1) High School Diploma	Meet the statutorily defined diploma credit and curricular requirements.
2) Learn and Demonstrate Employability Skills (Students must complete <u>at least one</u> of the following.)	Learn employability skills standards through locally developed programs.  Employability skills are demonstrated by one of the following:  - Project-Based Learning Experience  - Service-Based Learning Experience  - Work-Based Learning Experience
3) Postsecondary-Ready Competencies (Students must complete at least one of the following.) ## College Search Items

Now is the time for juniors to continue looking at colleges

Attend the college fair at VUJC on October 4th.

Search the internet, college websites, and check admission requirements.

### Visit colleges of interest

Contact the admissions office two weeks in advance to set up the appointment

Contact Mrs. Dahmer for a Pre-Arranged Absence Form (or print off of web site) and submit before the visit

Student must return a verification form on the day following the visit to Mrs. Werner

Can take as many as necessary(within reason)

### What to Expect on a Visit

Meet with the office of admissions

Take a campus tour

Meet with someone in your planned academic major

May meet with the office of financial aid (private colleges usually)

Attend a class

### Tests for Juniors/Seniors

- PSAT Wed, October 11<sup>th</sup> in a.m. for 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup>
- PSAT is free for Juniors/Sophs. Juniors register in guidance office by Sept. 8(NMSQT)
- School Day SAT. Any Junior or Senior. Sign up in guidance office by Sept. 8
- All Sophs. will PSAT test-no need to register
- All Junior required to take SAT test in the Spring- (no charge to students)
- SAT Reasoning Test and/or ACT take during the spring of the junior year-multiple test scores will not hurt the student.
- SAT Subject tests
- SAT/ACT retakes no later than Dec. of Senior year
- No longer giving the ASVAB in school

- PSAT- no fee. Sign up in the guidance office by 9-8-23.
- College Visit- form on website

- School Day SAT- \$60.00 or \$8.00 F/R. Sign up in guidance office by Friday 9-8-23
- College visit- form on website
- Job Shadow- permission slip

# College Application Process

### What the parent does:

- Discuss college options
- ✓ Visit schools with your son/daughter
- ✔ Help your son/daughter organize materials
- ✓ Support them through the process

### What you do NOT do:

✓ Complete the applications for your son/daughter

### **Parchment**

Parchment will charge \$4.00 for any <u>past graduate</u> to send a transcript. There is no fee for in-state schools for currently enrolled high school students. Students go from currently enrolled to past graduates on August 1 each year.

- Check scholarships available from colleges

# What is the difference between Dual Credit and AP credit?????

- Dual credit may or may not be accepted at all colleges
- AP credits are accepted at most colleges

### **More Dual Credit Information**

Students will register for dual credit in the next few weeks.

The registration process is the same as a college. Students are responsible for registration/drops.

The course drop deadline is Oct. 2

Some students will need to take the Knowledge Assessment

Check with colleges about transferring credits, especially with competitive direct admit programs(nursing).

### General Overview of the Junior Year

- Take the PSAT, SAT in October
- Take an SAT and/or ACT- Send scores directly to schools
- Start investigating colleges and careers
- Look at admission requirements
- Maintain or improve grades
- Meet with counselor in the spring for course selection for senior year
- Graduation Pathways

### General Overview of the Senior Year

- Individual meetings with all seniors Sept/Oct
- Retake SAT/ACT if needed
- Applications for admissions completed 1<sup>st</sup> semester
- FAFSA information meeting Nov. 13, 6:00pm JHS Auditorium
- Scholarship packets 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. DCCF Scholarship Deadline OCT. 3.
- May 1<sup>st</sup> Decision Date
- Contact dual credit schools, have transcripts sent to college that student will attend in the fall

# Must complete ONE of the following: for Academic Honors

- -Earn 4 hs credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exam OR-
- -Earn 6 verifiable transcripted college credits in dual credit courses from the priority course list -OR-
- -Earn 3 verifiable transcripted college credits from the priority list and 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exam -OR-
- -1250 or higher on SAT, no less than 560/Math. 590/EBR/W -OR-
- -ACT composite of 26 or above, must include writing portion

### To check IVY Tech Dual credits.

- The student will go to: <a href="https://myivy.ivytech.edu/">https://myivy.ivytech.edu/</a> and click on "First Time User" to create an Ivy Tech account. They will create their own password during this process.
- Once they create their account & sign in, there will be a gray menu bar on the left side of the screen. They should click on "Student" and then click on "Course Info". In the middle of the display screen, they should select "Unofficial Transcripts".
- Each online applicant is sent a card with their C# on it to their home address. If they did not retain that card, they can call our HelpDesk (888) IVY-LINE. By verifying certain information (such as their SSN, Name and DOB), they can find out their own C#.
