ASSEMBLY BILL 104

- Provides allowances for families and students who have been negatively affected academically by the COVID-19 Pandemic some options:
 - Grade Change from letter grade to Pass / No-Pass
 - Retention of Students
 - Websites have been updated with this information
 - Notifications to parents have gone out
 - Fillable forms are located on the website
 - Forms are to be returned and processed by the Principal

CONTINUITY OF LEARNING PLAN

- Canvas is the Learning Management System (LMS) for grades TK-12
 - An LMS connects students to Content, Curriculum, Instruction, Assessment & Communication
 - This system automates the delivery of all materials needed to master content standards or complete course requirements no matter if the class is held in-person or on-line or a combination of the two.
 - Elementary, Intermediate and High School Teachers will host their course contents outline and all course materials, assignments and grades.
 - Canvas calendars will be utilized for assignments.
 - Intermediate & High School Teacher canvas grades will be updated weekly
 - Resources and assignments will be uploaded for quarantining and isolating students.

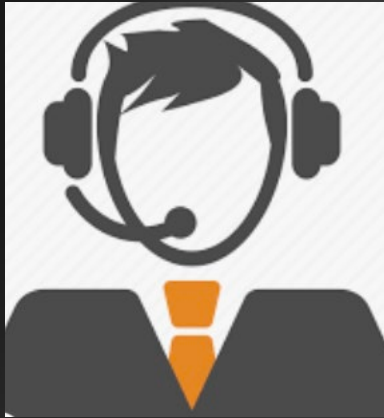

GENERAL STAFF/STUDENT COVID PROTOCOLS

- Stay home if experiencing symptoms or illness
- Frequent handwashing or sanitizing
- Masks must be worn indoors at all times – unless eating or alone in closed space
- Social distancing is not required - TCUSD encourages physical distance wherever feasible
- Take the self-symptom screener in Parent/Student Square prior to attending work/school
- Temperature screening at entrances is no longer required
- Avoid sharing materials or equipment
- Limit visitors on campus – no campus volunteers – no campus animals

FACILITY / SCHOOL SITE COVID PROTOCOLS

- Sanitation solutions and materials meet Cal OSHA, CDC, EPA and LACDPH guidelines
- Crowd reduction wherever possible
- No indoor Facility Use Contract approval
- Site inspections by JPA, Facility Audit & LACDPH audit
- Each facility is sanitized and sprayed with electrostatic sprayers daily
- Updated signage, postings and notifications
- "Strike Team" for positive case reported on site or in the event of an outbreak
- Updated ventilation system filters to Merv-11 and Aerus Pure Clean Air Purifying Systems in each classrooms/offices

PROGRAMMATIC COVID PROTOCOLS

- Virtual Back to School Night for all schools (dates will be selected)
- PTA & School Site Council will schedule activities with Principal and meetings should be held virtually
- If you are performing as a group, rehearsals, practices, performances and need to remove masks, social distancing is required in an outdoor venue. If activity is conducted indoors, physical distancing required and masks remain on. Supervision required for all students.

Section 5 of Article IX of the State of California Constitution guarantees students a "free public education". The State Supreme Court concluded in the 1984 case of Hartzell v. Connell, "that all educational activities carried on by public school districts, extra-curricular as well as curricula, must be without cost to the students who participate in such activities". This same ruling found that "mandatory fees for participating in such extra-curricular activities as drama, music, and athletic competition were illegal under the State Constitution". Furthermore, they also rejected the argument that "fees could be charged so long as the district waived fees for students who were financially unable to pay". Recent proposed legislation includes reimbursement with interest for any illegally-collected fees as well as a district sanction.

The school principal is responsible for informing the school staff, students, parents, and community of this right and for ensuring that all written and oral communications reflect this right. Document and keep evidence of all agendas that include this item as well as those in attendance.

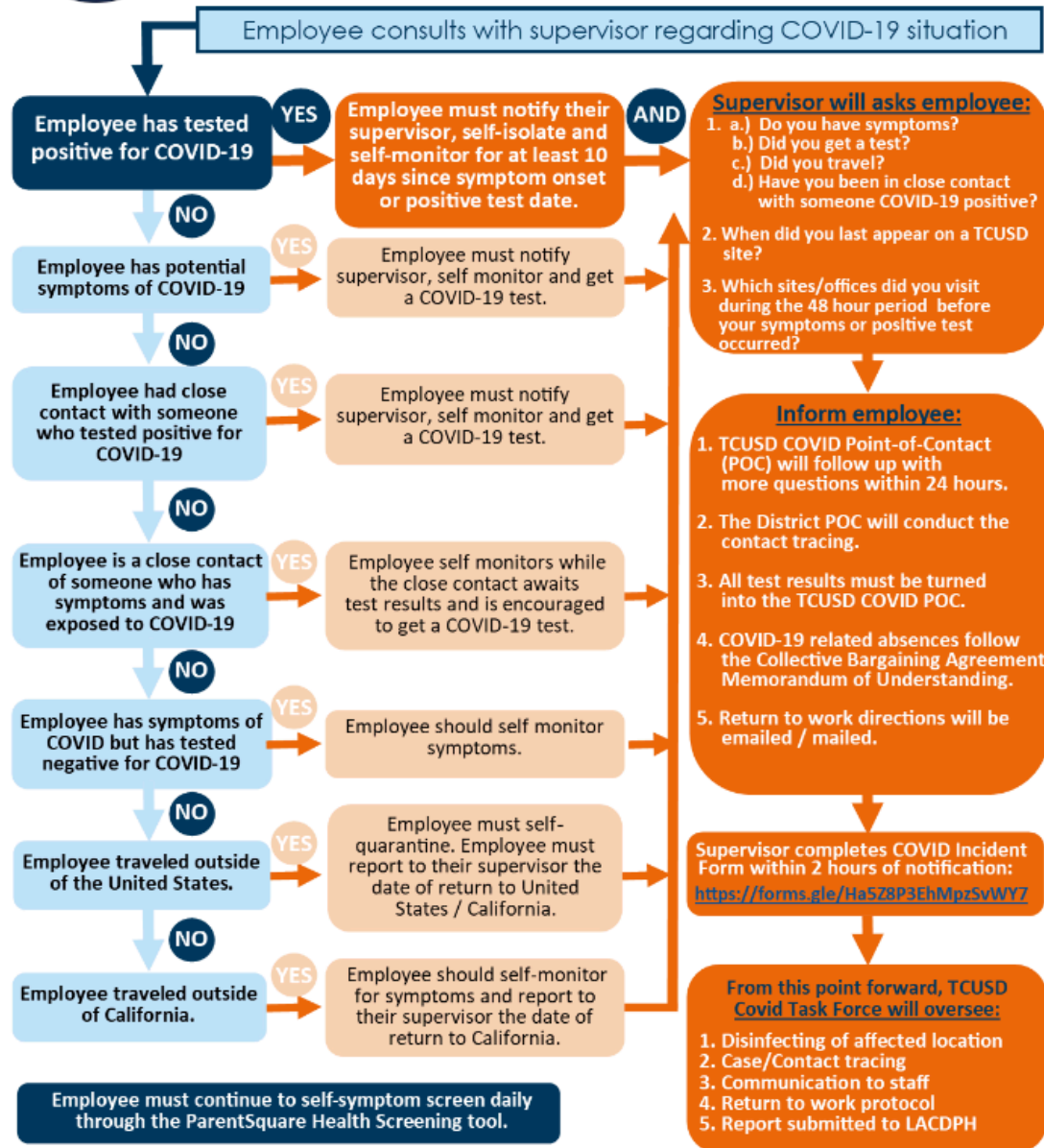

Supervisor Response to Potential or Confirmed COVID-19 Case Exposure

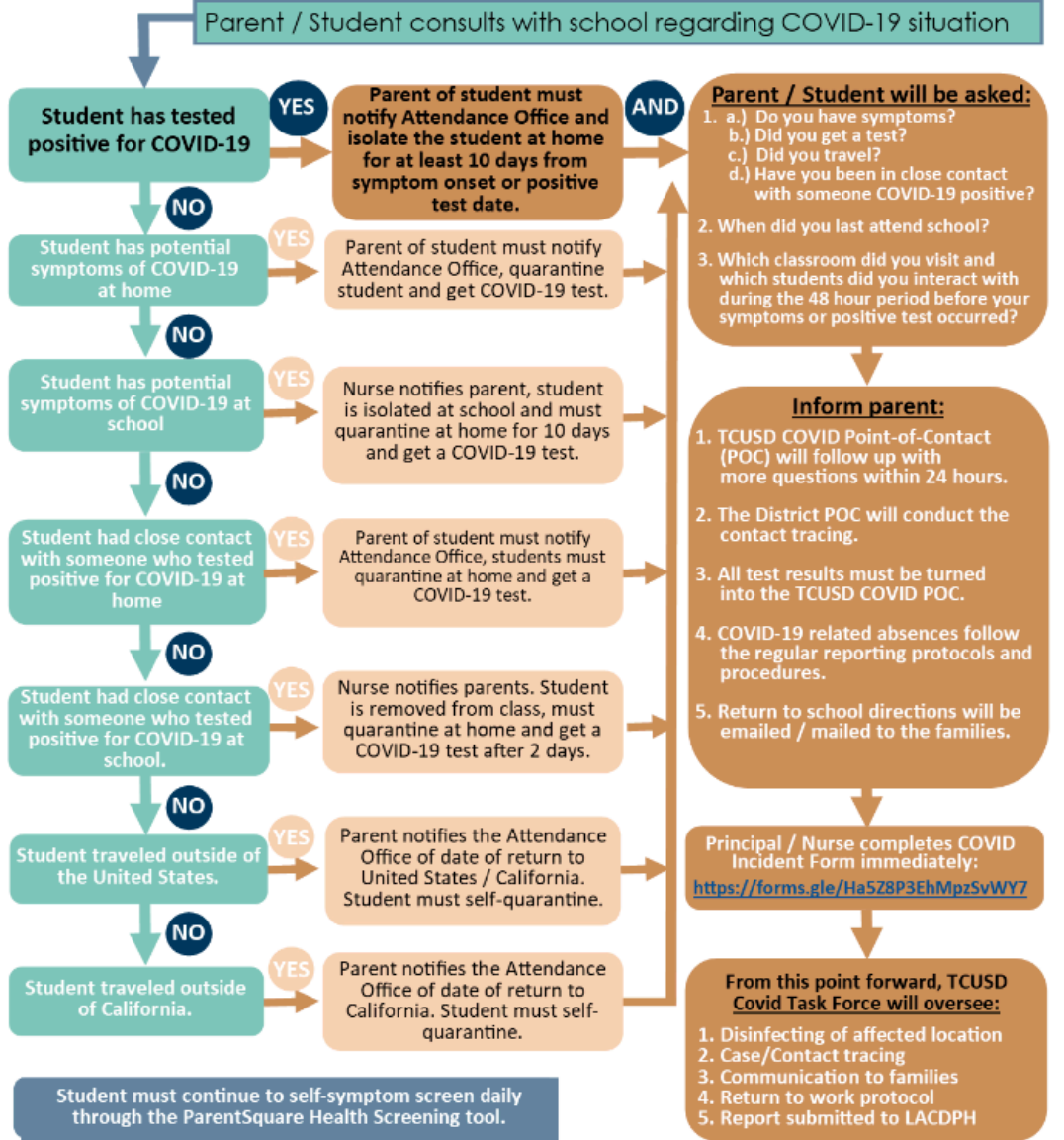


STUDENT TRAINING DIAGRAM OF RESPONSE TO EXPOSURE

Governor Newsom Announces Vaccine Verification for Education Staff

On August 11, 2021, Governor Gavin Newsom issued a new [public health order](#) requiring all school employees in public and private K-12 schools (excluding child care and higher education institutions) to verify vaccination status of all employees, or test on a weekly basis, as a means to prevent the further spread of COVID-19 and align with the state's commitment to safe, in-person instruction.

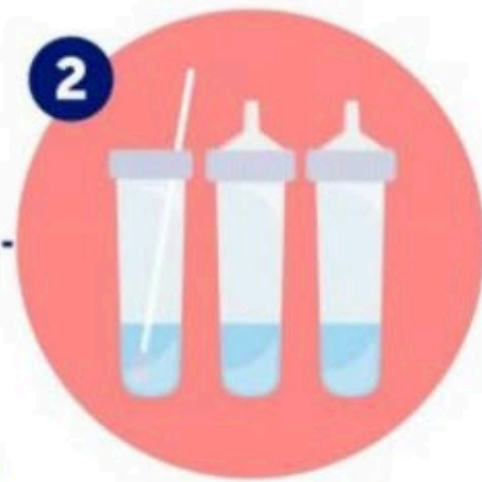
This order will take effect on August 12, 2021, with full compliance required by October 15, 2021. Here are pertinent points provided by the governor in response to questions posed at today's press conference:

Mucus sample is swabbed from the nose or throat.



2
Sample is mixed with a lysis buffer.

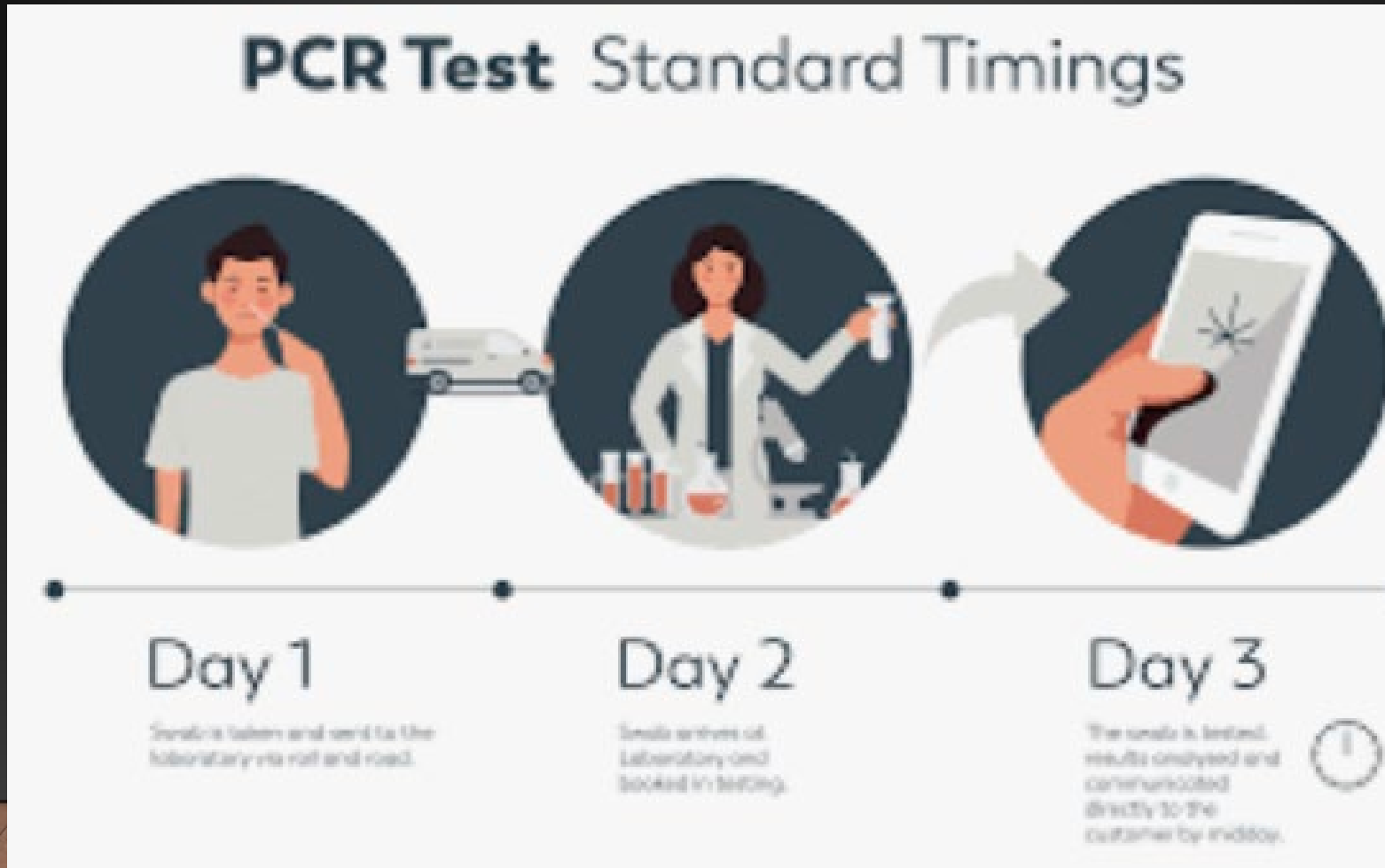


3
The sample is placed on a strip, card, or slide that contains reagents.

Viral antigens are detected based on the amount of fluorescence.
