Student-led UNESCO projects in the Elementary Division deepen and reinforce academic work and apply knowledge to the real world using UNESCO's key themes of study:

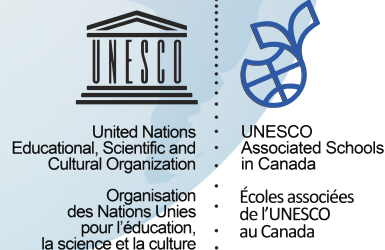
- Intercultural learning
