ACT Focus

Tip of the Week: Eliminate Answer Choices Before Guessing



The number one rule of guessing on the ACT is **try to minimize your guessing**. When you come across a question that stumps you:

- **1. Use the process of elimination.** The more choices you can cross off, the better your chances of getting the question right will be.
- **2. Read all the answer choices.** Sometimes a question that seems difficult will be less so after you review the options you are given.

When it comes down to it, the ACT only tests basic academic skills. Even if a question appears to ask about an unfamiliar subject, you might be able to solve it using simple logic. If you can only find one answer choice that's clearly incorrect, you'll still have a better shot at guessing the right answer from the remaining three choices, so don't be afraid - go for it!
