get Guardian Summaries

To get email summaries of your student's work, you must accept an email invitation from a teacher or administrator. You have 120 days to accept an invitation before it expires. You can unsubscribe from summaries or remove yourself as a guardian at any time.

- 1. The teacher or administrator emails you an invitation to join your student's class.
- 2. In your email program, open your email invitation.
- 3. Click **Accept**. If you're not the guardian, click **I'm Not The Guardian**.
- 4. Click **Accept** to confirm.

When you accept an invitation, you and your student get an email confirmation.
