Pathway—Patient Care—198

Medical Core Honors—Concentrator

Grade Level: 9-12 Course # 7900C2 Year Class Prereauisite: None Meets a-g College-Preparatory Elective (g) requirement & Honors

Articulated with Coastline College

Students will learn the concepts and techniques used in the healthcare field as well as the foundation of the terms and skills used as an emergency medical technician (EMT), medical assistant, hospital worker, lab assistant, and many other healthcare careers.

Medical Hospital Careers Internship—Capstone

Earns 10 credits if internship is completed

Grade Level: 10—12 (Age 16+) Prerequisite: Medical Core Honors

Course # 7922CC Semester Class Does not meet a-g College requirements

This course is designed to prepare students for employment opportunities in health care facilities in the area of therapeutic, diagnostic, and supportive services. Through classroom instruction, and on-the-job training in medical facilities and some hospitals, student will receive training, including CPR certification, that will prepare them to secure entry -level employment or pursue advanced training. Internship outside of class hours required.

Information and Communication Technologies

Pathway—Systems Programming—174A

Programming & Coding—Concentrator Grade level: 9—12 Prerequisite: None Does not meet a-g College requirements

Course # 8131CC

This hands-on, lab-oriented course will introduce students to the fundamentals of computer programming while exploring some of the basic concepts of Computer Science.

AP Computer Science Principles—Concentrator

Grade level: 9-12 Course# 2472 Prereauisite: None Year Class Meets a-g Science (d) requirement; Receives Weighted GPA for AP, and Potential college credit if passes AP Exam

This course introduces students to a variety of careers which computer science touches, while developing skills to decompose problems, analyze algorithms, and reflect on the impact of computing on society, economy, &

AP Computer Science A-Capstone

Grade level: 10-12 Course # 2470 Prerequisite: AP Computer Science Principles Year Class Meets a-g Math (c) requirement; Receives Weighted GPA for AP, and Potential college credit if passes AP Exam

This course introduces students to computer science with fundamental topics that include problem solving, design strategies and methodologies, organization of data, approaches to processing data, analysis of potential solutions, and the ethical and social implications of computing.

App Development-Capstone

Grade level: 10-12 Course # 8135 Prerequisite: AP Computer Science Principles Year Class

Meets a-g College-Preparatory Elective (g) requirement

This course allows students to gain real world experience using industry level software to build apps that can be run on Apple products, using curriculum designed and created by Apple Education.

Public Services

Pathway—Emergency Response—233

Intro to Emergency Medicine—Concentrator

Grade Level: 9-12 Course # 8421CC Prerequisite: None Semester Class

Does not meet a-g College requirements

This course prepares students to provide prehospital assessment and care for patients of all ages with a variety of medical conditions and traumatic injuries. This course also provides a foundation and prepares students who are interested in pursuing training as a Fire Fighter and many law enforcement programs.

Emergency Medical Technician Honors—Capstone

Course # 8422CC Grade Level: 12th grade only Prerequisite: None Semester Class Meets a-g College-Preparatory Elective (g) requirement & Honors

Weighed

This competency-based course prepares students for entry-level positions in the pre-hospital care industry. This course is part of a sequence of courses aimed at achieving a course completion certificate. Students are then eligible to participate in the National Registration Examination.

Why take a CTE Course?

CTE courses are sequenced to create pathways for students in a course of study which can lead to employment and post-secondary education opportunities.

How are CTE classes taught?

CTE classes are conducted in classrooms equipped to industry standards or, in some cases, actual business and industry locations.

Can I get credit for taking CTE classes?

CTE courses earn high school graduation credits. CTE offers many UC a-g approved courses. Some courses are UC Honors Weighted. Some are articulated with local community colleges and offer students the opportunity for early college credits.

Will I get a job?

Your CTE course will include employment job search skills. Some courses offer internships and on-the-job training with businesses. Some CTE courses offer industry certifications which will enhance students' resumes.


CTE Course Sequencing

Students must complete all courses in a pathway in order to become a pathway completer. A pathway usually consists of concentrator and capstone courses. Students in a pathway with 3 courses must complete all 3 courses.

Introductory Course - A CTE beginning level introductory course which contains introductory concepts required to build foundational and general knowledge.

Concentrator Course - A CTE course beyond the introductory level that is intended to provide more in-depth instruction and exploration of a specific industry sector.

Capstone Course - The final course in a planned sequence of courses that provides a rigorous and intensive culmination of a course of study.



SADDLEBACK = An Articulated Course is one in which the high school teacher and the college faculty have "formally agreed" that the high school course outline, syllabus, textbook, mid-term and/or final exam are comparable to those in a college course and that the final exam score will be used as a credit-by-exam for the comparable college course.

Design, Visual, & Media Arts Pathway—Graphic Design—111A

Multimedia Production—Introductory

Grade Level: 9—12 Course # 5621
Prerequisite: None Year Class
Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement

Articulated with Saddleback College

This course is designed for students in the active creation and production of original artistic designs, digital illustrations and graphic media. Technical training in Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator, InDesign, Corel Draw, DTG, sublimation, 3D printing, plotting, screen printing, and laser cutting

Multimedia Design Honors—Concentrator

Grade Level: 10—12 Course # 7217CC

Prerequisite: Multimedia Production Year Class

Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement & Honors Weighted

Articulated with Saddleback College

Students will work on projects using skills learned in prior digital graphics classes, including designing and producing playbills, catalogs, posters, t-shirts, banners and wall murals. Students will learn new design techniques using Adobe Suite and Corel Draw and will be exposed to printing on a variety of mediums.

 $\underline{\textbf{Multimedia Design Advanced}} - \textbf{Concentrator}$

Grade Level: 10—12 Course # 5714

Prerequisite: Multimedia Design Honors Year Class

Students will work on projects that include designing and producing playbills, catalogs, posters, t-shirts, banners and wall murals, etc. Students will learn new design techniques using Adobe Suite and Corel Draw and be exposed to printing on a variety of mediums.

3D Media Design Honors—Capstone
Grade Level: 9—12 Course # 5751
Prerequisite: Multimedia Design Honors Year Class
Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement & Honors Weighted
Articulated with Saddleback College

This course is concerned with visualization and creation of 3D computer generated models and their applications in today's manufacturing, multimedia, communications, and publishing industries. Students will learn how to create a variety of 3D geometric models from technical drawings, sketches, and real models.

Design, Visual, & Media Arts

Pathway—Visual/Commercial Arts—111C

Art Production 2—Concentrator

Grade Level: 9—12 Course # 7217
Prerequisite: None Year Class

Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement

Students will investigate drawing and painting techniques including; palette painting, reductive drawing, mixed media, digital painting, and new media. This course is for students interested in advanced art as a career study and portfolio development through media experimentation.

AP Studio Art—2D Design—Capstone

Grade Level: 10—12 Course # A439
Prerequisite: Art Production 2 Year Class
Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement, Receives Weighted
GPA for AP, and Potential college credit if passes AP Exam

Students build a body of work that shows evidence of principles of design and original ideation using photography, painting, digital painting, or mixed media. Students will submit a portfolio of artwork and written art intended for evaluation as part of the AP exam.

AP Studio Art-Drawing-Capstone

Grade Level: 10—12 Course # A438

Prerequisite: Art Production 2 Year Class

Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement, Receives Weighted

GPA for AP, and Potential college credit if passes AP Exam

Students build a body of work that shows evidence of principles of design and original ideation using mark-making in a variety of media. Students will submit a portfolio of artwork and written art intended for evaluation as part of the AP exam.

Art Entrepreneurship—Capstone

Grade Level: 11—12 Course # 7218
Prerequisite: Art Production 2 Year Class

Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement

This course will offer the tools for students to become self-sufficient artist entrepreneurs. This course is designed to introduce students to marketing art and services including the following: social marketing; exhibition design; online portfolio development; and branding.

Performing Arts Pathway—Professional Theatre—112C

<u>Theatre Performance</u>—Concentrator

Grade Level: 9—12 Course # 7238

Prerequisite: None Semester or Year

Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement

Students learn discipline specific skills and build confidence through participation in a professional-style rehearsal process, culminating in public performances of a fully staged play or musical. Students may have the opportunity to work with guest directors and choreographers. This course meets in the evenings and on weekends.

Musical Theatre—Capstone

Grade Level: 10-12 Course # 5742

Prerequisite: Theatre Performance Year Class

Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement

Articulated with Saddleback College SADDLEBAN COLLEGE

Students will study the major principles of musical theatre and will hone their performance skills as they relate to musical theatre. Techniques will be developed through various exercises as well as preparation and performance of a wide range of material. This is an academic and performance based class. This course meets after school.

Theatre II—Capstone

Grade Level: 10-12 Course # 5743
Prerequisite: Theatre Performance Year Class

Meets a-g Visual & Performing Arts (f) requirement
Articulated with Saddleback College

Students build on preparation, rehearsal, and performance skills through practical experience as actors, directors, and playwrights. Students will closely analyze text and expand their range as actors and playwrights. Coursework can include monologue or scene study, musical theatre, theatre history, audition technique, and improvisation. This course meets after school.


