This is a sample of what a student's writing may look like after editing: Have you ever tried lettuce before? Lettuce is a vegetable that looks like a leaf. In fact, this vegetable is part of the daisy family! It tastes crunchy and crispy. Sometimes, the leaves taste like they have water inside them. This vegetable comes from a plant that grows up from the ground. The edible leaves can be reddish, different shades of green with a hint of white.
