



The Big Picture with Fr. Bob



Dear Friends,

This Monday, we celebrate Labor Day. The Church has always recognized the value of labor. The following are excerpts from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (Liguori Publications, copyright 1994). It speaks eloquently on the importance of work. I hope the following quotes will remind each of

us that work is not just about getting a paycheck.

Paragraph 2427 Human work proceeds directly from persons created in the image of God and called to prolong the work of creation of subduing the earth, both with and for one another. Hence work is a duty. Work honors the Creator's gifts and the talents received from him. It can also be redemptive. By enduring the hardship of work in union with Jesus, the carpenter of Nazareth and the one crucified on Calvary, man collaborates in a certain fashion with the Son of God in his redemptive work.

Paragraph 2428 In work, the person exercises and fulfills in part the potential inscribed in his nature.

Paragraph 2429 Everyone has the *right of economic initiative*; everyone should make legitimate use of his talents to contribute to the abundance that will benefit all and to harvest the just fruits of his labor.

Paragraph 2433 Access to employment and to professions must be open to all without unjust discrimination: men and women, healthy and disabled, natives and immigrants. For its part society should, according to circumstances, help citizens find work and employment.

Paragraph 2434 A just wage is the legitimate fruit of work. To refuse or withhold it can be a grave injustice. Remuneration for work should guarantee man the opportunity to provide a dignified livelihood for himself and his family on the material, social, cultural, and spiritual level..." (Gaudium et spes: Vatican II document)

When you wake up this Tuesday and you are getting ready for work, remember what you have just read. Let us also remember to pray for those among us who are seeking employment.



Bird's Eye View with Fr. Pellican



"The Lord God took man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it" (Gen 2:15). This quote from the Bible's creation narrative reveals a fundamental truth, that work is an integral part of human life. In the next chapter,

we hear about the fall of Adam and Eve and discover that work becomes burdensome and difficult as a result of sin (Gen 3:17-19). My last few summers before entering seminary were packed with work, hard work. I worked both in small-scale residential construction as well as on a hay and cattle farm. I also raised pigs on the side, and grew much of their food. Most days I went to bed pretty tired, but it was a good kind of tired. I could look back on the day knowing that I had accomplished something. I was also at this time beginning to pray Compline, part of the Breviary prayed before bed. One of the lines repeated every night is: "Lord, now you let your servant go in peace, your word has been fulfilled." I found this to be a very beautiful prayer at the end of a day of hard work. Through the work of the day I was not just accomplishing something that had to get done. I was fulfilling God's word, His plan for humanity and for me as articulated from the very beginning of the Scriptures.

For many of us, our work is more intellectual than physical, but if we invest ourselves, those beautiful words of Compline still apply. Whatever work we find occupying our time, the Scriptures and Catholic Social Teaching affirm its dignity, that it is more than just something we do to be productive, to support ourselves and family, if we have one. This is important, but work is also meant to be fulfilling. This is why the Church was such a strong voice sticking up for factory workers in the midst of the industrial revolution. There was a recognition that people must be treated with dignity, not as mere 'cogs in the machine.' They needed a just wage, and time away from work to spend with God and family. As we celebrate Labor Day, we thank God for the great progress which has been made in our country towards treating all workers with justice, we thank Him for the ways we are able to find fulfillment in our work, and we remember in our prayers all those who are in need of employment.



New in 2021-2022, the Church of the Divine Child invites you, your family, and your friends to participate at one or more of our "D.C. Service Days!" Join us in performing corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and answering our Lord Jesus's call to love one another. You can find more information about these (and future) D.C. Service Days – and sign up to serve – on our parish website, under the brand-new Christian Service tab.

Saturday, September 18 – D.C. Service Day at the Pope Francis Center (downtown Detroit)

- Located in the heart of downtown Detroit, the Pope Francis Center provides vital services to individuals experiencing homelessness. On an average day, it welcomes nearly 200 guests and provides them with nutritious meals, showers, laundry, and access to doctors, dentists, lawyers, and housing providers through its free clinics.
- We'll serve the guests of the Pope Francis Center, providing help with meal prep and service, coordinating laundry and showers for guests, and assisting with other special projects.
- We'll meet in the convent parking lot at 6:00-6:15 a.m., and car pool to the Pope Francis Center, arriving at the Pope Francis Center at 6:45 a.m.
- After finishing up our service at approximately 11:15 a.m., we'll drive back to D.C., arriving "home" at approximately 11:45 a.m. It's not even noon, and you've fed the hungry, given drink to the thirsty, clothed the naked, and sheltered the homeless. That's 4 out of 7 corporal works of mercy great job!

Sunday, November 7 – D.C. Service Day at St. Hedwig Catholic Cemetery (Dearborn)

- Help us to perform a grounds clean-up at St. Hedwig Catholic cemetery, during the month in which we remember and pray for the dead. Singles, couples, and families are welcome to serve with us.
- We'll meet in the convent parking lot at 11:45 a.m., and car pool to the cemetery. We'll return to D.C. at approximately 4 p.m. Please bring your own rake and broom, and hand-held gardening tools such as a trowel for digging around buried headstones.

Saturday-Sunday, December 11-12 – Christmas Present Collection (D.C. Gathering Room)

- This is one of our parish's longest-standing service traditions! During the weekend of December 11-12, we will collect Christmas gifts, to be distributed to several parishes located in Detroit, which will provide the gifts to needy parents, so that their children may have the joy of opening a present on Christmas morning.

FOLLOW ME

Imagine what it would be like to live in Jesus' time and have Him personally invite you to Follow Him. If you are like me, you might have a hard time imagining what it would be like to be called by Christ. However, that all changed when I was recently introduced to the television series "The Chosen." The Chosen shows Jesus in a way that is more "personal, intimate, and immediate." For me, Jesus, Mary, and His disciples come to life, and I see their humanity instead of distant biblical characters. If you have seen The Chosen, you understand what I mean, and if you have not seen it, I encourage you to follow the directions on how to watch The Chosen for FREE.



Being called to serve reminds me of a story that I heard about Mother Theresa of Calcutta. A reporter watched Mother Teresa as she cleaned the maggot-infested wound of a man on the street, only to say, "I wouldn't do what you do for a million dollars." Mother Theresa is supposed to have replied, immediately, with a bit of a wry smile, "I wouldn't either, but I would do it for Jesus."



The reality is that Jesus is calling each of us to Follow Him, to be followers of Christ. He is personally calling us to serve God, not as Mother Theresa serves God, but in a way that is unique to each of us.




