School for Pre-School Children to Open

St. Louis' newest pre-kindergarten—the Forsyth School, 6214 Forsyth, will open its doors for the first time Wednesday. The new school, in a converted 35-year-old residence, is sponsored by the Unity Christ Church, but is operated on a non-sectarian basis.

Plans being made to be shown when finished at the later show performances. The music room will be the scene of all school presentations such as plays, dances and productions. New Nursery School in Former Home

A new school, where children of less than kindergarten age are to be taught to speak French, as well as to learn other things, has been established in a converted 35-year-old residence at 6214 Forsyth boulevard. Called The Forsyth School, it is to be opened next Wednesday with limited enrollment of 35. Mrs. Mary Dunbar is the school's director. Sponsorship is by the Unity Christ Church.

The reconditioned three-floor brick home is on a 3000 square foot lot. The lot has a 120-foot front and extends north and south into the back yard playground for a total of 250 feet. The property was purchased from Dr. and Mrs. Arnold Klein for \$65,000 last January.

Each of the three floors has been futuristically decorated with new marble radiator covers, large picture windows; new equipment has been installed for the several fireplaces and fire walls have been incorporated for protection of occupants. A steel fire escape has been erected at the rear.

Determined that Forsyth will not have an "institutional look", the directors have seen to it that all the new furniture, including tables and chairs, blackboards and display bulletin boards; school supplies and an assortment of appliances are most modern and sized to be convenient for the 3-4 1/2 year olds.

"Not one piece of furniture or appliances, or the built-in kitchen with cabinets, stove and dishwasher was purchased by the school," Mrs. Dunbar pointed out. "Everything has been donated."

Attractive interior quarters include a 32-foot by 15-foot tile-floored assembly room, with "honey" fireplace, reading "corner", craft shop; a large dining room equipped in a manner suited to the children, a music and dance room and a 15-foot by 15-foot activity enclosure. The music room will, on occasions, be converted into a shop where a circus will be planned and become a reality, with objects being constructed and cut-
