Dear Friends,

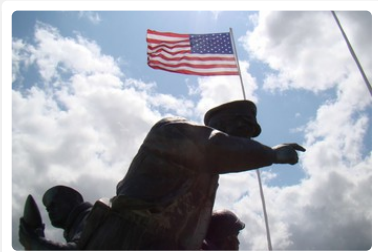
This week it was good news to hear that Maine recorded the lowest number of COVID-19 cases since last fall. In addition, over seventy percent of Maine residents of twelve years old or older have had at least one dose. We continue to be eager to have all our students return to their classrooms full time in the fall.



The other positive news is we are progressing along well with our proposed FY22 school budget. At the recent Town Council special meeting the council members unanimously approved the FY22 Municipal Budget. The school portion of the budget is unchanged from the proposal adopted by the Board of Education at their second reading on May 20, 2021. As a reminder the School Budget requires a referendum election. Please note the voting of this will take place on **June 15, 2021** at Scarborough High School - we need and appreciate your support to ensure that we have the resources to serve our students in the coming school year. Spring Assessment Information

This year, we made several appeals to Maine's Department of Education seeking a waiver from the state testing requirement. **The third and final appeal was made directly to the Commissioner of Education in March and was denied.**



As the assessments themselves are new and the accountability and reporting will look different (they will not be used or reported publicly as they have been in the past, per DOE communication as they currently are seeking a federal waiver for accountability). ***Please know that in any case, we will not be using the state assessment data to make instructional or program decisions.*** In fact, the MEA Science assessment is an operational field test with no items available from which students can practice other than to learn how to navigate the online assessment.

We will continue to use the i-Ready Diagnostic data this spring to assess growth from fall to spring and identify areas for curriculum improvements for reading and math. As there is overlap with both the state test and i-Ready, we will analyze and compare data from both to determine assessment planning for next year. We are quite concerned about over testing our students both this spring and next year.

Final Week of 2020-2021 School Year

The last day of the 2020-2021 is currently slated for Friday, June 18, 2021.

- Cohort A will turn in devices on their last day on June 15. There will not be remote instruction June 16- 18.

- Cohort C will be complete on June 18. Families should return devices to their respective school.
- Cohort D students may follow their individualized schedules through June 18.
- ESY or summer academy students will keep their current device.

Most Common Symptoms of Covid 19:

Cough
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

Chills
Sore throat
New loss of taste or smell


Less Common Symptoms:

Muscle pain
Nausea or Vomiting
Diarrhea
Fatigue
Headache
Congestion/runny nose

*Fever is 100.4°F/ 38°C regardless of measurement location (oral, temporal).

Stay home with any YES response to the questions above OR with two or more of the "less common" symptoms listed to the right.

Affend school when all answers are NO and your child is feeling well with no other symptoms of illness. Call or see your school nurse or other designated person at school if you have questions.
