IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

BOOKS, COMPUTERS AND SUPPLIES:

Students are provided necessary textbooks for use while enrolled at HIS. Most school supplies are also provided. Below are items required from home:

All grade levels:

- Students should bring a backpack and a water bottle labeled with their names.
- Students need to wear appropriate shoes for PE and outdoor activities (no flip flops or sandals)

Early Years through Grade 5: students need to bring a healthy daily snack from home.

Early Years through Kindergarten: students need to supply a clearly labeled change of clothes in case of accidents on the first day of class. All students must be toilet trained.

Early Years through Pre-Kindergarten: students need to supply a blanket/small pillow for naptime.

Upper School Required School Supplies:

- Scientific Calculator (for students in grades 6-9)
- Graphing Calculator TI 84 Plus CE (for grades 10-12)
- Pencil bag/case
- Ball point pens- black and/or blue ink (6pcs)
- Pencils (10pcs)
- Eraser
- Highlighters (4pcs)
- Small pencil sharpener
- Post-it notes
- Plastic ruler 30cm
- MacBook with minimum 256 GB SDD/HD, less than four years old

SCHOOL UNIFORMS:

HIS students adhere to a dress code, which we believe promotes a sense of orderliness and school community, and helps with campus and field trip security.

We aim to have students wearing similar, if not identical, outfits that create a feeling of community and avoid clothes conscious social situations. All students are required to wear a school uniform.

One uniform and PE set is included in the tuition. Additional uniform items and dragon spirit merchandise may be purchased in the Dragon Shop. Please ensure your child is in full uniform from the first day of school. See the Parent and Student Handbook for full details: https://www.his-china.org/learn/overview

All students should wear sensible shoes (laced shoes or sturdy sandals). Accessories are permitted as long as that are not expensive or likely to be dangerous.

UNIFORM PICKUP AND PURCHASE:

Parents can place an order with Nancy in the Dragon Shop (dragonshop@his-china.org) by email or by calling the school directly (Tel# 8669-0045 X109) during office hours (Monday-Friday 7:45am - 11:30am and 12:30pm -4:30pm).

Also parents may make an appointment to go to the Dragon Shop between 3:30 pm - 4:30 pm when the regular school day is over.

Older students may come to the Dragon Shop to select sizes and purchase uniforms if they have time before or after school during open hours.

Payment may be made through AliPay or by giving students cash.

You can choose from the following options to receive uniform orders:

- I. Give items directly to students
- 2. Wait for pickup at the school gate

3. Deliver home 12RMB pay on delivery fee.





IMPORTANT SCHOOL INFORMATION

HIS STUDENT AND PARENT HANDBOOK:

Handbooks are written for Upper and Lower School Divisions. You can access both in our website.

CAMPUS SCHEDULE:

Until further notice please see the below entrance and exit times for the school day.

GRADES 6 - 12 BACK GATE Arrive between 7:30am and 8:00am Leave at 3:00pm

GRADES 2 - 5 FRONT GATE Arrive between 7:30am and 8:00am Leave at 3.00pm

EARLY YEARS - GRADE | FRONT GATE Arrive between 7:45am and 8:15am Leave at 3:15pm

All students arriving five or more minutes late must check in with the secretary.

During the COVID-19 time period, students can be picked up outside of the gates at the end of the school day according to the campus schedule. Lower School students may exit through the front gate and Upper School students may exit through the back gate. If there are multiple siblings across divisions, they may enter and exit through the same gate if they are together.

SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION:

If you have contracted school bus transportation, please make sure we have your current address and you have received confirmation of your child's bus number and schedule. **Contact: transportation@his-china.org.**

DROP OFF IN THE MORNINGS:

If you are walking your child to school, please drop off your child at the gate and they can enter on foot through the front or back gate.

*Note at the time of this publication parents are not permitted on campus without an appointment.

Note that vehicles dropping students off can do so outside of the gates. Cars need to be parked as permitted by the traffic police and never block the flow of traffic on the street. Failure to comply may result in but not be limited to loss of parking and drop off privileges within the immediate vicinity of the school.

HIS ID CARDS :

During the COVID-19 time period, adults are still requiered to wear their Parent ID badge, for identification purposes. Please provide the office with a photo for your ID card. We greatly appreciate your respect and support our security measures as we work to ensure the safest possible learning environment for your children. https://www.his-china.org/join/id-card

In addition, Upper School students are required to present their ID cards when checking out materials, printing or using library resources.

SICKNESS:

If your child is sick and cannot come to school please advise the main office by calling or emailing the secretary and teacher.

MONITORING YOUR CHILD'S HEALTH :

It is important that you pay particular attention to your child's health at this time and ensure that your child does not come to school when they are sick. While we know that young children become ill regularly and for a variety of reasons, we are currently obliged to lockdown any class/grade level on the discovery of a fever, and/or other COVID-19 symptoms at school. If you suspect that your child may have a fever, please double-check their temperature with a mercury thermometer as follows:

- Lightly press the tip of the thermometer into the center of the armpit.
- Hold your child's arm, close against the body so the thermometer stays in place.
- Wait for the thermometer to take its reading. This will take about 5 minutes.
- Remove the thermometer from the armpit and read the temperature.
- Clean the thermometer and store for its next use.

Any fever measured by infrared handheld forehead thermometer should be considered only reliable under good operating conditions. Please only report a fever if measured under arm by mercury thermometer three times in one hour (1st measure 37.3 or higher, 2nd measure 37.3 or higher after 30 mins, 3rd measure 37.3 or higher after one hour). In this situation, please keep your child at home and take them to fever clinic on your own or as advised by the school nurse.



BIRTHDAY PARTIES IN THE LOWER SCHOOL :

Birthday celebrations may be held in addition to classroom parties but are restricted to no more than 30 minutes.

Invitations to private birthday parties may be distributed at school only if all children in the class are to be invited. The giving of gifts is prohibited, including goodie-bags or party favors. Birthday cakes should not be brought to school. Please do not send birthday cake or other treats in. Don't worry, teachers will do their best to make the day special for your child.

TRANSITIONS

Hangzhou International School is committed to supporting students, parents, and staff with mobility within and between schools. We are sensitive to the difficulties faced by our school community during transitions. We endeavor to support all members of our community to ensure that they arrive, orient, integrate, and depart well.



We are partners with SPAN (Safe Passages Across Networks), FIGT (Families in Global Transition), and Globally Grounded, who guide our organization and procedures relating to transitions. These organizations create a network between international schools to address the emotional issues and needs of individuals. People learn best when they are safe and emotional support extends from within schools to between schools. As such, Hangzhou International School is one of the first three pre-pilot schools to participate in becoming a certified Safe Passage School.

The key to a good arrival is a good departure, no matter where you go in the world.



Safe Passage Across Networks at HIS

The HIS community, students, parents, and faculty have participated in on-site transitions workshops with Douglas Ota and worked through a book study of his book, *Safe Passage*. It provides information about students, teachers, and community members' roles in arriving, staying, and leaving international communities. "Moving is one of life's greatest challenges."

Firmly grounded in psychological theory and cutting-edge neuroscience, Safe Passage maps the challenges and charts a course for individuals, schools, and accrediting bodies to navigate them. Although primarily focusing on international schools, the hopeful message within this book reaches into any school, university, or organization where human beings come and go.

We encourage you to read this book, which is available at the HIS library to borrow.




SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

FIELD TRIPS

Field trips help strengthen classroom curriculum and bring classroom lessons to life. Such trips provide students with the opportunity to visualize, expirience, and discuss lessons from the classroom.

Lower School students may go on field trips throughout the year. Depending on the trip, students may be asked to pay for all or a part of the expenses.

If a class is going on a field trip and you elect not to send your child, then your child will need to stay home for the day.

The Upper School organizes overnight trips for every grade level. Generally, the trips last from four to five days. These trips are part of the curriculum and attendance is mandatory.

Hangzhou International School belongs to a variety of conferences and leagues that provide many opportunities for competitive sports for Middle and High School students: Hangzhou International Schools Athletic Conference (HISAC), Shanghai International Schools Athletic Conference (SISAC) league, Association of China and Mongolia International Schools (ACAMIS) tournaments, China International Schools Sports Association (CISSA) and Shanghai Swim League.

Sporting opportunities include: Volleyball, Basketball, Touch Rugby, Soccer, Swimming, Cross Country, Track & Field, Floor Hockey, Badminton, Table Tennis, and Ultimate Frisbee.

















IB CONTINUUM

WELCOME TO THE IB PROGRAMME:

At Hangzhou International School, we are excited about incorporating the International Baccalaureate Programmes in the community. From Early Years to Grade 12, our students are taking part in inquiry learning, applied approaches, and contextualized experiences that will improve their understanding of content.

The International Baccalaureate is a program that is recognized around the world, which supports our students as they transition into and out of other programs. Universities recognize the rigorous assessment methods and content that Diploma Programme (DP) students are able to undertake in Grades II and I2, while they appreciate the learning skills and techniques that students in Grades 6-10 develop through the Middle Years Programme (MYP). Lower School students inquire and gain new perspectives through the Primary Years Programme (PYP), using a variety of learning methods to achieve strong skills and understanding.


The IB Diploma Programme is an academically challenging university prep program that encourages student growth physically, intellectually, emotionally, and ethically. With six subject areas covered in regular classes, students also take part in Theory of Knowledge courses, Creativity, Activity, and Service elements (CAS), and write an Extended Essay by the time they finish the program in 12th grade. The external assessment practices ensure that there is validity and recognition extended to the students. For 2021 the HIS average IB score is 37; well above the world average of 29-30. **The Middle Years Programmes** are for all students in grades 6-10. The MYP curriculum framework has eight subject groups that encourage students to make practical connections between their studies and the real world. Using the MYP assessment criteria, teachers are able to provide effective feedback for student development. With an emphasis on skills-based learning and reflection, students have ample opportunities for growth and development throughout the program.

The Primary Years Programme carries on the HIS traditions for inquiry learning and student development. Through six transdisciplinary themes of global significance, students learn how to take control of their own learning, and the school-wide community contributes to the learning process. They have a chance to explore and understand local and global issues as they relate to their own lives.

The IB Continuum provides quality training and oversight for faculty and our school in general. Through collaboration, the teachers gain understanding, skills, and knowledge that help them effectively meet the needs of the HIS students.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES:

Student Support Services has some delightful surprises and updates for you this school year. The Student Support Office is located in B009 (through the library). In this space, you will find two study spaces designed for students across both Lower and Upper School divisions. Under the leadership of our Director of Student Support Services, Nada Werner, we are expanding our program to meet the needs of all learners including additional Learning Support and ESOL teachers and an additional School Psychologist. The department now consists of two school psychologist/ counselors, learning specialists, a speech pathologist, and ESOL support teachers.

LEARNING SUPPORT PROGRAM:

Our learning specialists work closely with students, teachers, and parents to clarify what support students may need in order to achieve their full potential. At times, support might mean finding ways to incorporate classroom strategies that benefit all students. Occasionally, a group of students might need a mini-lesson on "how to convert fractions" using a scaffolded approach, or another small group might work on developing reading fluency by attending to pace and expression. Student Support Services works with Lower School students in all academic areas, aligns service learning opportunities for Lower School students, and coordinates additional services for meaningful cohesion. In the Upper School, Student Support Services consults with faculty members, provides direct support for students in the classroom, and offers after-school tutoring. Teachers and parents can refer students to the learning support program at HIS. Our aim is to optimize learning opportunities for students so they can successfully pursue personal and academic excellence within a caring community.

COUNSELING AND SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS:

Some students benefit from meeting with a counselor as difficulties arise, whereas others need more ongoing support. Additionally, in order to meet the socialemotional needs of all students, classroom counseling lessons are a proactive way to directly teach the skills needed to develop friendships, cope with stress, handle conflict, and deal with other challenges that may arise at school.

Ryan Bull-Beddows is the Upper School Guidance and College Counselor to HIS as well as being a School Psychologist. Dr. Bull-Beddows is available to support students in Upper School with social, emotional, behavioral, or academic needs. Depending on the specific area of need, he can provide individual and group counseling, cognitive and academic assessments, parent consultation, and support within the classroom. Lora Lee is the Lower School School Psychologist and Counselor. She is also available to work with students individually or with groups as well as providing cognitive and academic assessments.







SPEECH LANGUAGE SPECIALISTS:

We are also fortunate to have a speech language specialist available here at Hangzhou International School. Kylie Willoughby can support students with gaining fluency in the English language as related to phonetic pronunciation. Ms. Willoughby supports students who struggle with speech or language issues, no matter what their home language might be.

Ms. Willoughby has particular expertise in the areas of:

- Articulation recognizing placement, voiced/voiceless, carry-over
- Fluency speech rate, reading and conversational fluency
- Language Acquisition building vocabulary, behaviors associated with learning profiles, self-regulation, and emotions.

ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL):

At HIS, we recognize that all teachers are language teachers who have the responsibility to facilitate language acquisition and promote communication skills through their grade level and content area classes. In the Lower School, ESOL students who are unable to fully access the academic curriculum receive specialized instruction in English. Our ESOL staff will work directly with lower school and upperschool students and collaborate with faculty members to provide differentiated instruction for our all language learners.

Note: Annual fees for the Learning Support Program are based on the hours of weekly support a child receives to advance educational attainment and/or receive speech-language therapy.

UNIVERSITY GUIDANCE:

All Upper School students will have the opportunity to participate in several college presentations and fairs. These presentations and fairs offer students the unique chance to learn about the university admission process and all the great programming offered at universities around the world. Students can ask representatives questions to gain deeper insight and share their contact information with representatives to establish relationships.

Additionally, HIS will continue our partnership with other international schools in the vicinity to host and attend larger college and university fairs.

AN INTRODUCTION TO "BRIDGEU" UNIVERSITY & CAREER GUIDANCE:



BridgeU is an interactive college and career guidance tool. Students in Grades 9 through 12 will have access to this user friendly web-based platform. All high school students will receive direct guidance on using this tool in the Fall of 2021. BridgeU offers several tools which allow students to identify interests, research different careers, explore universities, and develop a deeper understanding of the university application process.

BridgeU's Profile Builder provides students with a list of universities that are specifically tailored for them. This portion of the site uses student's projected scores, countries of interests, and other components to suggest reach, match, and safety schools. Students are able to select from a list of countries including Hong Kong, Netherlands, Canada, United States, United Kingdom, and Australia. BridgeU will continue to offer a more extensive list of universities around the world.

Students can access the Shortlist feature once they review their university matches. The Shortlist section of the website is where students store their preferred universities. In the Fall of Grade 12, students will have access to their personalized shortlist and decide on the final list of universities they wish apply to that semester. Students can also research and save notes for each university.

In addition, the Writing Builder section supports students with writing personal statements. Students are able to draft

their personal statement and have advisors here at school provide guidance. There are helpful exemplar essays written by students who were admitted to renowned institutions. These helpful exemplars are annotated to ensure that students understand the reasoning behind the evaluation of the essay.

Of all the features this platform offers, the applications section is the most important. Universities and courses marked for applications are saved in this section. Students can view a snapshot of all the universities they have added to their final application list. Application deadlines and required documents are all stored in this centralized location. Students are able to add and remove universities if they change their minds.

Hangzhou International School will use BridgeU to guide students through the application process. In addition, we will use this site to assign tasks to students to ensure they meet applications deadlines, collect and store reference letters, and send necessary documents to universities.

Overall, BridgeU is an outstanding tool that will support all students in the college planning process. We are excited to launch BridgeU and look forward to having our students explore the site first-hand.




