

FAQ's

How will my 6th grader know what to do on the first day?

To help ease the transition to middle school and introduce our incoming 6th graders to Evergreen, we will have a staggered start on the first day of school. 6th graders will start at the usual time of 8:25 and will participate in Welcome to Evergreen activities designed specifically for them. They will tour the school, meet their teachers, find their Where Everybody Belongs (WEB) group and enjoy activities to get to know each other. During this time, your student will also be able to ask questions and meet other students. Our 6th grade orientation helps students learn about being an Evergreen Eagle and feel more at ease about their first day of middle school.

What about my 7th or 8th grader on the first day?

7th and 8th graders will begin school at 10:55. Buses will pick students up 2.5 hours later than their originally scheduled time. They will have lunch and meet with all 6 class periods, each lasting approximately 30 minutes.

How do I report my student absent?

What if my student is late?

Students must sign in through the main office when they arrive. A parent/guardian can either email the attendance office or call the absentee line at 425-936-2321 to report absences.

Students do not need to bring in a note to have an absence excused. The school will determine if the late arrival is excused or unexcused based on the information given by the parent/guardian.

What if my student needs to leave early?

Parents/guardians must either email the attendance office on the day their student needs to be released early or call the absentee line at (425) 936-2321. The following information should be provided in email or by phone, (student first and last name, early dismissal time, and reason for early dismissal). Students do not need to bring in a note for early dismissal. The school will determine if the missed classes are excused or unexcused based on information given by the parent/guardian.
