Fall - (September-November)

- Get familiar with college planning and the admissions process

- Take practice ACT test online. See WXHS website

Winter - (December-February)

- Fill out class requests for junior year
Consider taking Honors/CE/AP
- If you have failed any classes, talk to your counselor about credit recovery options

Spring - (March-May)

If you are off track for graduation,

- consider summer school options (ask your counselor)

Summer - (June-August)

Visit college campuses to see which one appeals to you

- Prepare for the ACT Test - you will want to take it at least twice your junior year
- Work, volunteer or take summer courses to build your resume and gain experience

- Health (.5 Credits)
- Physical Education (1 Credit)
- Fit for Life (.5 Credits)

- Career and Technical (CTE) (1.0 Credit)
- Digital Studies (.5 Credits)
- Financial Literacy (.5 Credits)
- Electives (8.5 Credits)

THINGS TO KNOW:

CE (Concurrent Enrollment): College classes taught at WXHS for \$5/credit hour + application fee. See your counselor about admission requirements.

AP (Advanced Placement): College level courses. Credit earned by passing test in May. Test cost is \$95.

Early College at Weber: WSU's Early College program allows high school students to take university courses on one of their campuses. You can earn university credit that may also apply toward your high school graduation requirements. <https://www.weber.edu/earlycollege/>
