# Our Community

St. Xavier High School, founded in 1831, is a Catholic college preparatory school for young men conducted by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Students enrolled at St. Xavier reside in all areas of greater Cincinnati, including northern Kentucky and southeastern Indiana. The student body is approximately 80 percent Roman Catholic. The remaining 20 percent of students includes other Christian denominations and the Jewish, Hindu, Buddhist, and Islamic faiths.

#### **GRADUATE AT GRADUATION**

To guide every facet of curriculum development at St. Xavier, the faculty has produced this summary statement of the characteristics that the graduate will have acquired during his time at the school. #### **ADMISSION**

Admission to St. Xavier is selective based upon a qualifying examination and previous academic performance.

#### **DIVERSITY**

There is a 20% minority population in the school. More than 76 zip codes are represented within St. Xavier High School's student body. In addition, students attend St. Xavier from three different states.

#### **FINANCIAL AID**

40 percent of the students receive tuition assistance through St. Xavier's financial aid program. Last year students were awarded 4.6 million dollars in financial aid.

#### SIZE AND ACADEMIC RIGOR

All 1,400 young men at St. Xavier High School are enrolled in an authentic college preparatory program. Historically, 99 percent of graduates each year enter a four-year college or university program.

#### **ACCREDITATION**

St. Xavier High School is accredited by the Ohio Catholic School Accrediting Association, AdvancED, and the Ohio Department of Education.

#### **INFORMATION REGARDING COVID-19**

St. Xavier High School transitioned to emergency remote learning for the fourth quarter of the 2019-2020 academic year. Grades were still recorded and calculated consistent with previous academic quarters.

- 1/2 unit of Physical Education
- 1/2 unit of Health
- 1/4 unit of Oral Communication
- 1/4 unit of Computer Science

#### **IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE**

- Advanced Placement courses are ordinarily available ONLY TO JUNIORS AND SENIORS. Select freshmen are placed in AP World History. Admission to these courses is competitive and is based upon past performance/testing, and, in all cases, approval of the Instructor.
- Even the most rigorous senior schedule would rarely include more than 3-4 AP courses.
- Junior students may elect to enroll in United States History/Morality which is both a social studies class (US History) and a Religion class (Morality and Social Justice). This class also has a community service component.
