



The Big Picture with Fr. Bob



Dear Friends,

Suffering is a mystery we will never fully understand in this lifetime. Now and then, we get glimpses into the reality of the Cross and how it can transform our lives. The following prayer, written in the form of a poem, was found in the pocket of a dead soldier who died during the turbulent years of the Civil War.

"I asked for health. that I might do greater things; I was given infirmity, that I might do better things. . . I asked for riches, that I might be happy; I was given poverty, that I might be wise . . . I asked for power, that I might have the praise of men; I was given weakness. that I might feel the need of God . . . I asked for all things, that I might enjoy life; I was given life, that I might enjoy all things. . . I got nothing I asked for, but everything I hoped for. Almost despite myself, My unspoken prayers were answered. I am among all men most richly blessed."

The soldier who wrote this prayer is not known by name. However, the wisdom he attained during his life concerning suffering has been a guiding light and comfort to many generations.

May the Lord continue to reveal to us truths that draw us ever closer to Him. By our words and actions, may we share those insights in order to also bring light and comfort to others.

Today in the United States, we celebrate Grandparents Day. I think there is a great deposit of wisdom that is shared by grandparents. Younger people may have lots of "head knowledge," but more seasoned people can also speak based on their actual experience. They have weathered many a storm! Grandparents speak with a reassuring voice saying, "Don't worry, it's going to be ok." It is easier to believe those words from someone who has lived through many trials and tribulations. Grandparents often times remind their children and grandchildren to put their trust in God.

May we treasure our grandparents, both living and deceased. We have taken on a number of their characteristics, whether we know it or not.

Here are two sweet quotes pertaining to grandparents:

"Grandfathers are just antique little boys." – unknown

"If nothing is going well, call your grandmother." – Italian Proverb

Even when our grandparents go to their Eternal Reward, we can trust that their loving prayers are being showered down upon us. May we pray for them in return.

On Saturday morning, August 28, I celebrated the Memorial of St. Augustine. He was born in 354, and the impact of his life can still be felt. He was a philosopher, theologian, poet, writer, orator, and saint.

I'm not the sharpest tool in the shed, but I'm wise enough to know that there was nothing I could say that would do St Augustine's life any justice. So, I shared several quotes of his. His words stand true today, as they did when he

wrote them, over 1,591 years after his death.

"The world is a book and those who do not travel read only one page."

"To fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek him the greatest adventure; to find him, the greatest human achievement."

"Right is right even if no one is doing it; wrong is wrong even if everyone is doing it."

"Hope has two beautiful daughters; their names are Anger and Courage. Anger at the way things are, and Courage to see that they do not remain as they are."

"There is no saint without a past, no sinner without a future."

"The measure of love is to love without measure."

"God has promised forgiveness to your repentance, but He has not promised tomorrow to your procrastination."

"The truth is like a lion; you don't have to defend it. Let it loose; it will defend itself."

"God provides the wind, Man must raise the sail."

"Love begins with a smile, grows with a kiss, and ends with a teardrop."

"Patience is the companion of wisdom."

"Understanding is the reward of faith. Therefore, seek not to understand that you may believe, but believe that you may understand."

"Christ is not valued at all, unless he is valued above all."

DIVINE CHILD RELIC OF THE WEEK St. Robert Bellarmine Feast Day ~ September 17

Divine Child has 43 Relics in our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel and St. Robert Bellarmine is one of them! You may view a list of DC's relics located on the bookshelf in the chapel.

Born at Montepulciano, Italy, October 4, 1542, St. Robert Bellarmine was the third of ten children. His mother, Cinzia Cervini, a niece of Pope Marcellus II, was dedicated to almsgiving, prayer, meditation, fasting, and mortification of the body.

Robert entered the newly formed Society of Jesus in 1560 and after his ordination went on to teach at Louvain (1570-1576) where he became famous for his Latin sermons. In 1576, he was appointed to the chair of controversial theology at the Roman College, becoming Rector in 1592; he went on to become Provincial of Naples in 1594 and Cardinal in 1598.

This outstanding scholar and devoted servant of God defended the Apostolic See against the anti-clericals in Venice and against the political tenets of James I of England. He composed an exhaustive apologetic work against the prevailing heretics of his day.

This saint was the spiritual father of St. Aloysius Gonzaga, helped St. Francis de Sales obtain formal approval of the Visitation Order, and in his prudence opposed severe action in the case of Galileo. He has left us a host of important writings, including works of devotion and instruction, as well as controversy. He died in 1621.





The Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health case regarding Mississippi's ban on abortions beyond 15 weeks has drawn great attention, as it may finally return the issue of abortion to the democratic process. Anthony List, Students for Life of America, Thomas More Society, Center for Medical Progress, Democrats for Life of America, and Americans United for Life, among many others have filed briefs to overturn the evil existing jurisprudence on abortion.
