

How to Help Your Child with Bullying on Twitter



Twitter



TIPS:

- Make your account private
- Screenshot any rude tweets
- Don't reply to any rude messages you receive
- Block users, it will prevent that person from following you or seeing your profile picture on their profile page or in their timeline
- Change your username
- Contact the police if it's threatening: document the abusive messages with print-outs or screenshots, be as specific about why you are concerned, provide who you believe might be involved, give information regarding previous threats you may have received
- Unfollow the person bullying
- Delete your account

WHAT ARE THE PENALTIES?

Most social networking sites including twitter don't allow bullying and other abusive behaviors, to report any abusive behavior, copy the terms and conditions and take a screenshot of the comment or photo as evidence. It depends on how bad the incident is on what the penalties are.

What are the policies regarding inappropriate content on Twitter?

- Twitter does not prohibit bullying or abusive behaviors.

What do you have to do to have something removed?

- If it is your account you can delete it yourself by clicking the trashcan.
- If it is someone else's account you cannot delete their tweet but you can report it.
