



Boy, was June and July a busy, dizzy time around our house in Colorado Springs. Normally, between 6:30 and 7:00AM every morning, our twelve year old Golden Retriever (Dani) would come upstairs from his bedroom and let me know that it was potty and breakfast time. On the morning of June 4th, no Dani looking for me, this was not right. I went downstairs and found him laying on his bed, not able to move, with his big beautiful eyes looking at me. He talked to me with his eyes but could not move anything else. This was not the Dani that I spent many hours a day with. I tried to bribe him with words like treat, dog park, ride in the car --- normally when he heard these words his ears would pop up, but no ear movement this time. I got one of my neighbors to help me move Dani onto a blanket, carry him up the stairs and put him in the back of my car. Off to the emergency pet hospital we went. On the way there I had to change lanes, I looked into my mirrors to make sure a lane change was okay. What a surprise when I looked into my rear view mirror and there was Dani standing up in the back of the car, looking at me. When we arrived at pet hospital they brought out a stretcher and took him inside. After a couple of hours working on him, they told me that the had to put him on life support. I told them to unplug him, within seconds he was gone. They said that he had some type of mass growth in his abdomon that burst or ruptured. I still find myself calling or looking for him, he was definitely an active member of our family.

Our 12 year old grandson from Virginia arrived to spend the summer with us, boy was he lost without his buddy Dani to play with every day. We really enjoyed his visit.

During July, we buried my last Aunt, my father's younger sister. That leaves us with only one Uncle left, my father's younger brother. Whe hope and pray that he sticks around for awhile, when we lose him, my parent's generation is gone. We miss them all and think and talk about the good times we enjoyed with them.

Between COVID and family health problems we've had to cancel many planned trips to Utah. Our next planned Utah trip is in September for our proposed Classmate Luncheon, visit relatives and friends in Davis County, visit relatives and friends in Salt Lake City area, then head south to Millard County to visit relatives and friends (from Colorado to Utah we use I-80, from Utah back to Colorado we use I-70 closing the loop). Study on Diastolic Blood Pressure - Intensive lowering of diastolic blood pressure - the bottom reading in blood pressure measurements - does not appear to be linked to an increased risk of heart attacks and other adverse cardiovascular outcomes, according to a large new study. The findings could change how physicians interpret this reading and how some patients with hypertension are treated in the future. The NHLBI's landmark SPRINT study indicated that intensive blood pressure management - lowering systolic blood pressure to less than 120 millimeters of mercury (mm-Hg) - can significantly reduce risk of heart disease, stroke, and death compared to blood pressure targets of less than 140 mm Hg. To determine whether very low diastolic pressure triggered cardiovascular events, researchers analyzed genetic and health data in over 47,000 adult patients enrolled in five study groups worldwide. The patients had a median age of 60 years and 77% were women. The researchers found no evidence of an increased risk of heart attack when a patient's diastolic pressure fell as low as 50 mm Hg. They also found no lower limit of what is considered normal diastolic pressure. As many doctors focus on keeping the bottom reading within the 70 - 90 mm Hg range, reasearchers suggest that some patients with high blood pressure may have been undertreated in the past.
