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1	P R E A M B L E
2 3 4 5 6 7	This Agreement is made and entered into between Skykomish School District Number 404 (hereinafter "the District") and Public School Employees of Skykomish, an affiliate of Public School Employees of Washington Service Employees International Union Local 1948 (hereinafter "PSE/SEIU 1948 or "the Union").

10	ARTICLE I
11 12	RECOGNITION AND COVERAGE OF AGREEMENT
12	RECOULTION AND COVERAGE OF AGREEMENT
13	Section 1.1.
15	The District hereby recognizes the Union as the exclusive representative of all employees in the
16	bargaining unit, as described in Section 1.3, and the Union recognizes the responsibility of
17	representing the interests of all such employees.
18	
19	Section 1.2.
20	Descriptions of positions subject to this Agreement shall be provided to the President of the Union
21	upon reasonable request. Job descriptions that are modified by the District which reflect substantial
22	changes impacting the hours, wages, and working conditions of the employee and new job descriptions
23	that are created by the District covering employees under the scope of this Agreement will be made
24	available to the President of the local chapter.
25	
26	Section 1.3.
27	The bargaining unit to which this Agreement is applicable shall consist of all classified employees in
28 29	the following general job classifications: Custodial/Maintenance, Child Nutrition, Transportation, Office Professional, and Paraeducators.
30 31 32	The following classified positions are exempted from the above described bargaining unit: the Business Manager, supervisors, and other persons hired in a substitute, temporary or casual status with
33	the District unless meeting the definition of Section 1.4.
34 35	Section 1.4. Definitions.
36	Section 1.4.1. Classified Substitute Employees.
37 38	Substitute classified employees employed for more than thirty (30) days of work within any
38 39	twelve (12) month period ending during the current or immediately preceding school year, and
40	who continue to be available for employment as substitutes are regular part-time employees of
41	the District and shall be included in the bargaining unit. The following provisions shall
42	constitute the only terms of the Agreement that shall apply to bargaining unit substitutes:

Workday Definition. 8 "Workday" for purposes of this Agreement means days the District office is open during normal 9 operating hours. 10 11 Section 1.5. 12 The District retains the right to terminate the employment of a substitute at its sole discretion. 13 14 15 16 ARTICLE II 17 18 **RIGHTS OF THE EMPLOYER** 19 20 Section 2.1. 21 It is agreed that the customary and usual rights, powers, functions, and authority of management are 22 vested in management officials of the District. Included in these rights in accordance with and subject 23 to applicable laws, regulations, and the provisions of this Agreement, is the right to direct the work 24 force, the right to hire, promote, retain, transfer, and assign employees in positions; the right to 25 suspend, discharge, demote, or take other disciplinary action against employees; and the right to 26 release employees from duties because of lack of work or for other legitimate reasons. The District 27 shall retain the right to maintain efficiency of the District operations by determining the methods, the 28 means, and the personnel by which operations undertaken by the employees in the unit are to be 29 conducted. 30 31 **Section 2.1.1.** 32 The restructuring of bargaining unit positions shall be done after consultation with the Union 33 membership who wish to attend. Such restructuring may take place at any time during the 34 calendar year due to District needs. 35 36 Section 2.2. 37 The right to make reasonable rules and regulations shall be considered acknowledged functions of the 38 District. In making rules and regulations relating to personnel policies, procedures and practices, and 39 matters of working conditions, the District shall give due regard and consideration to the rights of the 40 Union and the employees and to the obligations imposed by this Agreement. 41 42 Section 2.3. 43 The District has the right to determine the educational program and operational needs of the District 44 and to schedule classes and activities to accommodate the legitimate needs of students. The District 45 agrees that it will not arbitrarily or capriciously use this right to undermine the rights of employees. 46 47 48

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2	Section 2.4. Volunteers and Subcontracting.
3	The District shall not increase its use of subcontractors or volunteers in a manner that supplants
4	bargaining unit employees without first providing the union with notice of this change and the
5	opportunity to bargain the impacts of such a change.
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9	ARTICLE III
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11	RIGHTS OF EMPLOYEES
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13	Section 3.1.
14	It is agreed that all employees subject to this Agreement shall have and shall be protected in the
15	exercise of the right, freely and without fear of penalty or reprisal, to join and legally assist the Union.
16	
17	Section 3.2.
18	Employees subject to this Agreement have the right to have Union representative(s) or other persons of
19	their choice present at meetings between themselves and supervisors or other representatives of the
20	District that bear on disciplinary matters.
21	
22	Section 3.3.
23	Neither the District, nor the Union, shall discriminate against any employee subject to this Agreement
24	on the basis of race, creed, color, sex, religion, age or marital status or because of a disability with
25	respect to a position, the duties of which may be performed efficiently by an individual without danger
26	to the health or safety of the disabled person or others.
27	
28	The District and the Union are committed to providing a work environment free from unlawful
29	harassment. The District will not tolerate actions, words, jokes or comments that create, or threaten to
30	create, a hostile work environment based on an individual's sex, race, ethnicity, age, religion, sexual
31	orientation, or any other legally protected characteristic. Any employee, supervisor, or bargaining unit
32	member engaging in sexual or other unlawful harassment will be subject to appropriate corrective
33	action, up to and including termination of employment.
34	
35	Section 3.4. New Member Orientation.
36	The Union, as part of the general orientation of each new employee within the unit, shall provide each
37	employee with a copy of this agreement and a dual membership dues card.
38	
39	Section 3.4.1. Access to New Members.
40	The District will provide the Union reasonable access to new employees of the bargaining unit
41	for the purposes of presenting information about their exclusive bargaining representative to the
42	new employee. The presentation may occur during a new employee orientation provided by
43	the District, or at another time mutually agreed to by the District and the Union. No employee
44	may be mandated to attend the meetings or presentations by the Union. "Reasonable access"
45	for the purposes of this section means: (a) the access to the new employee occurs within ninety
46	days of the employee's start date within the bargaining unit; (b) The access is for no less than
47	thirty minutes; and (c) The access occurs during the new employee's regular work hours at the

Section 3.4.2. Access to New Members.

The District will provide the Union electronic notification of the name, address, personal phone number, classification, job title, work location, and work and personal email address of all newly hired bargaining unit employees as soon as applicable. The District will notify the Union of all new hires within ten (10) working days of the hire date.

7 Section 3.5.

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8 The District shall maintain an official personnel file for each classified employee. Such files shall be 9 stored in a secure area where access may be monitored, controlled and limited.

Section 3.5.1.

There shall be no separate official personnel files kept by the District. The District 12 Superintendent shall be responsible for the safeguarding of the official personnel files and shall 13 have unrestricted access to the files. This shall not restrict the right of a Superintendent to 14 maintain a working file. Matters in said working file shall be purged after one year, with any 15 official copies of documents placed in the personnel file at that time. Only the Superintendent 16 shall have access to the working file. The working file shall include all electronic data 17 contained in computer disks or internal data storage. It shall be the responsibility of the District 18 to secure the electronic data from unauthorized individuals. Working file data may not be the 19 basis for disciplinary action until it has been entered into the official personnel file. 20

Section 3.5.2.

Classified employees shall have the right to examine and copy materials from and/or have copies made of his/her personnel file during regular business hours under the supervision of the Superintendent or his/her designee.

Section 3.5.3.

Each employee shall have the right to review his/her personnel file by prior arrangement. All materials placed in the personnel file shall be signed and dated by both the employee and the District. Employees shall have the opportunity to attach written responses to any material placed in their personnel file within ten (10) workdays of the receipt of such material.

Section 3.5.4.

The Superintendent and Business Manager shall have unrestricted access to the personnel files. Any other access within the District will be on a need to know basis only. Any person authorized by a valid court order shall have access to the personnel files within the limits set by the court. Nothing contained in this section shall conflict or supersede the requirements of Public Disclosure laws.

Section 3.5.5.

When authorized through formal board action at a public meeting, Board members shall have supervised and restricted access to the classified employee personnel files.

44 <u>Section 3.5.6.</u>

45 Upon written request of the employee to the Superintendent, written warnings and reprimands 46 which are more than three (3) years old shall be removed from the employee's personnel file, 47 unless the material refers to behavior of a serious nature which could include but not be limited



to inappropriate behavior with students and criminal acts and sexual harassment, provided there are no other disciplinary notices in his/her file.

ARTICLE IV

RIGHTS OF THE UNION

10 Section 4.1.

PSE/SEIU 1948 has the right and the responsibility to represent the interests of all employees in the unit; to present their views to the District on matters of concern, either orally or in writing; and to enter collective negotiations with the object of reaching an agreement applicable to all employees within the bargaining unit in accordance with Article XIX, Term and Separability of Provisions.

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16 Section 4.2. Employee Verification Information.

The names, addresses, phone numbers, home emails (if applicable), worksites, hire date and work assignments will be provided to the President of the Union and/or PSE/SEIU 1948 representative upon reasonable request.

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In the months of November and March, audit information of the classified employees is requested by

22 PSE/SEIU 1948 of employees hired, rehired, reinstated, reclassified, placed on a leave of absence,

23 layoff & recalled, and/or separated from the bargaining unit for representation purposes and

recordkeeping.

2526 Section 4.3.

The District shall provide a bulletin board space in the school building for the use of the Union.

Bulletins posted by the Union are the responsibility of the officials of the Union. Each bulletin shall be

signed by the Union or the Employer official responsible for its posting. All notices will be dated and

initialed by the party posting the notice. Unsigned notices will not be posted. Normally, notices will

³¹ be posted for not more than three (3) weeks. The responsibility for the prompt removal shall rest with ³² the party who posted the notice.

33

34 Section 4.4.

A designated representative will be provided time off without pay to a maximum total of one (1) day per year to attend Union State meetings.

38 Section 4.5.

A Union representative may pick up a copy of the School Board agenda at the District office at such time it is made available to the public. The Union representative will also have the opportunity to provide a report during open session of any regular meeting of the Board of Directors.

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43 Section 4.6. Calendar Committee.

- Each year, the Union may designate representatives to a District-convened school calendar committee
- for the purpose of recommending school calendars for the subsequent year. Said recommendation
- shall be submitted to the Board before the end of the 3rd quarter. The Union representatives on the
- advisory committee shall have equal standing with all other bargaining representatives. Following



Board approval, any changes in the calendar shall be made by mutual agreement between the

2 Union and the District.

ARTICLE V

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APPROPRIATE MATTERS FOR CONSULTATION AND NEGOTIATION

9 Section 5.1.

10 It is agreed and understood that matters appropriate for consultation and negotiation between the

District and the Union are hours, wages, grievance procedures and working conditions of employees

12 and the wages, hours, and working conditions of newly created jobs subject to this Agreement.

1314 Section 5.2.

The District agrees to meet in liaison with the Union President to receive input regarding employee concerns.

ARTICLE VI

UNION REPRESENTATION

2324 Section 6.1.

The Union will designate a Conference Committee which will meet with the Superintendent of the District and/or the Superintendent's designated representatives on a mutually agreeable basis to discuss

- District and/or the Superintendent's designated representatives on a mutually agreeable basis to discuss terms and conditions of this Agreement. In the event such meetings are held during working hours, the
- 28 Committee members shall receive their regular rate of pay. They may consult with the District on
- 29 complaints without a grievance being made by an individual employee.

30

31 Section 6.2.

Visitation rights shall be granted to a designated representative of the Union to visit employees in the bargaining unit for purposes of grievance investigation and/or general information, provided that, such

visits do not interrupt the work of the employees visited. The visiting representative shall notify the

35 Superintendent or the District office prior to a visit by a union representative or upon the

36 representative's arrival.

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ARTICLE VII

HOURS OF WORK AND OVERTIME

44 Section 7.1.

The first day of the workweek shall be Sunday. The normal workweek shall consist of one (1) day off (Sunday), followed by five (5) work days, Monday - Friday, followed by one (1) day off (Saturday).

Section 7.2.

- 3 The District shall establish work shifts with designated times of beginning and ending. Shifts of 4
- seven (7) hours or longer will include paid rest periods of fifteen (15) minutes for each one-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ 5
- workday. Shifts less than seven (7) hours in length will receive one (1) paid rest period of fifteen (15) 6
- minutes. Shifts in excess of five (5) hours per day shall include, in addition to the above, a non-paid 7
- uninterrupted meal period of not less than thirty (30) minutes, to be as near the middle of the shift as 8
- possible. Paid rest periods shall be taken as near the middle of each one-half workday as possible. 9
- Paid rest periods and unpaid meal periods shall be taken as noted and not used at the end of a shift for 10
- early release, except as by permission of the Superintendent. 11
- 12

Section 7.3. 13

- Each employee shall be assigned to a definite and regular shift and workweek, which shall not be 14
- changed without prior notice to the employee of one (1) calendar week; provided, however, this notice 15
- may be waived by consent of the employee, or by the employer during an emergency situation. 16
- 17

Section 7.4. 18

- Employees requested to work a shift regularly worked by a higher classification employee shall be 19
- compensated at the rate equal to their seniority placement on the higher schedule for all work 20
- performed in that classification. Employees requested to work a shift regularly filled by a lower 21
- classification employee shall receive a wage equal to their lowest contracted wage. 22
- 23

Section 7.5. Overtime. 24

All hours worked in excess of forty (40) hours per week shall be compensated at the rate of one and 25 one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ times the employee's base pay (weighted average of the different rates worked). All 26 overtime must be authorized in advance, except where the safety of students or district property is in 27 jeopardy. Overtime assignments shall be assigned by seniority unless such overtime pertains to 28 extension of the job, and further, that the senior employee must be qualified to perform the overtime 29 work. In the assignment of overtime, the District will provide the employee with as much advance 30 notice as practicable in the circumstances. All overtime must be authorized in advance by the 31 Superintendent, except for emergency situations threatening District students or property. 32

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Section 7.5.1.

34 Paid holidays shall be considered hours worked. Other paid leaves shall not be counted as 35 hours worked for that week. 36

37 Section 7.5.2. Compensatory Time. 38

Employees, at their option may request to elect compensatory time in lieu of the overtime 39 referenced in Section 7.5. Compensatory time shall be earned at the rate of one and one-half 40 $(1\frac{1}{2})$ hours for each hour worked. Compensatory time may be accumulated to a balance of 41 twenty-four (24) hours, and shall be used by the end of the school year. Any employee denied 42 the opportunity to use comp time shall be paid out accrued compensatory time in their July or 43 August pay warrant if they are unable to use their comp time prior to the completion of the 44 school year. Compensatory time may only be used with the approval of the superintendent. 45 The approval of compensatory time shall generally be equivalent to the standards applied for 46 approval of vacation time. 47



1	Section 7.5.2.1.
2	Written records shall be maintained for all comp time transactions.
3 4	Section 7.5.3. Bus Driver Trip Rate.
5	Extra trips will be paid at the driver's base hourly rate for the driving time of the trip. Drivers
6	will check their buses twice per hour during standby time and at half time of all sporting events
7	and field trips. The standby rate during such time shall be 50% of the bus driver's regular
8	hourly rate or the Washington State minimum wage, whichever is greater. If a student(s)
9	board(s) the bus other than to get items off the bus during the driver's standby time, the driver
10	will be paid their base hourly rate to supervise students on the buses.
11	Section 7.5.4. Driver Trainer Rate.
12	A Regular Driver who is certified and performs the duties as a driver trainer shall receive a 5%
13	increase to regular pay for any authorized time worked training drivers.
14	
15	Section 7.5.5. Driver Trainee Rate.
16 17	All employees accepting a bus driver position and still working on obtaining their CDL shall have a reduce rate of pay of \$20.00 per hour.
17	have a reduce rate of pay of \$20.00 per nour.
19	Section 7.6.
20	Employees called back on a regular workday, or called on the sixth or seventh consecutive workday,
21	shall normally receive no less than two (2) hours pay and work at the appropriate rate. Employees
22	called by a supervisor or the District's alarm company/Vendor prior to one hour before or later than
23	one hour after their scheduled workday or on any non-work day, but who are not called back to the
24	worksite, will be compensated for a minimum of one half $(1/2)$ hour at the appropriate rate, or will be
25 26	allowed to flex their schedule or access comp time.
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29	ARTICLE VIII
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31	HOLIDAYS AND VACATIONS
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33	Section 8.1. Holidays.
34 35	All employees shall receive the following paid holidays, based upon their daily scheduled work hours, that occur within their work year, provided that employee either works or is on authorized paid leave
35 36	on his/her last scheduled day before the holiday and first scheduled day after the holiday.
37	
38	1. New Year's Day7. Veterans' Day
39	2. Martin Luther King Day 8. Thanksgiving Day
40	3. Presidents' Day9. Day after Thanksgiving Day
41	4. Memorial Day 10. December 24 or 26
42	5. Fourth of July 11. Christmas Day
43 44	6. Labor Day
44 45	Section 8.1.1. Worked Holidays.
46	Employees required to work on the above described holidays shall receive twice their base rate
47	for all hours worked on such holidays in addition to holiday pay.



Section 8.1.2. Holidays During Vacation. 2

Should a holiday occur while an employee is on vacation, the employee shall be allowed to take one extra day of vacation with pay in lieu of the holiday as such.

Section 8.1.3.

- All year-round employees with one (1) full year of service or more shall be entitled to 7
- additional half-day holiday leave on the day before Thanksgiving and the last school day 8
- before Christmas. Employees may be required to work their normal shifts on half holidays, but 9
- shall still receive the half-day holiday leave pay. 10 11

Section 8.2. Vacations. 12

All year-round employees shall receive five (5) days paid vacation after one (1) year and through five 13 (5) years of service. Following five (5) years of successive and continuous service the all year-round 14

employee shall receive ten (10) days paid vacation. After fifteen (15) years of successive and 15

- continuous service the all year-round employee shall receive fifteen (15) days of paid vacation. After 16

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- shall receive twenty (20) days of paid vacation. 18
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Section 8.2.1.

Normally, vacation dates shall be arranged to fit into the regular summer vacation period, but other times may be available upon prior approval of the Superintendent.

30 Section 8.3. 31

Up to five (5) days of vacation due but unused by September 1 each year may be carried over for one 32 (1) year following the accrual date with the prior written approval of the superintendent. No vacation 33

- may be carried over for more than one (1) year beyond the date on which it became due. However, no 34
- employee shall forfeit vacation which has been requested in writing and use of which is denied due to 35
- District business demands. Any employee who is discharged or who terminates employment shall 36
- receive payment for eligible unused vacation at the regular pay period with the final check. Vacation 37 pay is based on the wage rate at the time the vacation was earned. 38
- 39
- Vacation for eligible employees is front-loaded on September 1 each year. Employees in their first 40 year of service are not eligible to use front-loaded vacation until the first anniversary of their hire date. 41
- Thereafter, employees may access paid vacation as soon as it is front-loaded and before it is earned. 42
- Any unearned vacation will be deducted from the employee's final paycheck if they separate 43
- employment prior to earning it. 44
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ARTICLE IX

LEAVES

5 Section 9.1. Illness, Injury And Emergency Leave (Sick Leave).

Employees who work year around (full-time), will receive twelve (12) days for illness, injury and emergency leave. Less than full-time (partial or fractional FTE) employees shall be allowed leave on an hourly prorated FTE basis, provided that all employees who work the full school calendar year shall receive a minimum of ten (10) leave days. Unused days shall accumulate to the maximum allowed by law. Sick leave benefits shall be paid in accordance with the employee's normal base hourly rate and accumulated leave will be expended on an hourly basis rather than a daily basis. Sick leave shall be front loaded at the start of the school year depending on the employee's work year. Payment for sick leave expended but not earned shall be recovered by the District from the employee's final paycheck.

¹⁵ Rules regarding leaves chargeable to accumulated sick leave:

- 1. As a general rule, employees shall notify their superintendent not later than two (2) hours, or as soon as possible, before their shift begins on the day on which they will be absent and no later than the close of the workday preceding the date of their intended return to their duties.
- 2. The Superintendent may, in the event of a perceived pattern of regular, excessive, or unusual absences, require a physician's certificate and proof of the disability causing the absence. Such requests will comply with WAC 296-128-660, including the requirement to request medical verification only after three consecutive days of absence, and subject to the employee's right to demonstrate that a request for medical verification will result in an unreasonable burden or expense to the employee.
- 3. Employees wishing to take an extended unpaid leave for disability reasons may request a leave of absence pursuant to Section 9.5. Upon return from leave, the employee shall be placed in the position last held or, if that position does not exist, a similar position. Upon the employee's return from leave, the District may require a certificate of release from the doctor for the employee to return to work.
- 4. An employee shall be eligible to utilize accrued sick leave for the following reasons:
 - A. An absence resulting from an employee's mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition; to accommodate the employee's need for medical diagnosis, care, or treatment of a mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition; or an employee's need for preventive medical care;
 - B. To allow the employee to provide care for a family member with a mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition; care of a family member who needs medical diagnosis, care, or treatment of a mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition; or care for a family member who needs preventive medical care. "Family member" shall be defined as set forth in RCW 49.46.210; and
- C. When the employee's place of business has been closed by order of a public official for any health-related reason, or when an employee's child's school or place of care has been closed for such a reason; provided, that when closure of District schools results in



1		rescheduled work days, this provision does not require payment of school-year
2		employees for days beyond the employee's established work year.
3		D. An employee is authorized to use paid sick leave for absences that qualify for leave
4		under the domestic violence leave act, chapter 49.76 RCW.
5		
6	5. E	Emergency Leave. Up to three (3) days per year of this leave may be used as emergency leave
7		and shall be granted as defined in the following:
8		
9		A. The problem must have been suddenly precipitated or must be of such a nature that
10		preplanning could not relieve the necessity for the absence.
11		B. The problem must be one of major importance and not a mere convenience.
12		C. Serious illness or accident of a family member meeting the definition set forth in RCW
13		49.46.210 is not subject to the three-day limitation for emergency leave usage.
14		D. Applications requesting consideration for an absence under Emergency Leave shall be
15		made via written request addressed to the Superintendent. A completed request for
16		Emergency Leave shall be submitted to the Superintendent within three (3) days after
17		return to work. The Superintendent shall notify the employee of the determination
18		within five (5) days of receipt of the application.
19		E. The application shall disclose the general purpose of the leave request in sufficient
20		terms to establish compliance with the criteria contained in $\#6$, a, b and c above.
21		Requests meeting said criteria shall be granted.
22		F. It is not the intent of this Emergency Leave provision to provide or expand upon or to
23		add to vacations, weekends, or other types of leaves because of transportation problems
24		that preplanning could have prevented.
25 26	6 I	Jpon application, the District shall grant paid leave for the period of pregnancy related
20		lisability as certified by the doctor to the employee from accumulated Sick Leave. Such leave
28		shall commence at such time as the employee and the employee's medical advisor deem
20		necessary. Such employee may also request additional paid or unpaid leave under the Family
30		Medical Leave Act (FMLA). Employees granted such leave may be granted a leave of absence
31		bursuant to Section 9.5., for a period not to exceed one year. Upon returning to work, the
32		employee may be required to provide documentation of being medically able to return to work
33	t	o the same extent as other employees returning to work after other types of medical leave.
34		
35		A. An employee, whose spouse or domestic partner has given birth or who has adopted a
36		child, upon request, may be granted up to two (2) days leave from their accumulated
37		sick leave on or about the date of the birth or adoption of the child. Additional days

Employees shall be eligible to receive Paid Family and Medical Leave (PFML) under the Washington 17 State Family and Medical Leave and Insurance Act. To be eligible for this leave, employees must have 18 worked a minimum of 820 hours within the past calendar year. Such leave shall be used consecutively 19 with the employee's other leave entitlements unless the employee elects otherwise, or unless the law 20 prohibits otherwise. The District shall maintain health insurance benefits during periods of approved 21 PFML. 22

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Section 9.8. Long-Term Services and Support Trust Act. 24

Effective January 1, 2022, the District shall collect from the employee the legally required 25 contributions required for the Long-Term Services and Support (LTSS) Trust and forward this amount 26 to the State of Washington. 27

ARTICLE X

PROBATION, SENIORITY AND LAYOFF PROCEDURES

Section 10.1. 34

The seniority of an employee within the bargaining unit shall be established as of the date on which the 35 employee began continuous daily employment (hereinafter "hire date") unless such seniority shall be 36 lost as hereinafter provided. Any member hired prior to June 1, 2018, shall maintain current seniority. 37

- A. Time lost by reason of industrial accident, industrial illness or judicial leave for up to two (2) years;
- B. Time on leave of absence granted by the Board for voluntary service in the Armed Forces of

 - C. Time spent in layoff status up to eighteen (18) months; or
- D. Time spent on authorized leaves.

23 Seniority rights shall be effective within the bargaining unit.

25 Section 10.7.

Seniority shall be observed when vacancies occur and new positions are to be filled or when positions
are to be restructured. It is understood that most employees in the bargaining unit will be filling
multiple positions as part of their assignment and that these assignments may vary from year to year.
Seniority shall be the determining factor when qualifications, ability, and performance are judged by
the Superintendent to be substantially equal with junior applicants. Outside applicants shall be
considered least senior employees for the purpose of the section.

A notice of intent to rehire and acceptance will be offered to employees in the bargaining unit by May 15 of each year. - It shall be the responsibility of the employee to seek continuously to improve his/her performance.
- 46 The District supports employees in that effort, including the provision of training and other resources
- on an as needed basis determined by the District. The mutual and primary goal is to establish a



quality/satisfied workforce, enabling the District to effectively and efficiently carry out its mission and
 programs.

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In working with District employees, the District Superintendent will formally evaluate employees. A
 bargaining unit employee shall not be evaluated by any other member of the bargaining unit.

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7 One element of continuous quality improvement in performance is the formal evaluation. A minimum

- 8 of one formal performance evaluation shall be completed for each employee during the year. Each
- 9 formal performance evaluation shall be in the form of a written narrative. It remains a part of the
- 10 employee's permanent employment record.
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12 Section 11.2. Quality Performance: Evaluation Criteria.

13 A review of that employee's performance of duties specified in the latest applicable job description on

file with the District, and a discussion of what quality job performance looks like shall precede a formal written performance evaluation. No employee will be evaluated on a job description unless that

The superintendent will describe job-related performance problems, providing examples and specific descriptions of sub-standard performance. In addition to an explanation of the problem, the superintendent will explain in writing:

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- 1. Performance expectations including what or how much is to be done, and the level of performance.
- 2. The skill, knowledge and/or practices the employee must acquire and use.
- 3. Who will monitor improvement.
 - 4. What are the consequences if improvement goals are/are not met.
 - 5. A reasonable timeline established in which to achieve the required change(s).
 - 6. The resources will be provided to help the employee acquire the skills.

36 Section 11.4. Evaluation Conferences.

The formal evaluation will be presented in a conference between the superintendent and the employee. The employee may request union representation at an evaluation conference if it is anticipated that the evaluation may form the basis for a recommendation for termination or discipline. Both the employee and superintendent will sign the evaluation. The employee's signature signifies only that the employee has read and understands the evaluation; it does not necessarily mean agreement with the evaluation.

Invited employees are not obligated to attend and shall not be paid unless it is authorized in writing in advance by the District. To be compensated for a training pre-approval by the Superintendent must be obtained.

All employees performing paraeducator work as defined in state law must meet the professional development requirements of the Paraeducator Board for employment. All required and state-funded certification trainings shall be compensated per 14.1.

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Section 14.2.1. Paraeducator Certification Premiums.

If in the future a position is required by the District to have additional special education, EL or Advanced certifications, the District and the union will reopen upon request of either party to determine what additional compensation, if any, should be provided for such position.

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ARTICLE XV 1 2 **UNION MEMBERSHIP AND CHECKOFF** 3 4 Section 15.1. Membership. 5 The District and PSE/SEIU 1948 understand that at the center of our labor management relationship is 6 the shared interest in providing the best services to the public. Therefore, it is the expectation of both 7 PSE/SEIU 1948 and the District that the District representatives shall remain neutral on the issue of 8 union membership and respect all employees decisions to join and maintain membership in their 9 exclusive professional advocacy organization PSE/SEIU 1948 pursuant to RCW 41.56.140. All 10 bargaining unit employees shall have the option of joining and maintaining membership in PSE/SEIU 11 1948 upon employment with the District in the bargaining unit. 12 13 Section 15.2. Membership Authorizations and Revocations. 14 An employee's written, electronic, or recorded voice authorization to have the employer deduct 15 membership dues from the employee's wages must be made by the employee to PSE/SEIU 1948. 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ARTICLE XVI

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

11 Section 16.1. Grievances.

For the purpose of this Agreement, the term "grievance" means any dispute by an employee within the bargaining unit referred to in Article I against the District, with respect to an alleged violation of an express term or provision of this Agreement. Any grievance shall be handled in accordance with the following procedure.

1617 Section 16.2. Definitions.

- 1. Grievant: A grievant is an employee.
- 2. Days: Days in this procedure are normal District office workdays.

21 Section 16.3. Step One - Oral Discussion.

The grievance will initially be taken by the employee to the superintendent within thirty (30) working days of the occurrence. The employee and superintendent will signature a dated statement that the employee alleged a grievance and that Step One took place.

Section 16.3.1. Step Two - Employee Written Statement of Grievance.

The employee may have a Union representative accompany the employee beginning with Step Two. If the grievance is not resolved as provided in Step One, it shall be reduced to written form containing the following:

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- A. The facts upon which the grievance is based;
- B. Reference to the section or sections of the Agreement alleged to have been violated; and
- C. The remedy sought.
- The written grievance shall be provided to the Superintendent within ten working days of the step one meeting.

37 38 Section 16.3.2. Step Three - Superintendent.

After such submission the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee(s) and the employee will have ten (10) working days from submission of the written statement of the grievance to resolve it by indicating on the statement of grievance the disposition and signing it. If the grievance is not resolved, the employee may proceed to Step Four of the grievance procedure. If an agreeable disposition is made, all parties to the grievance shall sign it.

45 Section 16.3.3. Step Four - Board.

If no settlement has been reached in Step Three within the specified time limits, the grievance
 may be submitted by the employee within fifteen (15) working days to the Board. The Board
 of Directors reserves the right to summon the employee for an oral statement of the grievance.



The employee reserves the right to appear before the Board of Directors to explain the grievance. At any appearance before the Board of Directors, the employee may be accompanied by a Union representative or designee. After such submission the Board and the employee will have thirty (30) working days from submission of the written statement of the grievance to resolve it by indicating on the statement of grievance the disposition and signing it.

Section 16.3.4. Step Five - Arbitration. If no settlement is reached in Step Four, the Union may request that the matter be submitted to an arbiter as hereinafter provided:

- A. Written notice of a request for arbitration shall be made to the Superintendent within ten (10) days after receipt of the disposition letter at Step Four.
- B. Arbitration shall be limited to issue(s) involving the interpretation or application of specific terms of this Agreement.
- C. When a timely request has been made for arbitration, the parties shall attempt to select an impartial arbiter to hear and decide the particular case. If the parties are unable to agree to an arbiter within ten (10) days after submission of the written request for arbitration, the provisions of the paragraph (D) below shall apply to the selection of an arbiter.
- D. In the event an arbiter is not agreed upon as provided in paragraph (C) above, the parties shall jointly request the American Arbitration Association to submit a panel of seven (7) arbiters. Such request shall state the issue of the case and ask that the nominees be qualified to handle the type of case involved. When notification names of the panel of seven (7) arbiters is received, the parties in turn shall have the right to strike a name from the panel until only one (1) name remains. The remaining person shall be the arbiter. The right to strike the first name from the panel shall be determined by lot.
- E. Arbitration proceedings shall be in accordance with the following:
 - 1. The arbiter, once appointed, will inform the parties as to the procedures which will be followed.
 - 2. The arbiter shall hear and accept pertinent evidence submitted by both parties and shall be empowered to request through subpoena if necessary, such data and testimony as the arbiter deems pertinent to the grievance and shall render a decision in writing to both parties within thirty (30) days, unless mutually extended, of the closing of the record.
 - 3. The arbiter shall be authorized to rule and issue a decision in writing on the issue(s) presented for arbitration which decision shall be final and binding on both parties.
 - 4. The arbiter shall rule only on the basis of information presented in the hearing and shall refuse to receive any information after the hearing except by mutual agreement.
 - 5. Each party to the proceedings may call such witnesses as may be necessary in the order in which their testimony is to be heard. Such testimony shall be limited to the matters set forth heard. Such testimony shall be limited to the matters set forth in the written statement of the grievance.
 - 6. Each party shall pay any compensation and expenses relating to its own witnesses or representatives.
 - 7. The arbiter shall specify in the award that the District or Union, whichever is ruled against by the arbiter, shall pay the compensation of the arbiter including necessary expenses.



8. The total cost of the stenographic record, if requested, will be paid by the party 1 requesting it. If the other party also requests a copy, that party will pay one-half (1/2)2 of the stenographic cost. 3 4 F.
