Education Sector Vaccination Guide



Starting February 28, all staff supporting early learning, childcare, K-12 education, and higher education will be eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

Eligibility



- All formal and informal childcare workers, including daycare providers
- All staff in colleges, universities, junior colleges, community colleges, and other post-secondary education facilities
- All staff in educational support services and administration
- All staff in Pre-kindergarten, elementary, middle, and high schools
- All staff in technical and trade schools
- Any other workers involved in child and/or student care, including school bus drivers and monitors, crosswalk guards, etc.

What to Bring to the Appointment




Bring with you a government-issued photo ID showing residence and date of birth, a badge from your work, a paystub, or documentation from your employer. Other forms of documentation may be acceptable to prove eligibility. Check with your provider.

Stay Safe after Vaccination




It is important to continue wearing your mask, washing your hands, and maintaining 6 feet of distance following vaccination. Continue to get tested regularly. Find testing information at www.sccfreetest.org

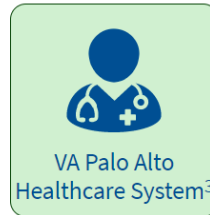
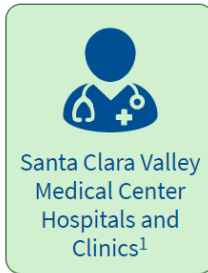

COVID-19 Vaccination Eligibility

Can you attest, under penalty of perjury, that you are a either:

(1) a healthcare worker in Phase 1a of the [CDPH guidelines](#), who lives or works in Santa Clara County?

(2) a resident of a Long-Term Care Facility (LTCF) located in Santa Clara County *

This would include a severe allergic reaction (e.g., anaphylaxis) that required treatment with epinephrine or EpiPen® or that caused you to go to the hospital. It would also include an allergic reaction that occurred within 4 hours that caused hives, swelling, or respiratory distress, including wheezing.

Please Note: If you do not have a government issued ID, you will need to show two of these other documents in order to qualify.

Proof of Eligibility

Please remember to bring documentation with your name and address; also bring a photo ID if possible.

NOTE: On-site vaccine staff are being trained to be flexible with required documentation. The goal is to vaccinate anyone and everyone who lives in Santa Clara County and is eligible to receive the vaccine according to the state priority list.



Did You Know?



- COVID-19 vaccines are free.
- COVID-19 vaccines currently include two doses. Highest immunity starts 1-2 weeks after the second dose of the vaccine.
- Children under 16 are not eligible for the vaccine.
- People who have had COVID-19 should be vaccinated, as long as they have completed their isolation period.
- Frequent COVID-19 testing is important until 85% of the population is vaccinated.
