ADMINISTRATIVE APPOINTMENTS

Appointment of Executive Director of Elementary Teaching and Learning

We are recommending the appointment of Cory Heitsch as the Executive Director for Elementary Teaching and Learning. He spent the previous eight years as an elementary principal with the South Lyon Community School district at Sharon J. Hardy Elementary. Hardy Elementary School includes nearly 700 students with over 50 staff members, Hardy Elementary also houses the district's self-contained special education programs and was home to one of South Lyon's first Junior Kindergarten classrooms last year. Prior to his time in South Lyon, Cory was an elementary teacher in Walled Lake Schools and the varsity men's basketball coach at Novi High School.

Mr. Heitsch received a Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education from Alma College, a Masters of Science in Education Leadership from Concordia University, a post-Masters certificate in Central Officer Administration from Oakland University and is a doctoral student in Educational Leadership at Oakland University.

Appointment of Assistant Principal at Adams High School

We are recommending the appointment of Luke Swanson as new Assistant Principal at Adams High School. Luke comes to RCS from the Plymouth Canton Community Schools (PCCS), where he has served as an Assistant Principal of Activities and Athletics since 2016. He taught social studies, served as Activities Director and Assistant Varsity Basketball Coach for six years before taking the AP/AD position. He holds a Bachelor's Degree Social Sciences and Education as well as a Masters of Arts degree in Educational Technology from Michigan State University. Luke completed the K-12 Educational Administration Certification through the Michigan Association of Secondary School Principals. He is also highly trained in restorative practices, and in equity and inclusion.

Baldwin Principal Position

We received 77 applications for the Elementary Principal position. After the extensive interview process we are happy to recommend Marco Marando to the Baldwin Elementary principal position. Mr. Marando holds a Masters in Education from Saginaw Valley University. Marco Marando is currently serving as principal in the Northville School District at Amerman Elementary. He has been in this position for three years. Prior to his administrative experience in Northville, Marco was an elementary principal in Taylor Public Schools for one year. He was a 5th grade in the Lamphere School District for five years, he taught for one year at the Allen Academy in Detroit as well.

Marco was a Teacher Leader in Cultures of Thinking and Leader in Me and attended the Galileo Leadership Academy while teaching in Lamphere School District and also attended the Oakland Aspiring Principals Academy. His current school, Amerman Elementary was nominated as a 2019 National Blue Ribbon Exemplary School and he serves on a committee at Oakland University participating in developing the education program, helping to update courses to current practice.
