- *5 8 is ideal*
- Safety Schools Your test scores and GPA exceed the minimum requirements
- **Fit/Match** Your test scores and GPA are within the required standards
- **Dream/Reach** Your test scores are at the tail end or don't meet the minimum requirements

JUNIOR YEAR CHECKLIST

SPRING SEMESTER

- Take SAT/ACT in March, April, May, or June
- Register for senior year carefully, review post secondary admissions requirements
- Visit college campuses (or participate in virtual rep visits & tours)
- Participate in summer programs in your area of interest
- Before summer break, request (2) teacher letters of recommendations and if required (1) counselor letter

APPLICATION TYPES

- <u>Rolling Admission</u>: NO application deadline. Ongoing decisions are made all throughout the year. Priority given to those applying early. Can depend on major.
- <u>Early Action</u>: (non-binding) typically apps due in November, recommended. Decisions mid January
- Early Decision: BINDING! Can only apply early DECISION to ONE college. Application deadline is usually November 1st or Nov. 15^{th.} You may apply to other colleges under Early Action. YOU MUST COMMIT TO COLLEGE ONCE ACCEPTED!!! Sometimes there is an advantage with admissions decisions & financial aid when applying early decision
- <u>Regular Decision</u>: Deadline usually January 1st Decisions released April 1st.
 Students have till May 1st to commit

Colleges will utilize your email address to communicate with you regarding your application. Check your email and save your application login info- username & password

RECOMMENDATION LETTERS

Letter of Recommendation (LOR) - Teacher

- Ask early. Teacher should have 3 weeks to write letter.
- Log into Naviance College tab Apply LOR
- Select Teacher & Add Request
- Complete Teacher Rec Letter Survey (in About Me Surveys from your School)
- Write a thank-you note to your teachers

NO MORE THAN 2 TEACHER LETTERS

Counselor Recommendation Letter/Written Evaluation

- Same as above, but complete the "counselor letter of recommendation" 0
- Only if application requires, should you request a counselor letter •

TECHNICAL & SKILLED TRADES PROGRAMS

Skilled Trades

Skilled trades are occupations that require a special skill, knowledge or ability which can be obtained at a college, technical school or through specialized training. Skilled trades provide an alternative to jobs that require four years of college education. While skilled trades can be separated into many areas such as manufacturing, technology, energy, and healthcare, they are generally divided into the following three categories

Skilled Industrial Trades: welders, machinists, mechanics, tool and die makers, programmers

Skilled Construction Trades: electricians, plumbers, gasfitters, carpenters, bricklayers, technicians, insulators

Skilled Service Trades: nurses, aides, orderlies, therapists, service technicians


