

California Dep of Education / Public Health Guidance: Priority for full in-person learning

California Department of Public Health Guidance for K-12 schools

- Aligns with the CDC's national K-12 schools guidance, and American Academy of Pediatrics
- Priority for full in-person learning, to support education, mental, emotional, and social development
- Layered approach: Vaccines, masks, ventilation, hand hygiene, stay home when sick, COVID19 testing. Transparency.
- Universal K-12 mask requirements
 - Indoors required. All students; all adults when indoors with students.
 - Outdoors- optional.



Summary of Major Guidance Changes

- Masking indoors for all when students/public present
 - $-\,$ Guidance reassessed on an ongoing basis; any decision to update by 11/1 $\,$
- Masks optional outdoors for all in K-12 settings
- Close contact definition has changed to >15 minutes over 24 hours within 0 to 6 feet indoors
- Alternative quarantine options in some cases for children/youth, but adults still quarantine for full 10 days
- Disinfect spaces occupied by a person sick within the last 24h
- Increased focus on testing; resources for testing



General Safety Measures

- Everybody on campus wears masks except for eating and drinking
- Students and staff continue to wash or sanitize their hands before entering and exiting a room
- No cohorts but divisions are separated as much as possible
- Students are instructed not to touch each other but no special distancing is enforced
- **Ventilation** in the classroom is a priority.
- Parents sign an honor code to check symptoms and keep children home
- **Testing** continues for all people on campus
- Faculty and staff need to be **vaccinated** (exceptions apply)





On campus: indoors

- Mask requirement at all times
- No eating and drinking allowed anywhere indoors (including teacher's lounge)
- Ventilation as much as possible (windows and doors open, ventilator on)
- No mandated distancing but students should keep distance as much as possible
- Teachers should continue to avoid close contact





On campus: outdoors

- General mask requirement
- Eating and drinking: distancing required for all people on campus (preferably six feet if at all possible)
- IF a teacher can maintain six feet distance of ALL students and teacher, masks can be temporarily removed outdoors for short periods of time
- Drinking fountains stay closed (water bottles can be refilled in the classroom or the restrooms)






Lunch & Recess

- Every division stays in their area
 - Kibili
 - Elementary: inner court, playground, front field
 - Middle School: middle school court, basketball court and field to alternate with high school
 - High School: area in front of the art room, basketball court and field to alternate with middle school; off campus allowed (with new parent waiver)
- No games/activities allowed where students touch each other
- Lunch is staggered
 - 11.30-11.50/11:40-11:55: "a" classes and grades 9/10
 - 11.55-12.15/12.00-12.15: "b" classes and grades 11/12
 - Each grade level has a determined seating area for lunch
- Hot lunch will resume in MV
- No sharing of food or drinks



Symptoms Check

At home and at school



- All parents have to sign an honor code that they will check for symptoms daily and keep their children home
- Teachers will monitor symptoms and are instructed to send children to the office (isolation room and home) if they display symptoms of COVID-19

Doctor's Notes

Summary

- No note needed if negative test.
- Cases for doctor's notes:
- Student has symptoms that the parent would have contacted the doctor for prior to the pandemic. Doctors provide an alternate explanation for the symptoms.
- 2. Student has a chronic health condition. Doctor provides detailed information that will cover the school year.


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Testing

- Continue periodic asymptomatic testing for students and staff
- Antigen-Testing is preferred for fast results.
 - Participation in CA School Testing (Primary.Health, BinaxNow test))
 - Self-administered test for K-12
 - More than 10% of student body and staff weekly (4 homerooms in MV and 2 homerooms in SF)
 - All unvaccinated staff is tested weekly
 - Needs trained personnel and parental approval
 - PCR tests are provided for fast testing in case of a positive result
- Testing for ALL students and staff at the beginning of the school year required



2021-2022 Quarantine Decision Tree for TK-12 School Settings



Visitors & Volunteers



- Only staff and students are allowed on campus (exceptions apply)
- Every volunteer who enters campus has to either be vaccinated or has tested negative in the last 7 days



Field Trips

- Field trips are discouraged and only allowed as an exception (with prior approval) with the same guidelines as on campus (masking, ventilation)
- Chaperones have to be either tested or vaccinated

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Modifications to Distance Learning

- Currently, GISSV does not offer distance learning during school year 21/22 unless a medical exception indicates this as a necessity.
- In the case of class quarantines, the students will be taught via distance learning (K-12).
- In the case that a student has to go into mandatory quarantine because of exposure, they will be able to take part via Google Classroom.
- In the case that a student has special requirements before or after travel because of COVID-19, the student can be asked to complete work from the respective teacher(s).
- If a student is sick, they should rest and get better; however, the teacher might provide an overview of the topics that were discussed in their absence.



COVID-19 and AQI

It's Wildfire Season

- AQI at 100+: Students can stay inside during recess; running during recess is discouraged; PE is non-exerting exercises only
- AQI at 150+: If measured at 6.30am: campus closed for the day and distance learning takes place (K-12); if measured until 11.30am: all students go home at 1.50pm

High AQI might happen with wildfires increasing in the late summer.

Measures against COVID-19 and high AQI are mutually exclusive!
