## **What do I do if I believe my account got hacked?**

If you believe your account has been hacked, please change your password as soon as possible and verify that the email address and phone number associated with your account are accurate in Snapchat settings. (Can report as well. Go to links in other box)

## **What do I have to do to have something removed?**

If anything inappropriate happens or harassment with another account you can report them by going on their website. Here are some specific to what may concern you:

If you receive any spam Snaps, including advertisements and fake promotions. Be sure to include the username of the account that sent the Snap. If the Snap included a website address or other identifying information.

## **What can I and what can I not Snapchat to each other?**

### **What not to Snap:**

- Pornography
- Nudity or sexually suggestive content involving minors (people under the age of 18)
- Minors engaged in activities that are physically dangerous and harmful
- Invasions of privacy
- Threats
- Harassment or Bullying
- Impersonation
- Self-Harm

### **What to Snap:**

- Having fun with friends
- Sharing great moments

## **What are the penalties for the person who makes/sends the post?**

- That person may result in the removal of their content, the suspension of their account and being prohibited from using Snapchat in the future.

## **How does Snapchat have a problem with bullying?**

- The biggest draw to using Snapchat as a cyber-bullying technique is the fact that pictures and videos disappear within 10 seconds after being viewed. Bullies don't want to leave any evidence of what they are doing at the risk of being caught.
