Graduation Pathway Requirements**Graduation Pathway Options****1) High School Diploma**

Meet the statutorily defined diploma credit and curricular requirements.

2) Learn and Demonstrate Employability Skills

(Students must complete at least one of the following.)

Learn employability skills standards through locally developed programs. Employability skills are demonstrated by one of the following:

- **Project-Based Learning Experience**
- **Service-Based Learning Experience**
- **Work-Based Learning Experience**

3) Postsecondary-Ready Competencies

(Students must complete at least one of the following.)

ACT – Students must earn the college-ready score in two of the four subjects – in Reading or English AND Math or Science.

- 18 – English
- 22 – Reading
- 22 – Math
- 23 – Science

SAT – 480 EB R/W
530 - Math

ASVAB - 31

- **ACT** College-ready benchmarks
- **SAT** College-ready benchmarks
- **ASVAB** Military letter of intent required
- **State and Industry recognized Credential or Certification**
- **AP/Dual Credit** - Must earn a C average or higher in at least three courses.
- **Honors Diploma** – Fulfill all requirements of either the Academic or Technical Honors diploma.
- **State, Federal, or Industry recognized Apprenticeship.**
- **Career-Technical Education Concentrator** – Must earn a C average or higher in at least 6 high school credits in a career sequence.

OR

- **Locally created pathway** that meets the framework from and earns the approval of the State Board of Education. |

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1. **Currently enrolled in a CTE “Principles” course.**
2. **Naviance assessment updates - interests, skills, personality, work values, etc...**
3. **Next steps - Decide on 10th/11th grade CTE courses.**






Accounting Concentration

PowerSchool transcript access

The JHS Guidance website contains all of the information presented to students and parents.

Students and Parents have access to student transcripts on their PowerSchool account by clicking on the “student reports” tab on the left side of the screen.

***Check for accuracy each semester*
(8th Grade/Summer Credits)**

Removing Grades from the transcript.

- Students will have the option to remove the grade and credit from their transcript if they retake the same course in high school.
- Students will have the option to remove the grade and credit from their transcript if they take a language course at JMS and then take a different language or discontinue a foreign language at JHS.
- PCC grades will not be removed.
- Engineering Essential grades can be removed.
- Students will have until the end of the first semester to make this decision. After the first semester of their freshman year grades will not be dropped or added.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Meet with all students in early Spring in classrooms, distribute packet of information with available classes.
- 2 weeks later call each student in to discuss course requests.
- Registration verifications are sent home after Spring Break.
- Approx. 96% of students are scheduled at this time.
- Changes can be made until June 30. After June 30 no changes will be made until school resumes.
- Students will get 2 weeks to change classes after school resumes, 1 week second semester.
- Class changes will change other classes/lunch
- STUDENTS MUST CHECK EMAIL!!!

The best way for students to get the classes they want is to put thoughtful consideration into their class selection from the onset. Courses will fill and close as students make changes.

College Search Items

Now is the time for Sophomores to start looking at colleges

Attend the college fair at VUJC on March 11.

Search the internet, college websites, and check admission requirements.

Visit colleges of interest

Contact the admissions office two weeks in advance to set up the appointment

Contact Mrs. Dahmer for a Pre-Arranged Absence Form (or print off of web site) and submit before the visit

Student must return a verification form on the day following the visit to Mrs. Werner

Can take as many as necessary(within reason)

What to Expect on a Visit

Meet with the office of admissions

Take a campus tour

Meet with someone in your planned academic major

May meet with the office of financial aid (private colleges usually)

Attend a class

VUJC College Fair

The VUJC College Fair will be held at VUJ on March 11, 2024. Students will receive an invitation in the mail directly from VUJ. This is an excellent opportunity to talk with representatives from several different colleges/universities.

Students are allowed to take as many college visits as they wish.

PSAT TESTING - October 11th (Sophomores)

- **PSAT given in a.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 11th for all 10th graders.**
- **The PSAT is optional for Juniors they must sign up in the guidance office early in the school year to test.**
- **Juniors take the PSAT primarily for National Merit Scholarship eligibility**
- **No fee for the PSAT**
- **Score reports returned in December**
- **PSAT Scores are used for dual credit registration**
- **Take SAT/ACT during junior year**
- **Create Collegeboard account in their World History Class**

9th Grade Testing

- **Any student enrolled in Biology I, for the first time will take the science ILearn.(This will be most freshmen). Testing will take place in late April. No Rescores/Retakes.**

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DUAL CREDIT AND AP CREDIT?????

- Dual credit may or may not be accepted at all colleges
- A comprehensive list of dual credit courses can be found on the JHS Guidance website.
- AP credits are accepted at most colleges
- You cannot combine AP and Dual credit for the same class

- KEEP TRACK OF YOUR DUAL CREDITS!!

Registering for Dual Credit Courses

- *Students will register in the class that they are getting the dual credit.**
- *Students will create an account on IVY Tech Dual Enroll website. SSN required.**
- *Students are responsible for dropping dual credit classes if they do not wish to earn the dual credit.**
- *Students MUST keep track of their dual credits.**
- **Students will receive a packet from IVY Tech a few weeks after registration with a student information card that contains the students IVY Tech email address.****

Must complete ONE of the following: for Academic Honors

-Earn 4 credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exam – OR-

-Earn 6 verifiable transcribed college credits in dual credit courses from the priority course list –OR-

-Earn 3 verifiable transcribed college credits from the priority list and 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exam

–OR-

-1250 or higher on SAT, no less than 560 on Math, and 590 on EB R/W

–OR-

-ACT composite of 26 or above, must include writing portion

FUTURE ACTIVITIES

- **Students will do career assessment activities in Naviance**
- **All students meet with their counselor in the spring to choose classes for the next year**
- **Start looking at what colleges require for admission**
- **College visits this Spring**
- **College Representatives- during lunch in the cafeteria**
