WELCOME to ISH

Founded in 1957, the International School of Hamburg (ISH) was the first of its kind in Germany. Our 750+ students currently represent more than 50+ nationalities.

Our mission is to provide students with a values-driven international education which seeks to develop their full potential and to foster understanding, respect for others, freedom of thought and expression, enjoyment of learning and personal responsibility.

ISH recruits highly qualified, experienced teachers from all over the world and uses a combination of the International Primary Curriculum (IPC), the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP), the IB Career-Related Programme (IBCP) and the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) – globally standardized, timetested and highly regarded curricula. Combined, they allow a seamless flow from kindergarten/preschool right through to high school diploma/IB diploma.

However, some challenges associated with attending a new school remain. While adapting to a new culture and place becomes easier each time, this requires good planning, much effort and strong nerves. This Welcome Guide, frequently also called the "Blue Book", is meant to help new ISH families with this process.

The recommendations in this Welcome Guide have been compiled by the parent community in conjunction with the school. We hope you find it useful. This Guide does NOT contain detailed information on daily procedures, academics, rules of conduct etc. Depending on whether your children attend Junior School or Secondary School, please refer to the appropriate Handbook.

2. School Information

START TIMES

For ECC and Junior School (P1 to grade 5) the official start time is 8:30. Students should arrive by 8:25 at the latest so they can be in their classroom by 8:30. Supervision on the JS school playground starts at 8:15.

In Secondary School (grade 6-12), students are required to be in class with their tutors at 8:15. Registration takes place from 8:15 to 8:25 every morning, while the classes begin at 8:30.

For late arrival procedure please check the handbook of your part of the school. Please note that students should not arrive before 8:00.

ABSENCES

Parents must excuse ALL absences from school. This can be done either via veracross, email, written note or phone call with your school secretary (email addresses can be found in the handbooks).

This also includes students who are 18 years of age or older as well as students leaving school earlier for a particular reason (medical appointment, renewal of passport etc.)

Please note that the daily attendance record information is available online for you via Veracross.

INFORMATION CHANNELS

The community uses many forms of communication, as the idea is to cater to different preferences.

EMAIL

During your time at ISH you will be receiving a lot of emails. Please make sure you check your **Spam** or **Junk** emails, as unfortunately, some of the communication does not always land in the main Inbox. Senders of emails are typically the

Junior and Secondary School Principals and Secretaries, the Head of School, the Faculty, the Counsellors, and the Class Parents.

NEWSLETTER

Once a month, an email is sent, containing a table of contents and a link to the ISH Newsletter. Clicking the link will start an automated download of the PDF-file. The Newsletter remains a key source of information about what's going on throughout the school, some of which you won't be able to find elsewhere.

VERACROSS

ISH uses a school management system called Veracross. This is a database that is accessible in different contexts to staff. faculty, students, and parents. All constituents can use the Veracross Portals, which display information tailored to the user logged in. Teachers use it as an academic learning platform, tracking class attendance of their students, keeping a grade book, building class websites to offer learning resources, communicating with their students and parents etc. This data is displayed in the Student and Parent Portals, along with school-wide and personalized calendars, a directory. report cards, timetables etc. The Portals are also used to schedule Parent/Teacher Conferences, to sign-up for after school activities, to complete enrollment and re-enrollment processes, and much more. Parents can also view medical and contact information that the school has on record for their children, and they can submit changes to their own contact data and which information about the family should be displayed in the directory.

The Portals have a responsive design and can be viewed comfortably on phones and tablets as well. The directory in Veracross is available as an app for mobile devices. Veracross is the main source of (academic) information for the school community. It is home to the school calendars and displays school-wide events as well as person-specific information to the user. All school calendars can be brought to

your mobile device via a subscription link, and parents and students can even get the homework assignments via a calendar feed. You can reach Veracross via the following URL: https://portals.veracross.eu/ish

LOGIN AND ASSISTANCE

Upon arrival parents are issued a username and password for the Veracross Parent Portal. You will find a guide on how to use this portal by clicking "Guide to the Parent Portal" in the "Links & Resources" section. Parents can change their password or retrieve it by clicking "Can't access your account?" on the login page for the Parent Portal.

OTHERS

Social Media

ISH is active on a variety of social media channels. There is a closed PTA Facebook group, plus a PTA Classifieds Group for buying/selling and recommendations. In addition there is an instagram page and a closed ISH Alumni FB Group - all former students are strongly encouraged to join. The Marketing department also manages an official open Facebook page for the entire school, which posts general news about the school and has an instagram account (internationalschoolofhamburg).

Besides being on FB, ISH also has a strong presence on the professional networking platform LinkedIn, more specifically: (1) a company page, (2) a university page and (3) a closed Alumni group. All three will appear upon entering "International School of Hamburg" in the LinkedIn search bar. (1) and (2) are aimed at externals and won't provide any news not available on FB. The alumni group provides the added benefit of being able to see other group members' profiles – an invaluable feature for fresh graduates who want to network with alumni, e.g. with the goal of finding a job. Website News

www.ishamburg.org has a news section under the navigation point "Community" www.ishamburg.org/community/news. Usually 3 news items receive a special feature on the homepage under Highlights and Events. The news found here reflects highlights of our school.

POSTERS AND BOARDS

Poster frames can be found around the school, promoting upcoming events. Rules apply pertaining to the posters. For further information, contact the Marketing Office. Pin boards are placed throughout the school, offering relevant information regarding PTA news, sporting events, ECAP activities and Cafeteria menu, etc. Next to the Reception is an advertising board aimed at parents personal interests, such as house rentals, furniture for sale and other services.

FLYER RACK

The school displays a number of flyers from organizations and businesses. These are for your personal use. Feel free to take them. Should you have your own business or wish to recommend one, please bring your flyer or information brochure to the Reception.

LIBRARY

Welcome to the ISH libraries, a place where our community connects to inquire, to discover and to collaborate!

Our Junior and Senior School library share a large, bright space and have a comprehensive selection of books and other resources. We are open on school days from 8:00 to 16:00. Any changes to these times will be posted on the library door.

All students receive a library user number, which allows them to borrow books, DVD's, reference books, magazines and other audio and visual material. Parents are encouraged to use this facility and may request a user number.

STUDENT ID CARDS

The student ID card (Schülerausweis) verifies that children and teenagers are still attending school. It offers benefits such as discounted entrance to museums, cinemas etc. You can obtain an ID card at the Reception; you only need to bring a passport-sized photograph of the student.

NURSE

In case of emergency or illness, all medical information (including the immunization record) on the health record forms should be kept up to date. In line with the German law, the school nurses require a signed "Medical and Accident Treatment Health Form" for each child. By handing in this form either directly to the nurse or to the reception, you give the school nurse permission to administer any kind of OTC (over the counter) medication. Note that without which, this is not possible. For all prescribed medications, a medical doctor's order is necessary. If you would like the teaching staff or chaperones to administer OTC or prescription medication on a school trip you have to give your written consent and enclose a written order by your medical doctor.

The health record forms and more information are available under the icon "Admissions" on our website. If you have specific questions related to health or medicine, please contact our reception team at reception@ishamburg.org or call (0)40 8000 50 100 and they will forward your message.

SCHOOL COUNSELORS

In the Junior School, the counselor works with children from a child-centered perspective, which means that each child is unique and is viewed according to his or her developmental level. A strong belief in the child's ability to actualize self is nurtured and appreciated.

In Secondary School, counseling is seen as a collaborative process in which counselors and students work together to define and follow through with a personal improvement plan.

COLLEGE & UNIVERSITY COUNSELING

There are currently two counselors serving the needs of students with regard to college and university preparation.

Our ISH College Counselor serves all students and their families with the exception of the UK. She coordinates and administers all college related tests such as SAT, ACT and PSAT. She frequently announces guest speakers and other important information in the newsletter and via the Veracross Calendars.

Our UK College Counselor, assists all interested students intending to apply to UK universities. She takes students to a university fair in the UK and coordinates the UCAS application process.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

The Student Support Services Team (SSST) provides support for students, who experience academic difficulties and have been identified through a referral process as needing additional support in order to successfully develop their fullest potential.

SECURITY AT ISH

It is the responsibility of school security staff to take all necessary reasonable action to ensure the safety of the community. This includes a regular inspection of the premises and the campus perimeter. Two alarm systems are currently in use at the school; fire alarm and bomb alert. In case of an alarm, all people on the premises should leave the building by the nearest exit and move away to a safe distance. Please follow the instructions of a staff member in charge. Parents will be informed when it is safe to re-enter the building.

LOCKERS

All students from P3 to G12 will have their own individual locker. Individual contracts need to be signed between the parents and ASTRA Direct for liability reasons, but no fees will be charged from the parents.

LOST AND FOUND

There is a designated lost and found room (#026) next to the cafeteria towards the sports hall. Valuable items should be handed-in and claimed at Reception. Students are strongly advised to label all items to avoid loss. The school cannot be held responsible for expensive equipment if it is lost or stolen. Unclaimed items before the winter and summer breaks will be donated to charitable organizations.

3. Life in Hamburg & Germany

In order to help make your time in Hamburg as enjoyable as possible, we recommend becoming accustomed with the local culture, customs and etiquette. Reference books, such as "Culture Shock! THINGS TO DO

Hamburg offers a diverse <u>variety</u> of activities and events throughout the year, the likes of which you would expect to find in any exciting cosmopolitan city. Hamburg is the second largest port in Europe, featuring canals and bridges, lakes and beaches along the Elbe. LEGAL REGULATIONS PERTAINING CHILDREN

According to the German Youth Protection Act (Jugendschutzgesetz), persons:

- Under 14 years of age are classified as children
- Persons from 14 > 17 years are adolescents
- Persons 18+ are adults.

Starting at the age of 7, a child is responsible for the damage he/she causes to others. Limited criminal responsibility begins at 14 years and any crime committed by a 14 year old can be tried in juvenile court.

RESTAURANTS

Children and adolescents under 16 years are not allowed in restaurants, discos, etc. between 05:00 and 23:00 unless accompanied by a parent, guardian or person acting with parental authority.

- 16 > 17 years allowed without parents up until 24:00.
- 16 > 17 years need accompaniment between 24:00 > 05:00

DANCING & CONCERTS

Children and adolescents under 16 years can only attend public dance events if accompanied by a parent or custodial person/guardian. In some cases, written consent may be required. Night clubs can only be entered at age 18 and over.

ALCOHOL

From the age of 14, adolescents can drink wine and beer only if they are in the company of their parents. At the age of 16, they can drink beer, wine and champagne. Drinking of other alcoholic beverages (including sugared alcohol containing beverages) is strictly for age 18 and over.

SMOKING & DRUGS

Tobacco products must not be sold to persons under 18 years old, and neither is smoking allowed in public places. Most bars, clubs and restaurants have banned smoking. All drugs, not prescribed by a doctor, are illegal in Germany.

PUNISHMENT

All physical punishment to a child is illegal in Germany.

CINEMA

Parents or guardians must always accompany children under 6 years of age to the cinema. Children are allowed to watch a film alone without their parents being present:

- 6 > 13 years until 20:00
- 14 > 15 years until 22:00
- 16 > 17 years until 24:00
- 18 years + no restrictions

e.g. if a 13 year old goes with friends to see a film that finishes at 20:05, a parent or person with parental authority must accompany them.

DRIVING

The rights to require a driving license for the following are:

<u>Age</u>	<u>Vehicle</u>
15 years	Motorized bikes up to a speed of 25 km/h
16 years	Mopeds up to 50 km/h and light motorcycles up to 80 km/h
17 years	Probationary age for supervised driving
18 years	Cars (Class 3) and motorbikes up to 20KW (class 1a)

Working

Children aged 14 and over, in full-time education, may undertake some work. Individuals need to check regulations with the local authorities. Full-time employment can be started at 16 years of age. However, night shifts are not permitted until the age of 18.

4. Transportation

TRANSPORT TO ISH

The following sub-section elaborates on the various options of transportation to school.

PUBLIC

S-Bahn line S1/S11 to Klein-Flottbek. Take bus #21 in the direction "Niendorf Nord". Exit after two stops at "Hemmingstedter Weg".

Alternatively, by foot, there is a 10 mins walk by path. Exit Klein Flottbek station to the Botanical Gardens, walk along Ohnhorststrasse past the bike sheds. Take the first right onto Hesten and a left on the scenic Max Emden Weg. This takes you past the Hamburg Polo Club grounds to Hemmingstedter Weg, where you need to take a right.

- Bus #283 stops at Hemmingstedter Weg .
- Bus #37 stops at nearby Ostermeyerstrasse.
 Both stop at the Elbe Einkaufszentrum (shopping mall/centre), which is 5 mins walking distance to ISH.

For more options, visit "Hamburger Verkehrsverbund" (www.hvv.de). Type in your individual route or use the "HVV App" for smartphones, or Deutsche Bahn (deutschebahn.com) and use the search or download Deutsche Bahn's DB Navigator App for smartphones. This includes nation-wide train, subway, U-Bahn and bus schedules.

If students wish to purchase a reduced-rate season ticket for the bus or train, they will need to confirm that they are a student of ISH. Confirmation of attendance can be obtained at the Reception.

ISH SCHOOL BUS

The school buses run around the Alster neighbourhoods, departure at several stations and bus stops at various times, arrival at 8:10 at ISH. As a result, supervision on the Junior School Playground also starts at 8:15.

For more information on the bus schedules and the bus cost, please contact the Admissions team.

TRANSPORT BY CAR

ISH features a drop-off zone in front of the main entrance, where cars are not allowed to park or even wait. ISH also features a school parking lot with a limited number of designated spaces for parents. If the lot is full, parents may make use of the overflow parking lot at the nearby Rot/Gelb Club (Hemmingstedter Weg 140). Parents are reminded to be extra cautious of the students who are walking or biking to or from the school. Overall, traffic is a source of continuous friction between ISH and its neighbours. In the interest of good relations, please do everything you can to minimize inconveniences for the local community.

BIKES

ISH features a bike shed. It has a roof and sidewalls to protect the bikes from bad weather. Students are reminded to bring a bike lock to ensure extra security. Helmets are compulsory to the age of 13.

WALKING & RUNNING

Mothers and fathers in running gear are not an unusual sight at ISH, especially during morning drop-off. Why not join them? Take a relaxing walk with your kids to school, then run back. The only thing in your way is the typical Hamburg weather...

DRIVING

In general, driving in Germany is not difficult as traffic is typically quite orderly. However, there are some important rules you need to know and you need to be aware of the meaning of the traffic signs.

Firstly, here are some useful advices about driving in general:

- The speed limit in towns is 50 km/h and in some residential areas (e.g. Hemmingstedter Weg) 30 km/h.
- Outside built-up areas the speed limit is 100 km/h if not stated otherwise.
- On many German highways, the speed limit is 130 km/h. In some places, there is no speed limit.
- Road signs are the same throughout Europe.
- At intersections, when not otherwise indicated, traffic from the right has priority; this includes small streets joining larger ones. This is a critical rule! However, at roundabouts, a vehicle coming from your left and already on the roundabout has priority.
- Pedestrians have priority on zebra crossings.
- Seat belts are mandatory for all passengers. All cars must be equipped with a warning triangle, a First Aid kit and a yellow reflective high visibility Safety Vest.
- Children are only allowed to travel in the front seat of a car if they are 12 years of age or older. They have to be at least 1.50m in height and 36 kg in weight. By law, children under 12 years of age, below 35 kg in weight and under 1.50m tall must be strapped into an appropriate car seat at all times whilst riding a vehicle.
- It is mandatory to change to winter tyres in the winter months. If you have an accident on an icy road without the correct tyres, you may have problems claiming anything from your insurance company.
- Using a mobile phone that is not hands free while driving is prohibited.
- Get a Parking Disc (Parkscheibe). It's a blue cardboard or plastic card with an adjustable time dial. You can find them at most gas stations. Signs indicating that you must use a parking disc will also indicate the length of time you can park. Turn the dial so that the arrow points to the time of your arrival, rounded-up to the next half hour.

 If a parked car is impeding your way, oncoming traffic has priority and you must wait behind the parked car until it is safe to pass. This will happen to you often. Exercise patience.

GETTING A DRIVER'S LICENSE

As a rule, Germans are very good drivers. This is due in part to the fact that they take getting a license very seriously. Germans, ages 18 and older are required to take a minimum of 25-45 hours of professional instruction, along with a grueling theoretical test. This is both time-consuming and expensive.

You will need to check with your company or relocation agent to see if your current license can be transferred. If you are moving from another EU country, your license will probably transfer, and you will be spared the torture and expense of the theoretical and practical exams. South Africa, Israel and Japan also have reciprocity with Germany. Most Canadian provinces have reciprocity. Currently Australia and New Zealand do not have reciprocity. However, these laws are subject to change, so check with your relocation advisor on specifics.

If you are moving from the US, reciprocity agreements are state-by-state. Whether or not you have to take the driving tests will depend on which state you come from. Some states have full reciprocity. Others will require you to take both the practical and theoretical tests. Reciprocity agreements keep changing, so consult your company or relocation advisor about reciprocity within your state.

If you hold a Non-EU driver's license, you must apply for a Führerschein (German driver's license) within your first six months of arriving in Hamburg. This time limit begins the day of your "Anmeldung" (registration of address with the local authorities).

This means that if you are one of the unlucky souls who have to pass the theoretical and/or practical exams, you have six months to do so before you can no longer drive legally. If you take the theoretical test, be prepared, as it is not easy. You can take the test in different languages though. There are study aids to help you pass the test that you should really use!

If you must also take the practical test, be prepared to pay dearly. You must go to a "Fahrschule" and you will pay high fees. Foreigners do not have to take nearly as many hours of instruction as new German drivers. You really only need a lesson or two to know how to pass the test. If they try to make you take more than a couple hours of instruction, do not do it. You may also have to take a first aid class that will be taught in German.

If you plan on getting a German license (with or without reciprocity), do so within three years of establishing residency in Germany. If you wait longer, you'll have to start from scratch and take the same number of behind-the-wheel and theory lessons as a first-time applicant in order to obtain a German license.

Some fines can be collected on the spot, provided the driver has enough cash on hand. Otherwise, your name and address will be taken and a ticket along with a payment slip will be sent to you. Failure to pay traffic violations promptly can lead to larger fines, loss of license or imprisonment. If you accumulate 8 points from traffic violations you lose your license. There is not enough space to name all traffic violations and their consequences, as there are many from speeding violations over parking violations to drunk and drug driving violations. PARKING RULES

There is no parking:

- Within 5 meters of a cross road or a T-junction.
- On zebra lines.
- If there is less than 3 meters between your car and the middle of the street.
- In bus stop areas

CHARGED & PAY PARKING

There are two types of charged/ pay parking: As you pull into a lot or a garage you often have to take a parking ticket. When you are about to leave you then pay by finding a "Kassenautomat" (automatic cashier). Then, there are signs posted that say the parking requires a "Parkschein". Park your car and find the Parkschein machine. Insert money and watch the display. The time noted is the time that you must leave the lot by. Afterwards, place the receipt visibly on your car's dashboard and make sure to be back in time! You can also download "easypark" or "park and joy" and pay by app/phone, registration needed.

FREE PARKING

There are many streets in which parking is free, especially in residential areas. Sometimes there will be a sign stating that only those who live/work there or have a special pass may park. Some spaces may be free of charge but you can only park there for a limited length of time. Then you will need the blue "Parkscheibe" as mentioned earlier again.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

The public transportation system in Hamburg is efficient. It is operated by the "Hamburger Verkehrsverbund" (HVV) and covers both subways, buses and Elb ferries. On its website,

you can download an informative brochure in English about public transport in and around Hamburg. It provides you with a comprehensive introduction to the available ticket types and also explains different ways to buy them. Go to www.hvv.de for further information.

HVV TICKETS

It is important to know that the ticket prices are based on (unfortunately quite confusing) fare zones instead of a certain number of stations. There is the possibility to download the HVV or the HVV Switch App, which allows you to buy your tickets online at a reduced fee and also calculates the exact fee when entering the departure and arrival station. You can also buy tickets from vending machines underground and some bus stops in ticket offices that are located next to some stations. Additionally, you can buy tickets directly from the bus driver but not in the underground trains or subways. Moreover, children under the age of 6 years can use Hamburg's public transport free of charge!

You can choose between Single Tickets, Day Tickets and Group Tickets. If you plan to use the HVV several times a day or at least twice for a larger distance, it pays off to select a day ticket. It offers you unlimited public transportation services and the highest flexibility. If you travel in groups of up to five people, get the group ticket. It even pays off with the second person and allows you to travel around for the day between 9:00 and 18:00.

As a HVV ticket holder, you have the opportunity to go on board on six harbour ferries that are part of the public transportation network. With that, you can enjoy a harbour boat trip on the Elbe River basically for free all day!

FREQUENCY AND HOURS OPERATION OF HVV

Trains and buses usually run every 5 or 10 minutes within the inner city. On some less frequented routes such as concerning regional buses, you might have to wait 20, 40, or

60 minutes for the next bus to arrive. Some of the less frequently used routes are operated by the on-demand shuttle ioki, which is included in your ticket. To call an ioki, please download the HVV IOKI App. Once you know where your accommodation is located, it's a good idea to check which station(s) is/are nearby and to print the station timetable to spend more relaxing time enjoying your breakfast instead of hurrying and then waiting at the bus station.

In addition, it's important to know that public transportation in Hamburg is only provided as an all-night service from Friday to Sunday and before public holidays. From Monday to Friday, they pause between approximately 00:30 and 5:00, in which case you could use one of the night buses or take a taxi. You can download the HVV night bus map from Monday to Friday or the HVV night services map on weekend nights as PDF files if you wish to see the covered routes at a glance.

TAXIS IN HAMBURG

Taxis in Hamburg can be recognized by their cream finish and their taxi sign on top. When you spontaneously need a taxi, you can hail one with a lit yellow/black taxi sign on top, which indicates its availability

The taxi rate in Hamburg is legally fixed and therefore binding for each taxi company and driver.

BICYCLES


Children under the age of 8 years are not allowed to cycle on the streets, but only on the sidewalk or bike path. Parents with children ages 8 and under can bike on the sidewalk when accompanying them. Children between 8-10 years old can choose between sidewalk/bike path and street. Children above 12 years must bike on a bike path or street. Helmets are mandatory for children 14 and under. While all those 16 years and above are not required to wear a helmet, beware that German courts have ruled that under certain circumstances insurance companies have to pay less damages or none at all in the case of an accident in which a helmet would have provided some or complete protection.

You are not allowed to ride a bicycle under the influence of alcohol and at all times you must show "due care and attention", for example being on your mobile phone while cycling is not permitted.

Bikes are also required to legally have lights fitted for evening and wet weather cycling. For more details on biking rules in Germany go to:

For bicycles to be road-worthy in Hamburg, they need to be equipped with the right amount/colour of reflectors, lights, brakes, etc. The graphic below shows the equipment required by law.



STADTRAD HAMBURG

Hamburg is one of approximately 100 cities worldwide to offer a public bike rental system. There are over 1800 red bicycles available for rent all over the city. There is a registration fee. If your trip from one bike station to another takes less than 30 minutes you won't be charged. Hire and return are very simple and for further information check: www.stadtrad.hamburg.de (also available in English) and/or use the "StadtRAD Hamburg" app.

E-Scooter Hamburg

Since 2019 electric scooters are allowed to participate in German traffic. To rent and use e-scooters you just need to download the apps of the current providers in Hamburg <u>Circ</u>, <u>TIER</u>, <u>Lime</u> and <u>VOI</u>. Electric scooters may be used from the age of 14.

CAR SHARING

share-now.com requires a smartphone and registration. Once registered the respective smartphone apps can be used to locate and reserve a car within Hamburg. You open the car with the app, drive to where you want to go then leave the car in a parking lot.

AIR TRAVEL

There are a number of low cost airlines departing from Hamburg's 'Helmut Schmidt Airport' such as Ryanair, Easy Jet, Vueling, Eurowings or Norwegian and ordinary airlines like Lufthansa. Air France etc.

TRAIN TRAVEL WITH DEUTSCHE BAHN

Train travel around Germany has a reputation for being very reliable. Check on the <u>DB website</u> or the Bahn App for further information.

If you intend to travel on a regular basis, you can purchase a Bahncard, which will give a significant discount on your travels.

It's important to note that the Bahn guarantees your transportation, but not a seat. Therefore it makes a lot of sense to make seat reservations on more crowded routes or during rush hours and on holidays. Keep in mind that there is more than one kind of train. There are super-fast ICEs, local express trains, rapid transit suburban trains, S-Bahn trains, U-Bahn trains...it will take you some time to sort them all out, but it's worth it.

BUS TRAVEL

Bus travel across Germany is usually the cheapest, but also the slowest option. If your destination is fairly close, bus travel might provide the greatest value. For example, a bus return ticket Hamburg-Berlin can be as cheap as €20, while the price of a train ticket never drops below €60 unless you work with card discounts.

HOSPITALS (KRANKENHAUS)

Hamburg has over 35 hospitals and specialist facilities offering round-the-clock medical care.

Most hospitals offer A&E services (*Zentrale Notaufnahme*) in addition to stationary care. Some facilities specialise in particular medical fields such as pediatric medicine. Here you can find the <u>full list of hospitals in Hamburg</u> and their specialties (in German). Most importantly the '<u>Altonaer Kinderkrankenhaus</u>' at Bleickenallee 38 in Altona is always the first approach for emergencies regarding your children.

PHARMACY/DRUGSTORE (APOTHEKE)

For prescription medication from your doctor or over the counter medicines, you will need to look for an "Apotheke" sign. They usually have a green cross outside the building, or alternatively a large red "A". There are a lot of pharmacies around the Hamburg area. On weekends only certain pharmacies will be on duty. The address of the nearest pharmacy on duty will be posted on the front window of any pharmacy/drugstore or in the local newspaper.

Doctors (Ärzte)

Doctors are listed on the Internet and in this booklet. Most doctors in Germany will have some knowledge of English. The doctors listed within this booklet have been recommended by former or present ISH parents.

Please note that most doctors' offices are closed on weekends and opening hours may vary. Also, many doctors' offices are closed on Wednesday and Friday afternoons. Be sure to make an appointment ahead of time. Most doctors have a "Sprechstunde" (consultation hour), during which you can simply drop in, and be prepared to wait.

MEDICATION

The following medications are available from the Apotheke without a doctor's prescription. Always consult the pharmacist if you feel unsure about medication. Good pharmacists will volunteer their advice and most speak English.

6. House Information

GENERAL INFORMATION

The word for rental is "Vermietung". You will find estate agency names and addresses on the Internet under "Immobilien". You will also find house listings on the school noticeboard and on the PTA Facebook Classifieds Group for buying/selling and recommendations page.

The deposit (Kaution), usually equals the price of 2 months rent and one month in advance, and is expected at the outset. It is common that the apartment/house is painted at the end (or sometimes at the beginning) of the lease at the tenant's own expense. This depends on the contract and should be clarified before moving in. Always ensure that a very precise inventory of fixtures is carried out before you move in. If any changes need to be made during tenancy, please check with your agent or landlord first.

It is common in Germany to take out long leases, e.g. two to five years. Don't be fooled by signing a lease which is only cancelled on leaving the country. If you possess a pet, do not forget to advise your landlord.

Most homes come unfurnished, not all accommodation comes with a fully fitted kitchen or light fittings.

Kitchen, bathrooms and hallways are not counted in the number of rooms, so a two-bedroom apartment with living and dining room for example, is called a four-room (4-Zimmer) apartment. Electric voltage in Germany is 220 Volts.

All properties are advertised quoting the living area in square meters and number of rooms. The rent is based on a basic rent (Kaltmiete) plus service/house charges (Nebenkosten).

The total rent is called "Warmmiete". "Nebenkosten" charges are for utilities such as refuse collection, building insurance, sewage, street cleaning, land tax etc. They are added to the rent as a fixed monthly rate and at the end of the year, there is an adjustment between the payments made and the actual cost of the services. Charges for heating, electricity and water are usually paid directly by the tenant to the relevant authority.

RELOCATION SERVICES

Relocation services can help with everything from finding accommodation to learning the language to helping your children settle in. If you have already worked with a relocator for your move to Hamburg, chances are you will use him or her again for your next move or another one assigned by your company. But not all parents joining ISH have the benefit of having someone take care of them. If you are in the rare situation that you are actively looking for a relocator in Hamburg, feel free to try one of the following:

INSURANCES

Insurance in Germany is mostly mandatory. For existing insurance policies from your home country such as Accidental Death and Disablement, Term Life, Annual Travel or Health, it is recommended that you check with your existing insurer to ensure that your policy is valid whilst residing in Germany. Please contact a local professional for correct advice concerning the appropriate type of insurance. There are far more insurance possibilities than those mentioned here.

HOUSEHOLD INSURANCE

This insurance is optional and serves to indemnify you for loss of, or damage to your possessions. Included are all belongings contained in your home. Fixtures and fittings are attached to the buildings and not owned by you are generally excluded as they are the responsibility of the landlord. Coverage includes risks of fire, burglary, storm damage and/or vandalism. In some instances, tariffs include coverage for bicycles, but this

is not universal. Breakage of window panes can also be insured separately; this is a good idea when the panes of glass are large and costly to repair. Loss of keys (home or office) may also need to be insured separately. The amount of risks covered depends on the insurance company and you should be aware of what risk coverage is included.

THIRD PARTY LIABILITY INSURANCE

This is an advisable insurance. Under German law, there is no ceiling on the level of damages an individual could have awarded against them for an act they committed – even if the act was committed innocently. This insurance provides cover to you or to any insured member of your family in the event you commit an act for which a German court would consider you negligent.

Examples of ordinarily negligent may be knocking over a vase whilst visiting a shop or friend or causing bodily injury to another whilst skiing or engaging in other sports. Note that separate insurance policies are required for dogs and horses, anyone driving a car, sailing a boat, piloting an aircraft or hunting.

VEHICLE INSURANCE

Before a person can register a car in Germany he or she must have proof of third party liability coverage for all damage or injury to another person, car or object.

There are numerous factors in addition to coverage that influence the insurance price. New drivers pay more than experienced drivers; those living in urban areas pay more than those in rural areas, and those who have been found liable in accidents pay more than those who haven't. If you have a good driving record in your home country you can get credit for it here.

Depending on the degree of insurance you want to get, there are two types of vehicle insurance:

- <u>Teilkaskoversicherung (Partial Cover)</u>: Pays for theft of the whole car or of parts of the car, for damages caused by a storm, fire, hail, short circuit or attack by wildlife (may vary for different animals).
- Vollkaskoversicherung (Full Cover): Contains all the benefits of Teilkasko plus self-caused damages and accidents, hit and runs and damages by strangers/kids.

Note that the Full Cover is naturally more expensive than the Partial Cover. More information can be found on www.check24.de

HEALTH INSURANCE

Germany has a reputation for having one of the best healthcare systems in the world, providing its residents with comprehensive health insurance coverage. Approximately 85% of the population are mandatory or voluntary members of the public health scheme while the rest have private health insurance. You have two main options for health insurance while living in Germany:

- Government Health Insurance System (GKV): Most German residents are members of the governmental system.
- Private Health Insurance (PKV):
 Generally, private health plans cover a wider choice of medical and dental treatment and provide broad geographical coverage. By having private health insurance you are considered a private patient and can expect more service from the medical profession. The hospitals and doctors depend to a certain extent on private patients to supplement their incomes and therefore welcome them. A private patient can also request and will often get, doctors who speak their native language.

PET INSURANCE

There is third party liability insurance as well as health insurance for cats and dogs. The health insurance for your pet can be important, as the costs for therapy, treatment and medication can be high, in case of a severe disease or an accident.

A third party liability insurance for dogs and cats can also be useful, as costs of damages can rise to huge amounts without this insurance. For further information visit www.agila.de

RECYCLING/ WASTE MANAGEMENT

The <u>waste disposal system in Hamburg</u> is very environmentally and consumer-friendly. However, as with many things in Germany, there are rules you must learn and follow. Waste is divided into various groups, below is a brief description.

Garbage Item	Where It Goes
Paper – newspaper, magazines, empty pizza boxes, toilet rolls, cardboard, etc.	Blue Bin or bundled outside the house, collected once a month. Large paper containers are also found on streets for public use.
Glass – bottles and containers with no deposit.	Containers on many streets. You must sort by glass color.

	
Recyclables – cans, plastic, polystyrene, aluminum, and "composite materials" like beverage cartons.	Yellow Bins or in yellow bags obtained at the Recycling Hof or from the Recycling Truck which collects the yellow bags and bins every second week.
Glass and plastic Bottles with deposit (Pfand)	Automated machines at all supermarkets – after putting in the bottles you get a receipt to be redeemed at the cashier.
Biological waste – kitchen scraps like inedible parts of fruits and vegetables, nutshells, egg shells, tea leaves, etc. garden waste, straw.	Brown or green "Bio-Tonne" bin, collected every 2 weeks by Recycling truck or compost heap. Alternatively bring to the Recycling Hof (free of charge).
Ordinary waste – What's left after being separated.	Black/grey bin, once a week. Large amounts can be brought to the Recycling Hof, but a fee applies.
Larger items – furniture, TVs, everything which is bigger than the black/grey bin	Phone Sperrmüllabfuhr at 040 2576 2576 to have items collected (fee depending) or bring to the Recycling Hof.
Old clothes and shoes.	Containers in various places or occasionally a slip in your mailbox offering a collection of used clothing, Recycling Hof.
Batteries and energy saving bulbs.	In containers found in shops or brought to the Recycling Hof.

Cork	In containers found in shops like ALNATURA or brought to the Recycling Hof.

Don't forget about the annual flea market organized by the PTA. You may be able to recycle your household items by selling them! Alternatively – or in addition – you can offer your items in the PTA classified Facebook group. Of course, you always have the option to sell through one of the following online portals and apps:

If you can't sell an item and it's too big for a regular garbage can, you can have the Stadtreinigung (www.stadtreinigung-hh.de) come by and pick it up for a fee.

On their website under the section "Ihr persönlicher Abfuhrkalender" you can fill in your address, tick the box and then click "suchen". It shows the next dates for waste collection. If you submit your email address, you'll get a reminder one day prior to collection.

Alternatively, you can bring the item to a so-called Recycling-Hof (recycling centres). There are quite a few around. The ones closest to ISH are at Rodenbarg, 22525 Hamburg, and Brandstücken 36, 22549 Hamburg. Opening hours vary, but in general Monday—Saturday. Don't forget to take ID & proof of address as it may be asked for.

7. Services for Daily Life

BANKS

For specific details please check with your bank. First of all, please note that some independent shops in the local area do not accept credit cards, although this is changing rapidly.

To open a current account you will need your passport (provide proof of identity) and money for the initial deposit. If you bring cash, your account is opened immediately. Once a bank account has been opened, an EC card will be issued. There may be a monthly charge for keeping the account depending on the bank. The EC card is invaluable for transactions; it can be used for payments at shops, hotels. ticket offices, department stores and even supermarkets. It is also the card to use for getting cash from ATM's (in German "Geldautomat"). The bank will issue you a personal identification number (PIN) to use for the ATM's. Bank account statements (Kontoauszüge) are not regularly sent to your home. You must go to the bank and insert your EC-Karte into the machine to print off a statement. If you do not do this about once a month, your bank will mail you a copy and you will be charged a fee.

Most bills are paid by bank transfer "Überweisung".

A standing order "Dauerauftrag" can be used for recurring payments of a set sum, e.g. rent, insurance premiums, etc. The sum is deducted automatically from your account on an agreed date and transferred to the account of the recipient. The bank will provide the form. Direct debit "Lastschrift" can be used for recurring sums that vary in size, e.g. telephone, gas and electric bills. You give the recipient a direct debit authorization (Einzugsermächtigung), which authorizes the recipient to deduct the respective amounts from your account. At any time the authorization can be cancelled to stop the direct debit. As a safeguard against abuse, there is an unrestricted right for 90 days to recall any sum that was deducted.

Post

The Deutsche Post has an excellent website accessible in German and English: www.deutschepost.de

Stamps are called "Briefmarken". To mail a package, the cost is based on the size of the package and the weight. Beware – rates are significantly higher for "non standard" size letters or cards. Buying your stamps and postages online at DHL online shop saves you money and time. DHL packages can be sent from the Post Office.

9. Shopping

GENERAL INFORMATION

German general stores are usually open Monday through Saturday from 10:00 to 22:00, grocery stores open from 8:00 to 21:00. They are closed on Sundays. However there are a few Sundays when they are allowed to be open. Bakeries have a Sunday/holiday morning exception. You can always find essentials at the larger gas stations. Shops are open on Sundays in the main train stations (Hauptbahnhof, Altona Bahnhof), on the Reeperbahn (Lidl and PennyMarket) and at the airport.

"Verkaufsoffener Sonntag" (Open Shopping Sundays), which means an area or town has special permission to open stores on Sundays. This happens four times a year in Hamburg.

The Fischmarkt is an outdoor market, open every Sunday from 5.00 am to 9.30 am (Winter 7.00-9.30) on the Große Elbstraße west of the Landungsbrücken.

10. Restaurants, Cafes, Bars & Pubs

GENERAL INFORMATION

There are no set rules for tipping in Germany. In most cases a service charge is included in the price of meals in restaurants. Tipping can vary from place to place and, depending on the 96

quality of service, can range from rounding up to the next euro to 10 percent of the total bill. Always tell the waiter or waitress how much you want to pay. If, say, the bill was €11.70, say "12 euros, please."

You'll get no glass of water from the waiter unless you ask for it. And if you do ask, be sure to specify "Leitungswasser" (tap water) if that's what you want. If you don't do this, the waiter will assume you want mineral water, and you'll find a fancy price for it on your bill. You will find that many restaurants will not serve you tap water as the German always drinks mineral water with fizz!

11. Pets & Pet Care

GENERAL INFORMATION

All cities have their own specific laws regarding dogs and cats. If you live in rented property, the landlord's permission is required before you can keep a pet. As the owner is responsible for anything a pet does, it is recommended that you obtain a personal liability policy for your pets, particularly dogs, as you are subject to lawsuits if they cause an accident.

Dogs

It is recommended that any dog owner should register their pet at <u>TASSO e.V. - Komm zurück! Mit TASSO</u>. Registration is free and highly recommended by all vets: any lost pet is first cross checked on Tasso to locate the owner. European-wide.

All dogs:

- Have to be registered for a dog tax.
- Should not bark during 'rest periods'.
- Have to have an identification number, either on a clearly visible tattoo or as a microchip. The number on this corresponds to one on the proof of examination (European Union requirement.).
- Need a passport and a valid rabies certificate, issued by a licensed veterinarian, if travelling between EU countries.
- Are not allowed in grocery stores, butcher shops and other shops where fresh food is sold. Some Konditorei, or cafes, don't allow them either.
- Need a train ticket for train travel.
- Should be leashed when outside of the owner's property with the exception of dog discharge areas.

Certain breeds of dogs present special problems and most states consider Pit Bulls, Staffordshire Bull Terriers and

American Staffordshire Terriers too dangerous and have banned their import.

For more detailed information on which breeds may be banned and in which states the ban is effective it would be wise to contact a specialist in importing pets. You can also go to: http://bit.ly/1N9su3F for a detailed list of banned breeds and other information about restrictions on dangerous dogs.

Your pet must have a passport to travel within the EU. Ask your vet about issuing a pet passport. All dogs are required to be registered for a dog tax (Hundesteuer) within 50 days of their arrival.

Registration forms can be picked up at Steuerkasse Hamburg, Steinstr. 10, 20095 Hamburg Zimmer 28 (Auskunft) Tel.: 040 42853758 (Only dogs need to be registered, not other house pets.)

Dog excrement bags (Gassibeutel) are available free of charge at all Budnikowsky drug stores at the cash desk and at all recycling centres and it is expected and binding by law that owners pick up their dog waste and dispose of it in the nearest garbage bin. Failure to do so could result in a monetary fine.

CATS

- Have to have an identification number, either on a clearly visible tattoo or as a microchip. This number corresponds to one on the proof of examination. (European Union requirement)
- Need a passport, issued by a licensed veterinarian. If travelling between EU countries, cats need a ticket for train travel.
