

What's on Deck with Fr. Dudek



Well, it's official...

The name of my bulletin article has been cemented for all eternity...

"What's on deck with Fr Dudek."

Your creativity truly impressed me, and I want to thank everyone who took the time to submit a name or two. I pray that I can offer you some words of encouragement, little nuggets to ponder, or help shed light on something through these bulletin

articles.

Fr Bob surprised me when he made an announcement at a couple of Masses this weekend that this pass Sunday, August 22nd was my 100th day as a priest. I was completely humbled by his announcement and kind words.

Looking back over the past 100 plus days, I can't help but feel blessed and humbled by the graces that God has showered on me. I can use many words to describe what my life has been like since May 15th, but the two that continue to come to mind are...Beautifully exhausting.

I begin each day filled with excitement, enthusiasm, and a sense gratitude for everything God has given me throughout my life. However, there is an aspect of this new chapter in my life that I am learning to adjust to. You see, I have never been so immersed in the life of a parish. My parents took me and my siblings to St. Matthew's Church on Detroit's eastside every Sunday. As a family we were never that engaged in the life of our parish. For most of my life, I attended church, but never "Got" involved.

My lack of parish experience is not the norm for most seminarians and priests. A vast majority, if not all, were altar boys, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministries, or a member of one or numerous parish councils before entering the seminary. I was none of these. I practiced my faith, but I didn't embrace the teachings of the laity's involvement in the Church, which came out of Vatican II. If fact, like some of you, I just wasn't aware of the important role Lay people play in the life of the Catholic Church.

The Church believes and teaches that Lay people and the Clergy are children of God, and we are of equal dignity!! We are equally important but play different roles, and no matter the role we play, we are all called to serve God and His people.

HAVE YOU SEEN THE CHOSEN?





If you haven't seen The Chosen, then it's time you do! Watch it yourself and understand what I and others have seen! The Chosen is a multi-season TV drama based on the life of Jesus Christ. The series creator, Dallas Jenkins, digs deeper into the people who encountered Jesus and the perspective is through the eyes of those who met Him. The Chosen shows Jesus in a way that is more "personal, intimate, immediate." For me, Jesus, Mary, and His disciples come to life, and I see their humanity instead of distant biblical characters. Now, when I read or hear the Gospels, I visualize the passages with the actors from *The Chosen* playing the parts. For the first time for me, in a greater way, the Gospels have come to LIFE! The first season introduces Jesus and the calling of His initial disciples. Saint Gregory the Great's Story

Gregory was the prefect of Rome before he was 30. After five years in office he resigned, founded six monasteries on his Sicilian estate, and became a Benedictine monk in his own home at Rome. At the age of 50, he was elected pope by the clergy and people of Rome.


Gregory was direct and firm. He removed unworthy priests from office, forbade taking money for many services, emptied the papal treasury to ransom prisoners of the Lombards and to care for persecuted Jews and the victims of plague and famine. He was very concerned about the conversion of England, sending 40 monks from his own monastery.

In his own down-to-earth preaching, Gregory was skilled at applying the daily Gospel to the needs of his listeners. Called "the Great," Gregory has been given a place with Augustine, Ambrose, and Jerome, as one of the four key doctors of the Western Church.

An Anglican historian has written: "It is impossible to conceive what would have been the confusion, the lawlessness, the chaotic state of the Middle Ages without the medieval papacy; and of the medieval papacy, the real father is Gregory the Great."


