

Quarantine Guidelines WPS 8/19/21

Subject to Change Based on CDC, CTSDE and CT DPH Guidance

Close Contact Definitions	
Student-to-Student Contact - Classroom Only*	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Within 3 feet of infected person ● 15 minutes cumulatively over 24 hours ● *If within 3-6 feet of infected person AND ● Masks worn properly AND ● No symptoms for exposed person, then no quarantine
Student-to-Student Contact - Outside Classroom Student-to-Adult Contact - All Settings Adult-to-Adult Contact - All Settings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Within 6 feet of infected person ● 15 minutes cumulatively over 24 hours ● Regardless of masks on/off
Quarantine Recommendations Per CDC	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 14-day quarantine from date of last contact with infected person (contact date = day 0) 	
Other Quarantine Options	
If Vaccinated:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●
If Recovered from COVID-19 AND <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● + result was in the last 3 months, AND ● Person has recovered, AND ● Person has no COVID symptoms, THEN: 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● No quarantine required, but: ● Monitor symptoms for 14 days from last contact ● Test with a PCR (NO RAPID) day 3-5 after exposure ● Wear a mask until negative test result is received ● If symptoms develop at any point, immediately isolate and contact physician
Unvaccinated, 10-day Option	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 10-day quarantine ● Monitor symptoms through day 14 ● If symptoms develop, immediately isolate and contact physician
Unvaccinated, 7-day Option	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 7-day quarantine ● Take COVID test on or after day 5 ● If negative, end quarantine after day 7, return day 8 ● Monitor symptoms through day 14 ● If symptoms develop, immediately isolate and contact physician No quarantine required, but: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Monitor symptoms for 14 days from last contact ● Test with a PCR (NO RAPID) day 3-5 after exposure ● Wear a mask until negative test result is received ● If symptoms develop at any point, immediately isolate and contact physician
