Louis, Jesse and Jecky all scored 100% on the Intermediate Maths Challenge in February. This enabled them to qualify for the Olympiad Round which was sat at the end of March. Fantastic results and well-deserved.

# OUTDOOR EDUCATION Outer Hebrides Trip

















A small group of Upper and Lower Sixth students enjoyed a spectacular 12 days adventure, walking in the Outer Hebrides in Scotland. They visited the Isles of Uist, Lewis and Harris, explored the Black House Village on Lewis, the 4000 year old Callanish Stones and the Scholars' Path along the Bays on Harris, which was built in 1870 to allow children to go to school They explored spectacular landscapes which changed from sunny beaches to glacial scoured bedrock in under an hours walking, covered an immense distance and endured some impressive blisters!
