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Phonics – Listening walk

Learning challenge - to be able to listen carefully to what you can hear outside or in your house.

Let's go on a listening walk!

Have a go at creeping around your garden or around your house and listen carefully to all the sounds you can hear. Tell a grown-up all the things you can hear. How many things can you hear?

Can you hear a bird? Can you hear cars? Can you hear the washing machine?





Remember:

For you to be successful at the learning walk you need to listen very carefully.

English – Colour Monster

Learning challenge:

Find the story of the Colour Monster on your chair. What do you think this story might be about? Have any of them read it before?

The Color Monster - Read Aloud by Mr. Joshua Brooks - YouTube

Read the story the whole way through (or watch the video), pausing on each of the pages when the feeling changes.

Have a short discussion about what might make them feel that way - for example "mummy cuddles make me happy" or "when I fall over I am sad".



Remember:

- To think about what you can see – what might it mean?
- Talk about some of the different feelings - have you ever felt this way? Why?

Maths – Number 1

Learning challenge: to recognise and understand the number 1

Have a look at the number below. What number is this? Have you ever seen it before?

It is the number 1. Can you find different objects in your house and try and make sure that you count 1 of each object.

Get someone to count a big group of objects for you and then make sure that you only counting one into your group. Which group has more? The group with 1 or the group you counted from?


Learning challenge - to listen carefully to the sounds to think about what you think the sound might be.

Learning challenge – to play Ispy with another person listening carefully to what colour the object

'I spy with my little eye something beginning with...'.

Remember:

- To listen carefully to the colour of the object you are looking for.
- To take it in turns to play the game.

English

Learning challenge:

Thinking back to the story book – can you talk about who the main character is? What is his name? What does he look like?

Can you have a go at drawing or creating your own colour monster? What colours might you need? Can you remember what some of the colours represent?

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Remember:

- To think about who the book is about – can you remember his name?
- To draw your own representation and talk about the colours you are using.

Maths: Number hunt!

Learning challenge: to spot the number 1 and 2 outside and in your house.

Now that you have become experts on the number 1 and 2 have a go at going on your very own number hunt!

When you are outside or in your house see if you can spot the number 1 or 2. You could tell someone what you have seen or have a go at drawing a picture to show where you saw the number.



Remember:

- Make sure that you are counting carefully when you are counting objects
- Make sure you are saying the right number name for each number that you are spotting.

Morning physical activit

Phonics – listening walk

Learning challenge: to listen attentively during a listening walk.

Go on another listening walk, will you go somewhere else for you listening walk? Will you hear the same things or hear something different? What do you think you might hear?

This time can you have a go at drawing what you have heard during your listening walk.



Remember:

- To think about what you heard last time and compare it to what you heard this time.
- Use shapes to represent what you want to draw.
- Begin to hold your pencil correctly using a tripod grip.

English

Learning challenge:

In the story, the colour monster puts his feelings into jars. Can you have a go at making your own jars to represent happy and calm?

What colour will happy need to be?

What colour will calm need to be?

You can create the jars by drawing pictures in the colours that you need, you could use paint, colouring or collage!





Remember:

- To talk about the colours and what the colours represent.
- To create your jars in a way that you want to show the feelings.

Maths – counting objects

Learning challenge: to count objects to match numbers 1 and 2

Using your number cards get someone to count 1 or two objects for you, which number card would the objects match too? Have a go with some other objects.

Now have a go at choosing the object that you would like to count and decide whether you are going to count 1 or 2, which number card would these match too?

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Remember:

- Make sure that you are counting carefully when you are counting objects
- When counting make sure that you are pointing to each object as you say a number name.
- Put your objects in a line to help with your counting
