

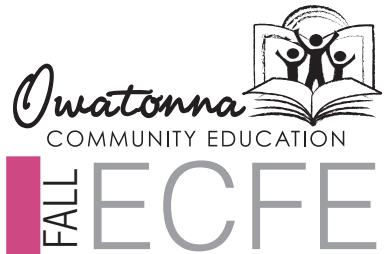

Fall Trimester REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- Families may register for one parent/child class per child. Register by phone, online or in person.
- Please have both a 1st and 2nd choice for classes.

- If you need child care for siblings during your ECFE class, please request at the time of registration. Children not registered will be accepted on a space available basis.

Roosevelt Community School has been outfitted with an air purifying device called needle-point bi-polar ionization in our ductwork work. This device reduces pathogens, allergens, particles, smoke and odors in the air, creating a healthy environment without producing any harmful byproducts. Every 30-minutes, indoor pollutants such as flu virus (inclusive of COVID-19), allergens and mold are reduced by 99.4%. While there are no 100% guarantees in time of pandemic, this new technology has allowed us to add another layer of protection for your family's health with in-person programming. Masks are recommended.

Mixed Preschoolers 31+ MONTHS TO “NOT YET IN KINDERGARTEN”

Every member of a family brings unique strengths that help build and strengthen the family unit. Intentional parents notice and support each family member's efforts to grow and develop all aspects of the individual; cognitive, physical, emotional, social, moral, and spiritual. Parents will learn how to be intentional in their everyday interaction with their children. Content of the class will be parent driven to support the parenting journey. Come share your ideas and strategies to see each member of your family uniquely and help them develop into strong, healthy members of your family and your community. A child/parent experience with an early childhood educator begins the first 20 minutes of class before separating for parent discussion. This class is open to families with children ages 31 months to not yet in kindergarten.

Preschool Experience (Ages 3-5) CHILD-ONLY CLASSES

Families who enroll in identified parent/child classes, have the opportunity to provide their child with an additional early learning experience designed for the child-only.

Ages 3-5: **34551** Fridays - 8:30-10:00 am, Room 122

Ages 3-5: **34552** Fridays -10:30-Noon, Room 122

To be eligible for enrollment in **Friday Child Only Classes**, families must be enrolled in any of the following parent/child classes: **34511 - 34521 - 34531 - 34541**

Children may only attend this class if they have attended their parent/child class each week. If a family misses their parent/child class during the week, the child will not be expected for the Friday, child-only class. Families may have one exception per trimester to this practice if they have called in for the Parent/Child class with an illness or medical appointment. Tuition will be \$35 for the Trimester. This is in addition to the tuition paid for the parent/child class. There is no sliding fee. **Child must be 3 years old by September 1st.**

Registration will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. Families will need to re-enroll for the child-only class each trimester when they enroll for their parent/child class. Class size will be limited in each section.

Early Childhood Screening FOR 3 AND 4 YEAR-OLDS

Early childhood screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is learning and growing. It identifies possible health or learning concerns so children can get help before starting school.

Is there a charge? IT'S FREE – all children must participate in order to start Kindergarten in a Minnesota Public School.

When should I schedule an appointment for Early Childhood Screening? Earlier is better! Waiting until your child is about to start kindergarten is too late! The purpose of Early Childhood Screening is to identify children who may need additional time and experiences to be ready for school. The sooner we get started, the more likely your child will begin school with the necessary skills to succeed. Call us when your child turns 3.

Preschool Opportunities

Owatonna Community Education offers play based preschool programming for three and four year olds. 'Lil Learners and Bright Beginnings exist to provide all age eligible children adequate opportunities to participate in child development programs that enable the children to enter school with the necessary skills and behavior and family stability and support to progress and flourish. Our programs are staffed with licensed early childhood educators and focus on the whole child. Lessons are designed to promote growth in all areas of development.

(Applications for both programs are available by calling or stopping at Roosevelt Community School, or going online.)

'Lil Learners Preschool is for children 3 years of age by September 1, 2021. Two and Three days per week with morning and afternoon options are available. 'Lil Learners is run through our ECFE program and offers a sliding fee schedule to families.

Bright Beginnings Preschool is for children 4 years of age by September 1, 2021. Four and five days per week with morning and afternoon options are available. There is no charge for our four year old classes.

Sib Care

How Does Sib Care Work? Sib Care is quality, on-site childcare for siblings' age birth to 9-years-old. **Sibcare costs \$5 per family, per trimester.** Service must be pre-registered and paid before the trimester start. Service is limited due to size of classroom and available staffing. To make this service cost effective, we ask families to enroll for Sib Care only if they actually need the service. Families not attending Sib Care the first week of class and not calling in their absence will be dropped from the service. **The \$5 fee is non-refundable. Absences from Sib Care can be called into the ECFE Attendance Line: 444-7937** The ECFE Attendance Line is a 24-hour voice messaging system. Sib Care is available for all classes unless noted.

ECFE Parent/Child Class Fee Structure

The class fee is based on your household’s total yearly income, before taxes. The class fee selected by your family is confidential. Class fees are necessary to supplement state and local tax dollars dedicated to supporting early childhood programming.

Your household’s total yearly income, before taxes:

Less than \$19,999 per yr	\$10.00 per class
\$20,000 to \$29,999 per yr	\$15.00 per class
\$30,000 to \$39,999 per yr	\$20.00 per class
\$40,000 to \$49,999 per yr	\$25.00 per class
\$50,000 and greater	\$30.00 per class

Sibcare — \$5.00/trimester/family (*non-refundable*)

Non-School District Resident Fee — \$10.00 additional per class

**Families with SCHA Health policies may qualify for class reimbursement.*

Immunization Law

Minnesota law (statute 121A.15) requires children enrolling in early education programs to show they have received immunizations or that they are a conscientious objector. The Owatonna ECFE program will require an immunization on file for every child that is enrolled. Please drop off or send a current immunization to Roosevelt Community School before classes begin or bring immunization records with you to the first day of class. Thank you.

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COVID RESPONSE INFORMATION

Our ECFE team joins ISD 761 colleagues in our commitment to keep families safe. More information about COVID-19 mitigation strategies will be shared in our first class of the trimester, here are key elements that will go into effect immediately:

Health and Safety Protocols

The Safe Learning Plan that was in place last school year has expired. COVID-19 cleaning protocols will remain in place across Owatonna Public Schools, but several of the requirements that were in place due to COVID-19 are no longer in effect. For example:

- Face coverings for all students and staff will be recommended (not required).
- Isolation time for students or staff who contract COVID-19 is 10 days with no testing requirement to return to school.

Recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control will be reviewed on an ongoing basis, and a full list of health and safety guidance will be shared with students and families as the school year gets closer or as conditions change.

One area that face coverings continue to be required is on public transportation. Until September 13, the U. S. Transportation Security Administration is requiring face coverings across all transportation networks throughout the country, including airports and on board commercial aircraft, railways and buses. This includes school buses. Every student and adult who rides on the bus will need to wear a face covering.
