Message from SPS Leadership Team

October 30, 2020

Dear Scarborough Students, Staff and Families,

The events of this week have been cause for much reflection and learning. We want you to know that we are fully committed to creating school cultures where conversations about equity, race and inclusivity are the norm, not the exception. Our most important job as a school district right now is to create safe space to talk about what this means in our schools and our community. We must listen first, so that any actions taken have lasting and meaningful impact. In addition, we believe that it is not "good enough" to say we support those who are brave and standing up to racism and inequity; we must also be the ones modeling this for the community we serve each day and demonstrate that with the actions we take moving forward.

Currently, leaders from across the district are learning alongside over 40 other K-12 Scarborough Public Schools staff in a Cultural Competency Institute, a year long PD series with over 300 educators across Maine. The series of workshops are facilitated by Lawrence Alexander, Carney Sandoe and Associates from the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Practice Group. Scarborough Public Schools are also taking part with several other districts in the Equity and Excellence Community of Practice Group through the University of Southern Maine. We also acknowledge how challenging it can be to talk about race, class, gender, political affiliation, sexual orientation, age, religion, ability or any other kind of identity. At the September Cultural Competency Institute session, a powerful Ted Talk, "Danger of a Single Story" was shared, and we'd encourage you to take a few minutes to watch it as well.

We recognize these steps are just the starting point and foundation for this critical work. We invite you to become more involved, and we are committed to creating brave and safe spaces for these conversations to occur. At the November 5 School Board meeting, the Board will be scheduling a future workshop which will invite administration, staff, and students to come together to develop an action plan to pursue our goal of drafting a resolution ensuring Scarborough Public Schools is both safe and inclusive for all students and staff.

We look forward to embracing this work with the Scarborough community.


begins on November 9 for students in Grades 6-12, and Trimester 2 begins on December 14 for students in grades K-5.




Health & Safety
