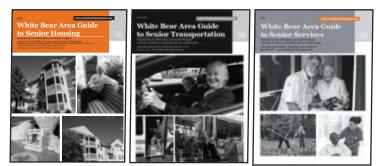

Do you have any favorite hobbies that you enjoy

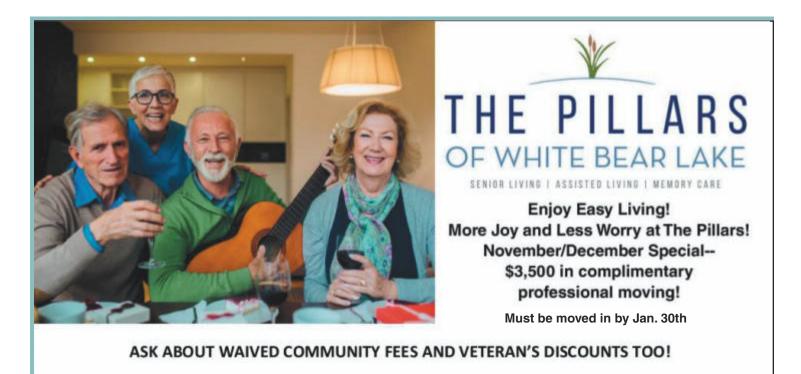
I like growing flowers. I like wood working and cabinet making. I also like ice skating, which I had never tried until I was over 30.

On the internet is the simple answer. I think it woul<u>d</u> be much more fun if I said that I broke two different pairs and glued them together.



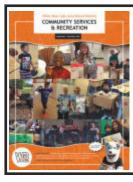
